

A Gospel Reflection: Third Sunday in Advent

Luke 3:10-18

In this Gospel, the crowds ask John the Baptist a simple yet profound question: "What should we do?" John's response calls for concrete actions of generosity, honesty, and justice. Share with those in need. Be fair in your dealings. Avoid harm and be content with what you have. His message is a challenge to live lives of integrity and compassion as a response to God's presence.

John also points beyond himself to Christ, the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit and fire. His words remind us that preparing for the Lord involves transformation—not just of our actions but of our hearts.

This Advent, let us ask, "What should we do?" and listen for God's call in our lives. May we respond with open hearts, living out our faith in tangible ways as we prepare for the coming of Jesus.
