Dear Sisters and Brothers in the Lord:

What's with the Holy Water Fonts being empty and dry? It is another part of preparation for Holy Week. We are anticipating what is required for Holy Thursday at the Mass of the Lord's Supper. For that Liturgy all fonts are to be emptied; the Tabernacle is to be empty; and the Holy Oils are to be removed and buried or burned (in the New Easter Fire of the Vigil on Holy Saturday night).

There are some reasons why this is to occur in every Catholic Church throughout the world. The removal of the water helps to remind us of the wandering of our forefathers, the Israelites in the desert. During their journey to Mount Sinai they could find no water and complained about that to Moses and Aaron. They doubted that God could provide for their needs in such a desolate land. Sacred Scripture refers to this at Meribah and Masah—Hebrew words which mean “grumbling and testing.” So, we are reminded of the spiritual dryness that can be created within our hearts because of sin. Therefore, we come seeking the cleansing of Salvation that comes to us through the celebrations of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

The Tabernacle is emptied so that our hearts can also focus on a longing to be fed by the Bread of Life. The liturgical norms for the Mass of the Lord's Supper state that only enough bread should be consecrated to feed those who attend the evening Mass and to prepare

for those who will attend the Solemn Veneration of the Cross on Good Friday. Mass is forbidden on Good Friday in order to emphasize the importance of Our Lord's Sacrifice upon the Cross, the Tree of Life! The scarcity of the Eucharist should also call to mind the need of our forefathers, the Israelites, to rely upon God for their daily provision of bread in the desert. Just as God sustained them so too does He sustain us with the Bread of Angels that is our Food for Life Eternal.

Oil has been used for the initial healing of wounds and for the strengthening of muscle tissue by massage. Traditionally for we Catholics, there are three oils that are blessed by the bishop, one of which is blessed in the united prayer of him and the priests of any given diocese. That blessing occurs at the Chrism Mass, so named for the last oil that becomes blessed by that joint action of bishop and priests. The Oil of the Catechumen is also blest by the bishop at that Mass for the prayerful strengthening of the minds and hearts of those seeking conversion to the Faith. The Oil of the Sick is equally blest by the bishop within that Mass for those who are infirm or suffering from ailments of body, mind or spirit.

So, let us be grateful for the spiritual life we are to receive as we prepare for the Holy Triduum—the Pascal Mystery of Christ Jesus, Our Lord.

DESDE EL PASTOR

Queridos Hermanas y Hermanos en el Señor:

¿Qué pasa con las fuentes de agua bendita vacías y secas? Es otra parte de la preparación para la Semana Santa. Estamos anticipando lo que se requiere para el Jueves Santo en la Misa de la Cena del Señor. Para esa liturgia todas las fuentes deben ser vaciadas; el Tabernáculo debe estar vacío; y los Aceites Sagrados deben ser removidos y enterrados o quemados (en el Nuevo Fuego de Pascua de la Vigilia en la noche del Sábado Santo).

Hay algunas razones por las que esto ocurre en todas las iglesias católicas de todo el mundo. La eliminación del agua nos ayuda a recordar el deambular de nuestros antepasados, los israelitas en el desierto. Durante su viaje al Monte Sinaí no pudieron encontrar agua y se quejaron de eso a Moisés y Aarón. Dudaban que Dios pudiera proveer para sus necesidades en una tierra tan desolada. Las Sagradas Escrituras se refieren a esto en Meribah y Massah — palabras en hebreo que significan “quejas y pruebas”. Por lo tanto, se nos recuerda la sequedad espiritual que puede crearse en nuestros corazones a causa del pecado. Por lo tanto, venimos buscando la limpieza de la Salvación que nos llega a través de las celebraciones de la Pasión, la Muerte y la Resurrección de Cristo.

El Tabernáculo se vacía para que nuestros corazones también puedan centrarse en un anhelo de ser alimentados por el Pan de la Vida. Las normas litúrgicas para la misa de la Cena del Señor establecen que solo el pan debe ser consagrado para alimentar a los que asisten a la misa de la tarde y para preparar a los que asistirán a la solemne veneración de la cruz el Viernes Santo. ¡La misa está prohibida el Viernes Santo para enfatizar la importancia del sacrificio de Nuestro Señor sobre la Cruz, el Árbol de la Vida! La escasez de la Eucaristía también debe recordar la necesidad de nuestros antepasados, los israelitas, de confiar en Dios para su provisión diaria de pan en el desierto. Así como Dios los sostuvo, también él nos sostiene con el Pan de los Ángeles, que es nuestro Alimento para la Vida Eterna.

El aceite se ha utilizado para la curación inicial de heridas y para el fortalecimiento del tejido muscular mediante el masaje. Tradicionalmente para nosotros los católicos, hay tres aceites que son bendecidos por el obispo, uno de los cuales es bendecido en la oración unida de él y los sacerdotes de cualquier diócesis. Esa bendición se produce en la misa del crisma, por lo que los nombres del último aceite que se bendice con la acción conjunta de obispos y sacerdotes. El aceite del catecúmeno también es bendecido por el obispo en esa misa por el fortalecimiento en oración de las mentes y los corazones de aquellos que buscan la conversión a la fe. El aceite del enfermo es igualmente bendecido por el obispo dentro de esa misa para aquellos que están enfermos o padecen enfermedades del cuerpo, la mente o el espíritu.

Entonces, estemos agradecidos por la vida espiritual que debemos recibir mientras nos preparamos para el Santo Triduo, el Misterio Pascal de Cristo Jesús, Nuestro Señor.

Que Dios te bendiga, Monseñor.

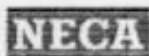
