Off the Top of My Head...

On July 21st, the front page headline of the Anderson Herald Bulletin read: “Rebel flags raise concerns,” accompanied by a large photo of Confederate flags being sold at the Madison County 4-H Fair.

Fortunately, the reported reactions of fairgoers to the sale of these flags was negative. (And the Herald Bulletin reported the next day that the flags were removed.) The vendor tried to give context for the sale of the flags. But the Confederate flag cannot be contextualized or defended because, objectively speaking, it is a symbol of white supremacy.

White supremacy does not require a person to be a member of the Ku Klux Klan or even to use racist language. White supremacy is at work whenever there is a personal, communal, or cultural effort to claim (and reinforce) any superiority on the part of “white” persons over non-“white” persons. (I use quotation marks because we “white” people are actually more... beige!)

In some cases, this effort is radical, organized, and violent. In other cases, it appears passive, unintended, or even innocent. So, when people fly the Confederate flag but claim that “it’s not about race,” their denial involves a complete disregard for history, and is not innocent.

This is not simply an opinion. In 1861, the Vice President of the Confederacy, Alexander Stephens, said in a speech that the Confederate government’s cornerstone “...rests, upon the great truth that the negro is not equal to the white man; that slavery subordination...is his natural and normal condition.” Documents issued by the Confederate states made similar declarations, like that issued by Mississippi: “Our position is thoroughly identified with the institution of slavery – the greatest material interest of the world.” Racism was the official policy of the Confederacy. So to display, sell, or justify a flag of the Confederacy is to embrace a symbol of the superiority of the “white race.”

I raise this issue, not to tell people something they already know, or to make “white” people feel guilty, but simply to make three points. Racism is still a sin. Racism is woven into our culture and too often excused or explained away. And racism needs to be recognized, named, and rooted out.

Our faith demands it.

Pensamiento del Padre Tom...

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El 21 de julio, el titular de la portada del periódico Anderson Herald Bulletin decía: “Las banderas rebeldes plantean preocupaciones”, acompañado de una foto grande de las banderas confederadas que se venden en la Feria 4-H del condado de Madison

Afortunadamente, las reacciones de los asistentes a la feria a la comercialización de estas banderas fueron negativas. (Y el Herald Bulletin informó al día siguiente que las banderas fueron retiradas). El vendedor trató de dar contexto a la venta de las banderas. Pero la bandera confederada no se puede contextualizar ni defender porque, en su esencia, es un símbolo de la supremacía blanca.

Para ser un supremacista blanco, no es necesario ser miembro del Ku Klux Klan o incluso usar un lenguaje racista. La supremacía blanca está en funcionamiento siempre que hay un esfuerzo personal o corporativo para reclamar (y reforzar) algún tipo de superioridad por parte de las personas "blancas" sobre las personas no "blancas". (¡Utilizo comillas porque nosotros, los "blancos", en realidad somos más beige!)

En algunos casos, este esfuerzo es radical, organizado y violento. En otros casos, parece pasivo, involuntario o incluso inocente. Entonces, cuando las personas enarbolan la bandera confederada, pero afirman que "no se trata de raza", están ignorando completamente el hecho de la historia.

¿Es un gran símbolo de alguna "forma de vida"? Esa forma de vida se basaba en el racismo. ¿Honra a aquellos que lucharon valientemente por la Confederación? Luchaban por una causa racista. La bandera de la Confederación representa a los Estados Confederados de América, que nació para sostener y propagar la esclavitud de las personas de ascendencia africana por parte de las personas de ascendencia europea.

Esto no es simplemente una opinión. En 1861, el vicepresidente de la Confederación, Alexander Stephens, dijo en un discurso que la piedra angular del gobierno confederado: "... descansa, sobre la gran verdad de que el negro no es igual al hombre blanco; que la subordinación a la esclavitud ... es su condición natural y normal ". Entonces, exhibir, vender o justificar la bandera confederada, sin importar lo que la gente se diga a sí misma, es abrazar un símbolo de la superioridad de la "raza blanca".

Planteo este problema, no para decirle a la gente algo que ya saben, ni para hacer que la gente "blanca" se sienta culpable, sino simplemente para señalar que el racismo sigue siendo un pecado, que el racismo todavía está entre nosotros y el racismo está entretejido en nuestra cultura y necesita ser reconocido, nombrado y erradicado. Nuestra fe lo exige.

Prayer Guardians Needed: Pilgrim Queen of the Family

Since 2006, St. Mary (Alexandria) has had several teams of prayer Guardians who recite the rosary and litany to Our Blessed Mother for the Church and Pope's intentions, vocations, families, friends, and all intentions by all individuals. Through the Pilgrim Queen of the Family, Our Blessed Mother visits our individual homes, wanting to give us many graces and blessings. How does this work? Teams receive a rosary shrine of the image of Our Lady of Guadalupe along with a book of prayers to use. Each team of Guardians consists of 10 families or individuals who take turns praying a rosary at home with the shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe for three assigned days each month (for example, the 16th, 17th, and 18th day of the month). After completing their three days of prayer, the Guardian passes the shrine to the next Guardian in their team. We currently have 3 openings for families or individuals to join one of the teams. 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An Update on St. Mary's Anderson Church Renovation Project Phase 1

St. Mary's (Anderson) parishioners will remember that, beginning in 2017, our parish began raising funds for a variety of repairs to the exterior of the church building, including repair/replacement of flashing, roofing, masonry, gutters, etc. The work began in 2018 and was completed in 2019. It came in under budget and the cost was \$284,763. That work was considered Phase 1 of an overall project approved by the Parish Pastoral Council and the Parish Finance Council.

A future Phase 2 will encompass repairs to the ornamental metal work, masonry, windows, and other elements of the steeple/bell tower.

Many thanks to all who contributed financially to our Church Renovation Project Phase 1, and to those who prayed for its success. You helped to make this important and essential work possible!

On the road and coming to a pastorate near you (An excerpt from an article published in the July 26 edition of *The Catholic Moment*)

Over the past three months, *The Catholic Moment* has featured a series of articles describing the parts and players that make up Uniting in Heart (UiH). Continuing this theme, I'd like to provide some insight into the UiH Pastorate Guide and the Roadshow series.

Many in the diocese are likely familiar with the three pillars of mission, community and witness, and perhaps more than a few may be aware of their respective goals such as missionary discipleship, school vitality and vibrancy or faith in action. The pillars and goals provide general guidance for what the diocese is trying to achieve over the next ten years. As the diocese began rolling out UiH, we learned from many of our leaders that significant guidance is still necessary to facilitate pastorate planning efforts. That is where the Pastorate Guide and the Roadshows come into play. For example, when looking to improve missionary discipleship, the Pastorate Guide lays out many objectives and related resources, such as *Preach to Generate an Encounter with Christ* and *Anchor Teens Through Evangelical Formation* or *Evangelize to Restore Alienated Young Adults*. As a map, the pillars and goals are like main highways and the objectives are more like the back roads to get the diocese to its intended destination.

In total, there are 46 of these objectives covering the entire UiH 2030 Pastoral Plan. Yet even with this additional guidance, the diocese believes it is important to be present to the pastorates and their teams. Written objectives, short explanations and resources are a good start, but we also need to accompany and equip the pastorates to live out these objectives. There needs to be a partnership. That's the purpose of the roadshows.

En los últimos tres meses, *The Catholic Moment* ha publicado una serie de artículos que describen las partes y los elementos que componen el Plan Pastoral Unidos en el Corazón Uniting in Heart (UiH). Continuando con este tema, me gustaría informarles ahora sobre la Guía Pastoral de UiH y la serie

de Presentaciones en los pastorados (Roadshows.)

Es probable que muchos en la diócesis estén familiarizados con los tres pilares del plan pastoral: misión, comunidad y testimonio, y quizás más de unos pocos estén conscientes de sus respectivos objetivos, como el discipulado misionero, escuelas con vitalidad y éxito, y la fe en acción. Los pilares y las metas brindan una guía general de lo que la diócesis está tratando de lograr durante los próximos diez años. Cuando la diócesis comenzó a implementar UiH, aprendimos de muchos de nuestros líderes que todavía se necesita una guía significativa para facilitar los esfuerzos de planificación pastoral. Ahí es donde entran en juego la Guía Pastoral y los Roadshows. Por ejemplo, cuando se busca mejorar el discipulado misionero, la Guía Pastoral establece muchos objetivos y recursos relacionados, como *Predicar para Generar un Encuentro con Cristo*, y *Anclar a los Adolescentes a Través de*

la Formación Evangélica, o *Evangelizar para Recuperar a los Jóvenes Adultos Distanciados*. Como en un mapa, los pilares y las metas son como carreteras principales y los objetivos son más como las carreteras secundarias para llevar a la diócesis a su destino previsto.

En total, hay 46 de estos objetivos que cubren todo el Plan Pastoral UiH 2030. Sin embargo, incluso con esta guía adicional, la diócesis cree que es importante estar presente ante los pastorados y sus equipos. Los objetivos escritos, las explicaciones breves y los recursos son un buen comienzo, pero también debemos acompañar y equipar a los pastorados para vivir estos objetivos. Tiene que haber una colaboración. Ese es el propósito de los Roadshows.
