Dear Parishioners:

This Sunday we celebrate the Fourth Sunday of Lent, traditionally known as "Laetare **Sunday"** from the first words of the Latin Introit for the Mass of the day, which means 'Rejoice' (Is. 66:10-11); Laetare Sunday is a signal to us that Easter joy is near. Thus, this Sunday we wear rose-colored vestments, instead of purple, and lighten our sacrifices for the day in anticipation of Easter Day.

As we are nearing Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter Sunday it is important that you now start thinking about your participation in Holy Week liturgies and your Easter Sunday Celebration. Please see the parish website for times of Masses and liturgies. I also want to stress the importance of Holy Thursday night's Mass and the Commemoration of Our Lord's Passion on Good Friday. I encourage you to take Good Friday off from work, close your stores and shops, and be present to Our Lord that day in the sacred liturgies of the Church. The seriousness in which you take your faith is not only an example of Christian witness, it is a sermon in itself to others.

Lastly, a few things... The Rosary is prayed after the 9:00AM Mass on weekdays. It doesn't take long, so think about staying and joining in. Again, please do your part in the Annual Catholic Appeal for the parish and the diocese. A little generosity can go a long way. Also, we are in need of altar servers and ushers for all the Masses.
