

A REFLECTION BY FR. HERIC

Dear Friends in Christ.

"What return shall I make to the Lord for all that he has done for me?" I chose this verse from Psalm 116 to put on the holy card commemorating my ordination to the priesthood some 44 years, and pounds ago! You will not recognize the picture below of the young man on the card, I frankly don't either! What I try to remember is the challenge of Psalm 116 to see everything in my life as a gift from God, that belongs to God. My vocation is to give it all back as a steward of God's grace.

That's our common vocation as Christians. We have begun our annual fall **stewardship appeal**, once again inviting our parish households to make a commitment by pledging a gift of our time, talent, and treasure to the Lord in the coming calendar year 2026. The difference between stewardship and other gifts is that it is first and foremost an act of **gratitude** for God's blessings, and **trust** in God's continued providence in our lives. I am heading to Rome with my brother Todd to meet up with our brother Fr. Paul. From there we will take a cruise on the Mediterranean with stops in Italy, Greece, and finally Barcelona, Spain. We then train up to Lourdes and end in Paris France for our **return home Nov. 6**. While I am away, Fr. Duc and Torrie Smith will be in charge of overseeing our parishes, with the able help and support of our staff and volunteers. I am looking forward to the break and will follow the Mariners from afar. A reminder, that should they make it to the "World Series" and you have an extra ticket for me, I will fly home immediately to join you! **GO M'S!**


October is Respect Life Month

Power of Prayer - by Margaret Nichols

In today's reading of Exodus 17: 8–13 the victory of Moses over the Amalekites is directly linked to the power of prayer as well as the importance of community support. Regular,

persistent prayer keeps us on track with God. We can't do this Catholic journey alone. We need each other. So let's talk about contemplative prayer for a moment. What is it?

Contemplative prayer is a way of cultivating a deeper relationship with Jesus through quieting the mind. It can be done alone or in a group format. We have a group centering prayer group at OLL that meets at 7pm on Monday evenings. It's a simple easy way to get a general introduction to the power of contemplative prayer.

When we gather in centering prayer, we open our minds and hearts – our whole being – to God. Through grace, we open our awareness to God whom we know by faith is within us, closer than breathing, We do the same thing each week when we attend Mass in community but this is more personal and designed to be reflective. We come away with new personal awareness, perhaps an insight to do things a bit differently.

In summary, centering prayer allows us to rest in God's presence and take a break from every day concerns allowing our minds and hearts to go deep within. In today's chaotic world, we all need this to stay on our Catholic journey.

Today's readings all focus on the importance of deepening our prayer life. I invite you to look closely into the power of contemplative prayer. As Psalm 46:10 tells us: "Be still and know that I am God."


Spiritual Rosary


