

DID YOU KNOW....

that Pentecost is not just an historical but a continuing event? Our Lord promised: “*you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you and you shall be My witnesses..*” (Acts 1:8) That promise was kept at Pentecost and continues to be experienced in the lives of believers today!

What are some of the expressions of that spiritual power that you have received? The power of *prayer*, the power of *forgiveness*, the power of *persuasion*, the power of *perseverance*, the power of *example*... just to name a few! The truth is that we have received enormous power. The question is, are we using that power? Are we letting the Holy Spirit shape and energize our daily lives? St. Paul says that “*the Spirit which you have been given is not a Spirit of fearfulness, but a Spirit of love, power, and self-control!*” (2 Timothy 1:7)

We have all been given the Spirit to be witnesses – men and women whose lifestyles, personal priorities, demeanor, and putting God first gives “proof” of the reality of God! “*You [ALL] shall be My witnesses!*” So many of you show concern about your children, grandchildren, and great grandchildren who know nothing about God. We share a real concern about their seeming ‘indifference’ (if not hostility) to the things of God – and anything spiritual! Too many blame themselves –

“*I thought that we had raised them right*’... ‘*took them to Mass*’... ‘*made sure that they received their Sacraments*’... ‘*we sent them to Catholic schools*’ – Now certainly most of us would admit that there is probably more that we could have done in teaching and putting God first in all things! How many times did we allow other activities – sports events, school events, even recreation -- to take precedence over worship?

We have all been guilty of that at times of not putting God first!

But what about NOW? Yes, your adult children do know about your God-centered priorities for life and are aware of your unhappiness over their ‘disconnect’ from the Church or any expression of spiritual life. Are you now “fearful” about bringing it up? Are you afraid to be the witness you have been called and empowered to be – beginning with your own family? Are you afraid of offending them? Of making them “uncomfortable” or yourself feeling “uncomfortable”? (It has been wisely said that the moral collapse of our society – and the moral collapse of our families – comes from an “addiction” to Comfort, which necessarily leads to Compromise in matters large and small; which inevitably leads to Complacency – to indifference to Truth; and Complacency leads to Collapse.)

What can you do now? Certainly, pray for your family members. Prayer is an enormous power, as you know! Do your family members know that you are praying for them?

Do you ask them what they would like you to ask God for them? Do they know that you believe in the power of prayer? Do you invite them to Mass with you? Do you share articles about the Faith, recommend books or spiritually sound television (like “*The Chosen*”) to them? Do you send cards with a Christian message for birthdays, anniversaries, graduations? Have you considered writing letters to your family members, sharing your thoughts and spiritual insights? Remember that you have received the same Holy Spirit Who inspired Paul and the other writers of the Epistles and Who can be your inspiration in writing letters from the heart to people that you love and for whom you have concern!

Use your “Pentecost Power” every day – God is counting on you!



CATHOLIC QUIZ : This week's Question:

"What is the significance of 'St. Patrick's Shamrock' and what does it have to do with the Feast of the Holy Trinity?"



The answer to last week's Question:
"What does 'Pentecost' mean? From where does it originate?" The Jewish Festival of Weeks (or 'First Fruits') - in Hebrew 'Shavuot' - is a major Jewish festival held on the 6th (and usually the 7th) of *Sivan*, fifty days after the second day of Passover. It was originally a harvest festival, but now also commemorates the giving of the Law (the *Torah*) on Mount Sinai and a renewal of the Covenant. The word "Pentecost" is derived from the Greek for "fifty": 'pente'.

In the account of the Outpouring of the Holy Spirit in Acts, chapter 2, the Evangelist notes that the Gift of the Spirit brought to fulfillment the 'Passover' of the Lord (50 days before) and the sealing of the new Covenant, in signs which evoked the giving of the Law on Sinai – fire, earthquake, and wind. The listing of the many nationalities present when Peter proclaimed the Good News, points to the gathering of Jews from all over the Dispersion ("Diaspora") present in Jerusalem for *Shavuot*!

The old English name for *Pentecost* – "Whit Sunday" – is derived from the newly baptized neophyte's white ('whit') robe, worn for the fifty-day Easter feast, from their initiation at the Easter Vigil until the celebration of the Gift of the Spirit.





June Parish Nurse News Working on your Spiritual Health

What are the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit and what do they mean for us?

1.) Wisdom

Seeing things from God's perspective. This may mean reading the Bible more, having conversations with God, and receiving the Eucharist. All of these things may help us to recharge our spiritual batteries.

2.) Understanding

Recognizing that God is present in all things and allowing God to open our minds to all that is present. This may mean stopping to smell the flower on the side of the street or seeing God in the homeless person you meet at Walmart.

3.) Knowledge

Choosing a path that leads us to God. Avoid obstacles that block our ability to get closer to Him. This may mean seeing God's goodness in the mundane everyday tasks of laundry, washing dishes, or cooking dinner. Recognize that evil will still be present in this world so that a greater good can come of it. Knowledge is trusting the process and being at peace with it.

4.) Counsel

This is decision making in action. Using the steps of deliberation, making a decision, and carrying out the decision, whether this be for small everyday choices, or large life-changing ones.

5.) Piety

Knowing how God loves each one of us and this can translate into us loving humanity universally—avoiding actions that lead to prejudice or racism. Trusting in God the Father during all times, even times of suffering. Praying the Our Father daily can help us.

6.) Fortitude or Courage

This is the strength to do good. Overcoming fear and offering up our sufferings. Learning to "suffer with meaning" and "carry the cross" during the most difficult of times.

7.) Fear of the Lord

As humans, we are weak. However, by the grace of God, we are able to do much good in this world.



REFLECT

Abortion is always a tragedy that takes the life of an innocent child and significantly wounds the mother. For decades, surgical procedures accounted for most abortions, but today chemical abortion is the most common form in the United States. Chemical abortion is a process that generally involves a pregnant woman taking a sequence of pills early in pregnancy to kill and expel a developing child from her womb. Sadly, this form of abortion not only takes the life of a child but also poses significant risks to the health and safety of women.

Despite these serious risks, chemical abortion has widespread accessibility. Since 2016, the FDA has shown continued disregard for women's health by loosening safety standards, extending the limits of when the drugs can be used, and decreasing the number of required doctor's visits. Most recently, the FDA has allowed abortion pills to be prescribed through virtual appointments, made available at neighborhood pharmacies, and ordered online, enabling a nationwide mail-order abortion industry. These policies leave women vulnerable to suffering an abortion at home, alone, without any medical

supervision. In addition to putting a woman's health at risk, the actions taken by the FDA also increase the chances that women may be exploited by violent partners and human traffickers.

In June 2024, the Supreme Court threw out a case that had the potential to restore limitations to chemical abortion. It did not rule on the underlying questions, however, and only determined that the pro-life health care professionals who brought the lawsuit did not have the legally required standing to challenge the FDA's actions. While this initial case was unsuccessful, we pray that new action will be taken to protect women and preborn children from the dangers of the abortion pill.
