

A REFLECTION BY FR. HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ.

We are now in our second year as a **family of parishes**, in the process of becoming a single parish through the **Partners in the Gospel** program. There is a wide range of people's understanding of what this means, so it seems like a good opportunity to remind you what we are about in this process.

While our four parishes remain separate at this point, we are looking at every positive opportunity available to share staff, programs, and other resources like facilities. I liken this to an engaged couple who have begun to join aspects of their lives to each other, while



not yet being married. Our long-term planning keeps the goal of becoming one parish always in mind. One of the present implications for this is the growing number of our people who feel comfortable attending Mass in other parishes than their home parish. Our evolving Mass schedule is designed to offer our family as a whole the broadest range of opportunities to gather for worship. We continue to build our liturgy schedule around the reality of two full-time priests assigned to serve our four parishes.

Your voice is an important one in this process. The recently formed **Parish Family Advisory Council (PFAC)** will begin meeting regularly this fall to address three important questions related to our emerging mission as a single parish: **1) Who are we? 2) Who do we want to become? 3) How do we get there?** Discussion and discernment around these questions will take place over the next 2-3 years and include several opportunities for community input and feedback. The eventual conclusion of this will be a formal plan to become one parish that we will submit to the archbishop for his approval.

One source of anxiety for some is the question, "Will my parish be closed?" All four parishes will eventually cease to be stand-alone communities, so you might say every parish will close to become part of a single parish. The main goal to remember in all this is that with God's help, we are striving to renew the mission and vibrancy of the Catholic community in NE Seattle. Please bring your questions, concerns, and suggestions to me or any of our staff members. As always, let's stay united in faith, hope, and love.

Some people refer to Catholic Social Teaching as the "best kept secret" of the Catholic Church. Hidden within that "secret" is another unknown reality: the social doctrine of the Church has its foundation in labor and the dignity of working people. In 1891, Pope Leo XIII released Rerum Novarum ("On the Condition of Labor"), the first social encyclical of the Catholic Church. Since then, popes including St. John Paul II and Benedict XVI have continued this emphasis on the dignity of work and the rights of workers to organize for safe and dignified working conditions. As we approach Labor Day in early September, come learn about this principle of Catholic Social Teaching, exploring its historical and theological foundations, as well as the landscape and practice of Church-Labor partnerships today.


