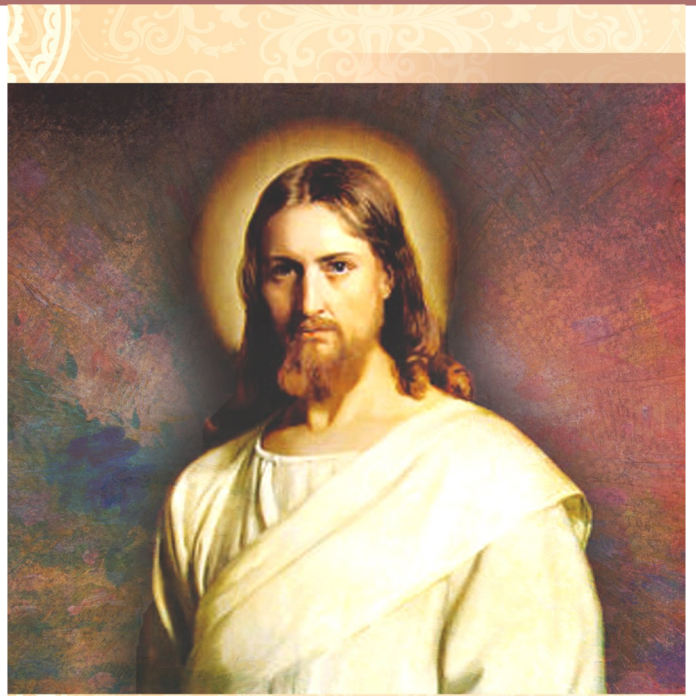

DID YOU KNOW....

that in the Catholic Church, a Mass stipend is a voluntary monetary donation made by a person to a Priest for the celebration of a Mass with a specific intention?

While often referred to as a "fee," it is really a gift or offering rather than a payment, as it is not possible to "pay for a Mass" – because the Mass has infinite value beyond human calculation. In former times, the stipends offered for the celebration of Sacraments (Baptisms, Weddings, Masses) constituted a Priest's income. This led to some abuses – multiplication of Masses to increase income, etc. and at the Council of Trent (1545-1563), it was legislated that a Priest could only receive a stipend for one Mass each day – except on Christmas, when 3 stipended Masses could be offered!

Some Missionary Societies and Shrines very much depend upon Mass stipends donated by the Faithful, especially in poor countries.

The customary amount for Mass stipends is usually determined by the Diocese – and varies widely across the Country and the world. For many years in the Diocese of Tucson the stipend/offering for a Mass was \$5.00. A few months ago the Diocese raised the stipend for a Mass to \$10, and we will be following that guideline going forward. (NO – you don't have to come in and pay an additional \$5 for a Mass for which you have already made an offering!)

Our Priests typically celebrate more than one Mass a day – especially on the weekends. No matter how many Masses are celebrated (for pastoral necessity), the Priest can only receive the stipend for one Mass per day and there can only be one stipend offered for a given Mass. This is not the same as the Intentions for a Mass. Again, because the Mass is infinite there can be multiple intentions in a Mass – as when the Faithful are invited to pray for their own "special intentions", or someone asks the Priest to remember a certain person or intention in the Mass he is going to celebrate. ("My sister is going to have surgery today, can you remember her in this Mass?") The Priest can add those intentions, but not an additional offering.

When we see in the bulletin – or hear during the Mass multiple intentions announced this is simply a courtesy extended for the Faithful. Because many people who ask for a Mass to be celebrated for a particular person or need are told, "the Mass already has been stipended" but want to make an offering of some kind, a gift can be received but those additional gifts go into a Fund which is used to pay a stipend to visiting Priests, for gas, travel, etc.

The Mass – or any Sacrament – is not 'for sale' and offerings connected with those Sacraments are strictly gifts – not fees.

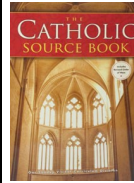

CATHOLIC QUIZ : This week's Question:

"What does 'Pentecost' mean? From where does it originate?"



The answer to last week's Question: "When is the Feast of the Ascension?"

Before it was a separate Feast, the mystery of the Ascension was celebrated on Easter day itself. The accounts of the Ascension in the *Gospels of Luke* (24:50-53) and *John* (20:21f) narrate the events of Christ's Resurrection,

Ascension and Glorification as one mystery-event.

The Scriptures connect the giving of the Holy Spirit with Christ's ascent into heaven, a unified mystery and event.

And so, in some places, up until the middle of the 4th century, the mystery of the Ascension was commemorated only on Pentecost!

As a distinct feast of its own, the Ascension began to be widely celebrated by the end of the 4th century – as a historical event on the 40th day of Easter, according to the chronology given in the *Acts of the Apostles* (1:3). Thus, the new Feast of the Ascension became an integral part of the Easter Season. In time, a Vigil was added to the Feast, and even an Octave, so that the Easter Season was split into two Seasons: Easter to Ascension and Ascension to Pentecost. In the Middle Ages, under the influence of monasticism, the period between Ascension and Pentecost took on a penitential aspect, with the result that the joy and exultation in the Resurrection was somewhat diminished.

The *Roman Calendar* of 1969 restored the ancient unity of the Easter Season – the 50 days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated as one feast day, sometimes called 'the Great Sunday', within which the commemoration of the Lord's Ascension and Glorification holds a special place.

The Church in a number of countries where the Feast of the Ascension is not a public holiday petitioned to have the option to transfer the Solemnity to the Seventh Sunday of Easter, to enhance participation of the Faithful in the celebration.

A number of Provinces (Archdioceses) elected to do so, including (in 1998), the Province of Santa Fe, of which our own Diocese of Tucson is a part – hence the Feast of the Ascension is celebrated on this Sunday!

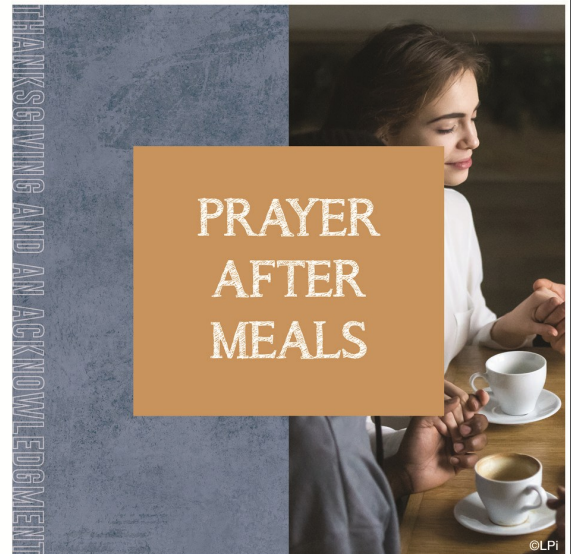

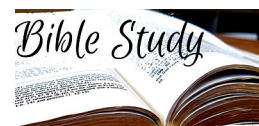

Monthly Council Meeting
May 20th, 2025, 5:30 p.m.**

In Attendance: Linda Klein, Fr. Greg, Maryann Hockstad, Ann Dickson, Lorna Cook, Tom Felix, Charlie Irwin, Damian Rueda, Yvonne Ramey, Pauline Fredericks, Larry Powers, Thad Larson and Kate Callender (recording)

Excused: Dcn Lauro and Lupita Teran, Chuck Muscato, Fran Cassidy, Michelle Mitchell, Linda Denno
Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr Greg led the group in an opening prayer. There were no changes or corrections to the April minutes.

Finance (Kate): Income for April was \$98,439. Donations from Good Shepherd Mission totaled \$1,460. Expenses were \$77,276. The average weekly offering for April was \$21,387. The Parish general fund level is \$592,906 and the Building Our Church balance is \$87,874.

Faith-Based Nursing (Lorna): Lorna thanked the Parish for the blessing imparted on the nursing staff and caregivers at 10 a.m. Mass last weekend. The nurses have a supply of Narcan for use in case of emergency loss of consciousness; however, the recommendation continues to be to call 911 for assistance.

Ladies of St Andrew (Maryann for Fran): Baby Shower for Baby Jesus was a big success. Donations are being accepted for the Bazaar.

Pipe Organ (Maryann reporting for Michelle): The pipe organ concert featuring organist Jeffery Campbell was very well-received and generated over \$400 in donations to the fund. The Patriotic Pipes concert is scheduled for July 11th.

Annual Catholic Appeal (Ann): The Parish not only met, but exceeded the goal, reaching 137%. Les Orchekowski addressed the Parish with a message of gratitude for their generosity at Mass last weekend.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): The team has been busy with repairs around the campus including a defective light, sprinklers and some minor roof issues.

St Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): A grant request has been submitted to the City to pave the parking lot at the thrift store. Homeless shelters are full and there has been a recent uptick in homelessness. The SSVEC employees put together a 501(c)3 fund for the sole purpose of assisting those in need with not only electric bills, but other utilities as well.

Knights of Columbus (Larry): The Arizona Knights collected \$326,000 from the State raffle, all of which will be distributed to charities throughout the State.

Our Lady of the Sierras Foundation (Charlie): This month, Fr Bob Gonzalez presented a wonderful program about Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Scholarship Update (Thad): Checks for the winners of the Scholarship will be distributed this week.

All Saints School (Damian): The school had some great end-of-year events for all students, including an awards ceremony. Enrollment numbers are off to a great start and hopes are high that the target of 100 students will be reached.

Youth Ministry News (Yvonne): Turnout was great at the Vinny's Pizza fundraiser with over \$600 in tips donated and a further \$1,000 expected in proceeds from the sales. Ten members of the seekers group will be making a trip to the Grand Canyon. The Parish has been asked to send young people to the Diocesan youth council. VBS is scheduled for the first week of June.

Draft Budget review: Council members had the chance to review and recommend modifications to the proposed Parish Budget for fiscal year 2026. The Council will vote on the budget at next month's meeting.

Pastor Report: Fr. Greg expressed congratulations to the winners of the scholarships, Alexander Slone and Keyla Rueda. An ice cream social in honor of Fr. Mike Bucciarelli's 50th Anniversary of ordination will follow the 10 a.m. Mass on June 22nd.

Linda K. adjourned the meeting at 6:34 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.
