Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

This past week a reflection from Pope Francis struck me. I'd like to share some of it and my reaction to all of it. In part, Pope Francis said: "Today we enter, through Christ's wounds, into the mystery of God, we come to realize that mercy is not simply one of His qualities among others, but the very beating of His Heart. Then, like Thomas, we no longer live as disciples, uncertain, devout but wavering. We too fall in love with the Lord! We must not be afraid of these words, to fall in love with the Lord."

"The Lord does indeed want to touch our wounds with His. This is what the Divine Mercy message proclaims: 'O Blood and Water, which gushed forth from the Heart of Jesus as a fountain of Mercy for us, I trust in You!' Jesus is not embarrassed by this, 'fleshy-ness.' On the contrary, He knows that man needs graphics. The gushing forth of Blood and Water literally and actually from His pierced side on Calvary, and continually since, sacramentally, is the fulfillment of all Old Testament attempts to 'see God face to face.'...Let Christians not forget that the Sacraments are not a mere meal among parish friends. The Sacred Liturgy, Holy Mass, is also an individual encounter at the Wedding Banquet of Diving Mercy, in which Christ the Son of God weds each soul to

Himself very intimately as bone of His Bone, flesh of His Flesh."

How wonderfully that fulfills the thought expressed in the fourth century by Saint Augustine that each time we participate in Holy Communion we are asked to "receive what you are and become what you receive. Be the Flesh and Blood of Jesus given for the life of the world!" It is, indeed, within the sacrament of the Eucharist that each of us has been given the opportunity to unite with Jesus; to become His disciple. Once we are fed through His incorporation into our heart, we can only bring that gift to completion by our willingness to do what He did—go out to those most in need and teach them by our gift of time, talent and treasure that they are worthy of care. Saint Teresa of Calcutta said it best: "Make us worthy Lord, to serve our fellow man throughout the world who live and die in poverty and hunger. Give them this day through our hands, their daily bread and by our understanding love, give peace and joy." It is a prayer I pray each time I receive the gift of the Eucharist. I invite you to consider doing the same.

### **DESDE EL PASTOR**

#### Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

La semana pasada, me llamó la atención una reflexión del Papa Francisco. Me gustaría compartir algo de eso y mi reacción a todo esto. En parte, el Papa Francisco dijo: "Hoy entramos, a través de las heridas de Cristo, en el misterio de Dios, nos damos cuenta de que la misericordia no es simplemente una de sus cualidades entre otras, sino el mismo latido de su corazón. Entonces, como Tomás, ya no vivimos como discípulos, inciertos, devotos pero vacilantes. ¡Nosotros también nos enamoramos del Señor! No debemos temer a estas palabras, enamoramos del Señor ".

"El Señor ciertamente quiere tocar nuestras heridas con las Suyas. Esto es lo que el mensaje de la Divina Misericordia proclama: "¡Oh, Sangre y Agua, que brotaron del Corazón de Jesús como fuente de Misericordia para nosotros, confío en Ti!" Jesús no se avergüenza de esto, "carnalidad". Al contrario, El sabe que el hombre necesita gráficos. El brotar de Sangre y Agua literalmente y en realidad de Su costado traspasado en el Calvario, y continuamente desde, sacramentalmente, es el cumplimiento de todos los intentos del Antiguo Testamento de 'ver a Dios cara a cara' ... No olvidemos que los Sacramentos no son una simple comida entre los amigos de la parroquia. La Sagrada Liturgia, Santa Misa, es también un encuentro individual en el Banquete de Bodas de Diving Mercy, en el que Cristo, el Hijo de Dios, une íntimamente a cada alma consigo mismo como el hueso de Su Hueso, carne de Su Carne ".

Cuán maravillosamente eso cumple el pensamiento expresado en el siglo IV por San Agustín de que cada vez que participamos en la Sagrada Comunión se nos pide "recibir lo que eres y convertirte en lo que recibes". ¡Sé la Carne y Sangre de Jesús dada por la vida del mundo! "Es, de hecho, dentro del sacramento de la Eucaristía que a cada uno de nosotros se nos ha dado la oportunidad de unirnos a Jesús; para ser su discípulo Una vez que somos alimentados a través de su incorporación a nuestro corazón, solo podemos llevar ese don a nuestra voluntad de hacer lo que Él hizo: ir a los más necesitados y enseñarles mediante nuestro don de tiempo, talento y tesoro que son digno de cuidado. Santa Teresa de Calcuta lo dijo mejor: "Haznos dignos Señor, para servir a nuestro prójimo en todo el mundo que vive y muere en la pobreza y el hambre". Dales este día con nuestras manos, su pan de cada día y, mediante nuestro amor comprensivo, da paz y alegría. "Es una oración que oro cada vez que recibo el don de la Eucaristía. Te invito a considerar hacer lo mismo.
