Over the past several months, we have seen an extraordinary increase in the generosity of our Parishioners! The weekend Offertory is up from past years, the response to the special Collection for Youth Activities was an astounding \$5,000, our St. Vincent de Paul Conference and Community Food Bank have seen significant increases, and at the final count for the *Annual Catholic Appeal* we are at 140% of our Parish Goal: almost \$188,000 – a large increase from last year!

This past Wednesday, in the First Reading at Mass St. Paul spoke about the generosity of the Christians in Corinth and the “why” of generosity:



Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. And God is more than able to bless you abundantly, so that in all things at all times, having all that you need, you will abound in every good work. You will be enriched in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God.” 2 Corinthians 9:6-11

An old Priest, reflecting on his ministry of many years, said that he was always astounded at the incredible ‘flow of graces’ which passed through his hands – and that all that he had to do was to keep his hands open!

Please know that we, your clergy and Parish Staff, appreciate your extraordinary spirit of generosity in all things! You yourselves are a sign of the flow of God’s abundant love through all of our hands!

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: “What is ‘Peter’s Pence’?

The answer to last week's Question: “What does the pelican have to do with the Eucharist?”



The pelican is a favorite symbol of the Eucharist. There was an ancient belief that the female pelican would peck open her breast to feed her young with her own blood. (What naturalists now know that the blood which stains the snowy breast of the pelican is fish blood from the fish which she regurgitates and feeds to her young.) Because of this wide-spread belief that the pelican ‘sacrifices her life blood’ for the sake of her young, it became a very popular symbol of the Eucharist! If you look at the carving on the front of the altar in the *Divine Mercy Chapel*, you will find this image -- called “the Pelican in her Piety”-- feeding her young in a nest made of the Crown of Thorns!




