Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

During this week we will celebrate the 4th of July and our independence as a nation. We will remember the signing of the Declaration of Independence that insists that "all men are created equal, that they endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights…"

Quotes such as this, and others given by the Founders, remind us that our nation was formed to give its people the chance to live in the liberty that we believe God destined us to have. We often fail to recognize that the independence declared in 1776 was not secure. The Revolutionary war dragged on for years and it was not guaranteed to be a success.

Finally, in 1783 a peace treaty was signed in Paris that brought an end to the war. The representatives of King George III and the newly formed United States agreed to stop the fighting and recognize our independence. The treaty begins with a remarkable sentence: "In the name of the Most Holy and Undivided Trinity."

Thus, the independence sought to preserve our equality under our Creator was literally secured in His Name. Many of our brothers and sisters in this nation would scoff at this fact as a mere relic of the era, but we can take inspiration from the fact that we recognize God's Providence in all aspects of life. Like our own lives, our

nation is not perfect and is need of frequent reform. But, as with our own lives, it can better exemplify the beauty of its creation when it acts in accord with the Creator.

As Catholics, we begin nearly everything we value with the Sign of the Cross. How appropriate is it that the treaty that secured our nation was begun in the name of the Trinity? During this week, we should pray for our nation and for one another. We should ask God to unite us more closely in His name so that we can not just only live freely, but use that freedom for His glory and our neighbors benefit.

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridas Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

Durante esta semana celebraremos el 4 de julio y nuestra independencia como nación. Recordaremos la firma de la Declaración de Independencia que insiste en que "todos los hombres son creados iguales, que dotados por su Creador de ciertos derechos inalienables ..."

Citas como esta, y otras dadas por los Fundadores, nos recuerdan que nuestra nación se formó para darle a su gente la oportunidad de vivir en la libertad que creemos que Dios nos ha destinado a tener. A menudo no reconocemos que la independencia declarada en 1776 no era segura. La guerra revolucionaria se prolongó durante años y no se garantizó que fuera un éxito.

Finalmente, en 1783 se firmó un tratado de paz en París que puso fin a la guerra. Los representantes del rey Jorge III y los recién formados Estados Unidos acordaron detener la lucha y reconocer nuestra independencia. El tratado comienza con una frase notable: "En el nombre de la Santísima Trinidad e indivisa".

Por lo tanto, la independencia buscada para preservar nuestra igualdad bajo nuestro Creador fue literalmente asegurada en Su Nombre. Muchos de nuestros hermanos y hermanas en esta nación se burlarían de este hecho como una mera reliquia de la época, pero podemos inspirarnos en el hecho de que reconocemos la Providencia de Dios en todos los aspectos de la vida. Al igual que nuestras propias vidas, nuestra nación no es perfecta y es necesaria una reforma frecuente. Pero, al igual que con nuestras propias vidas, puede ejemplificar mejor la belleza de su creación cuando actúa de acuerdo con el Creador.

Como católicos, comenzamos casi todo lo que valoramos con la Señal de la Cruz. ¿Qué tan apropiado es que el tratado que aseguró a nuestra nación se inició en nombre de la Trinidad? Durante esta semana, debemos orar por nuestra nación y por los demás. Deberíamos pedirle a Dios que nos una más estrechamente en Su nombre para que no solo podamos vivir libremente, sino que usemos esa libertad para su gloria y el beneficio de nuestro prójimo.
