All of the weekday Masses, with the exception of the 8:30 am Thursday All-School Mass at St. Mary's in Anderson, afford the opportunity for easy social distancing. ADORATION: We have resumed monthly Eucharistic Exposition in Anderson and will soon do the same in Alexandria. In Anderson, Eucharistic Exposition takes place on the first Sunday of the month at St. Ambrose, from the end of the 9:30 Mass until 4:00 pm. In St. Mary's in Alexandria, Eucharistic Exposition will begin at the conclusion of the 8:30 Mass and conclude at 12:30 pm on the third Sunday of the month, beginning February 21.

Rather than Benediction, Exposition in both locations will conclude with simple Reposition, conducted by a lay Communion Minister.

SOUP KITCHEN MENU “*For I was hungry and you gave me food.*” (Mt 25:35) The Catholic Community of Anderson will be serving Cream of Potato Beef Soup, cheese and crackers, and fruit at **Alternative Shelter for Women and Children**, and the **Christian Center Shelter** on **Wednesday, January 27th**. To support the volunteers who prepare the soup everyone is encouraged to bring any of the following food items to church and place them in the baskets at the doors during the weekend Masses on January 23 & 24. 15 oz. cans of diced potatoes; A package of butter, Onions, a package of American cheese, Box of saltine crackers, 29 oz. or gallon size can of fruit.

THANKS TO ALL FROM THE SOCIETY OF ST. VINCENT DE PAUL

The year of 2020 is etched in our memories forever. We have seen unprecedented changes in our life routines. Sadly, we have experienced death and suffering of loved ones, quarantining of self and family members, forced orders to stay in place, and isolation. The *ways* to stay safe and healthy have altered our freedom to move about and have caused cancellations and drastic modifications to all of our gatherings. *If we choose, we could let this really get us down.*

Thankfully, the members of the Anderson-Alexandria (A-A) Pastorate have looked up instead of down. They have chosen to direct their energies and resources to help others. Even though their own resources may have been greatly strained, they found a way to assist others in more need than they. We are grateful beyond words that St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP) was the beneficiary of many kindnesses, financially, and with gifts of food, furniture, and household goods.

Please know that SVdP was closed down totally in April, May and June due to the pandemic. We had limited service to clients in July and August. For now, all home visits have been suspended and clients come only to the Warehouse for assistance with appropriate safety measures in place. Each must make an appointment to receive help with rent, utilities, anything for the home and emergency food.

Even still, with the slowdown of service due to Covid-19, SVdP has given over \$55,000 in financial assistance (rent and utilities) through December 2020. In the month of October alone, SVdP gave \$7,600 to needy families for rent and utilities with an average monthly amount of \$6,923 from July to December 2020. The approximate amount given in furniture, household goods, non-food items and emergency food for the year was over \$42,000. Further, we provided 34 families (including 88 children) with Christmas toys, food and gifts. Our ability to continue serving the needs of the poor in Anderson, Indiana was directly accountable to the continuing support of our A-A Pastorate and community members. We extend heartfelt GRATITUDE to all those who have supported our Friends of the Poor® events. You may have dined with us, been a financial sponsor, bought flowers, bought Raffle Tickets, put money in the Orange Box at church, given online, or donated furniture, food or household goods. ALL OF THESE ACT OF KINDNESS benefitted our clients. At a time when many are in despair, we have relied on the Holy Spirit and the intercession of St. Vincent de Paul. Because of our faith in a God who loves us immeasurably, the hearts of our Pastorate and Community have been stirred to action. We have been blessed by your sustaining generosity.

FORMED

Our parishes have a FORMED subscription. To set up your free account visit formed.org/signup and select a parish. For January you can watch John Paul II: “I Kept Looking For You.” This incredible documentary traces Pope St. John Paul II’s impact on the Church and the world. This film is a wonderful tribute to a man who inspired millions of people to deeper faith in Jesus Christ. Formed Now! “Misery Meets Mercy: Saint Faustina Kowalska,” St. Faustina is known as the “secretary of Divine Mercy” because of the revelations of the Lord to her about His incredible mercy. Join Dr. Ben Akers and Fr. Mateusz as they discuss her proclamation of the message of Divine Mercy. You can listen to “7 Secrets of Confession” By Vinny Flynn. The Sacrament of Confession is the place where we get to encounter the Lord’s mercy in a tangible way. In this talk, best selling author and Catholic speaker Vinny Flynn explores the incredible gift of mercy we encounter in Confession.



Literally 'divine reading' **lectio divina** is a method of prayerful reflection of Holy Scripture. It is intended to promote communion with God and to increase the knowledge of God's word.

The practice of lectio can be done individually or within a group. To pray Lectio Divina, you will need a copy the Bible. A pen and a notebook may also be helpful so you can write down your thoughts, reflections and prayers. Find a place that is free from distractions and allow yourself 30 minutes.

Begin by quieting yourself and becoming aware of your breathing. Let go of the concerns of the day and invite the Holy Spirit to guide your reflection. You will read the Scripture 4 times.

1st Reading of the Word of God: (Lectio- To read)

In this first step, read the selected Scripture passage aloud slowly and intentionally. Use your imagination to place yourself into the story. Pretend that you are in the story. What do you see and feel? What are you experiencing? Take some time to pause and reflect on the experience. You may want to write down your reflections. If in a group, share a word or short phrase that speaks to you with everyone.

2nd Reading of the Word of God: (Meditatio- Meditation)

Read the passage aloud slowly again and open yourself to the Holy Spirit as you ponder the text. Pay attention to the word or phrase that strikes you. You may want to underline or circle it. How is God speaking to you in this word or phrase? Take some time again to reflect and write down your thoughts. Pray with the words/phrase and then briefly share your reflection with the group.

3rd Reading of the Word of God: (Oratio- Prayer)

Read the passage aloud slowly once again and let the words be your prayer, allow the words to be a response to God for the particular situations in your life. Pause again. You can write your own prayer to the Father. What is God calling you to do? Toward what action, direction, or prayer is the Word of God leading you. Share this with the group.

4th Reading of the Word of God: (Contemplatio- Contemplation)

Read the prayer aloud slowly one final time. Listen to the words and rest in the love of God. Contemplative prayer leads us into silence so that we can listen to what God is saying. You may want to end the prayer experience of Lectio Divina with your own prayer of praise and thanksgiving followed by an Our Father, Hail Mary and a Glory Be.

Contemplating God's word through Lectio Divina lets the Holy Spirit inspire and guide us each day. The life of Jesus can speak to the situations in our own lives, both joyous and challenging. Taking time to read and reflect on the daily readings, especially the upcoming Sunday Gospel is a way to encounter Jesus anew, grow daily as his disciples and witness to his love and mercy.

La oración llamada "**lectio divina**", que se traduce literalmente por "Lectura Divina", es una forma de orar reflexivamente con la Sagrada Escritura. Tiene como objetivo promover la comunión con Dios y aumentar el conocimiento de la Palabra de Dios.

La práctica de la lectio se puede realizar de forma individual o en grupo. Para rezar la Lectio Divina, necesitará una copia de la Biblia. Un bolígrafo y un cuaderno también pueden ser útiles para que pueda escribir sus pensamientos, reflexiones y oraciones. Encuentre un lugar libre de distracciones y tómese 30 minutos.

Empiece por tranquilizarse y tomar conciencia de su respiración. Deje ir las preocupaciones del día e invite al Espíritu Santo a guiar su reflexión. Leerá las Escrituras 4 veces. Los pasos de la Lectio Divina son los siguientes:

1º - Lectura de la Palabra de Dios: (Lectio- Leer)

En este primer paso, lea el pasaje bíblico seleccionado en voz alta, y muy lentamente. Con su imaginación, sitúese en la historia imaginándose que es parte de ella. ¿Qué ve y siente? ¿Qué está experimentando? Tómese un tiempo para hacer una pausa y reflexionar sobre la experiencia. Es posible que desee escribir sus reflexiones. Si está en un grupo, comparta una palabra o frase corta del texto que le haya llamado la atención.

2º - Lectura de la Palabra de Dios: (Meditatio - Meditación)

Lea de nuevo en voz alta y lentamente, el pasaje bíblico, y ábrase al Espíritu Santo mientras reflexiona sobre el texto. Preste atención a la palabra o frase que le llame la atención. Es posible que desee subrayarlo o encerrarlo en un círculo. ¿Qué le está diciendo Dios con esta palabra o frase? Tómese un tiempo nuevamente para reflexionar y escribir sus pensamientos. Ore con las palabras / frases y luego comparta brevemente su reflexión con el grupo.

3º - Lectura de la Palabra de Dios: (Oratio - Oración)

Una vez más, lea el pasaje en voz alta lentamente y pregúntese lo que esas palabras le dicen a las situaciones particulares de su vida. Pause de nuevo. Puede escribir su propia oración al Padre. ¿Qué le está llamando Dios a hacer? Hacia qué acción, dirección u oración le está conduciendo la Palabra de Dios. Comparta esto con el grupo.

4º - Lectura de la Palabra de Dios: (Contemplatio - Contemplación)

Lea la oración en voz alta y lentamente una última vez. Escuche las palabras y descanse en el amor de Dios. La oración contemplativa nos lleva al silencio para que podamos escuchar lo que Dios dice. Es posible que desee terminar la experiencia de oración de la Lectio Divina con su propia oración de alabanza y acción de gracias seguida de un Padre Nuestro, Ave María y un Gloria.

Contemplar la palabra de Dios a través de la Lectio Divina permite que el Espíritu Santo nos inspire y guíe cada día. La vida de Jesús puede hablar de las situaciones en nuestras propias vidas, tanto alegres como desafiantes. Tomarse el tiempo para leer y reflexionar sobre las lecturas diarias, especialmente el próximo Evangelio dominical, es una manera de encontrar a Jesús de nuevo, de crecer diariamente como sus discípulos y de dar testimonio de su amor y misericordia.

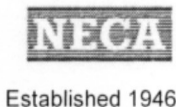
