



CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is the 'Infant of Prague'?"



The answer to last week's Question: "What is the meaning of the 'Ecce Homo'?" The phrase comes from the Passion of the Lord, when Pontius Pilate presented JESUS to the crowd, after he had Him scourged – "Ecce Homo" – Latin for: "Behold, the Man!" (John 19:5) "Ecce Homo" is also the name given to depictions of JESUS on Good Friday, showing Him crowned with thorns and presented to the crowds, scourged and mocked. Great artists, such as *Correggio*, *Durer*, *Poussin*, *Rembrandt*, *Reni*, *Titian*, and *Van Dyck*, have all painted this scene. Pilate's demand continues to touch hearts: "Look at JESUS!"





REFLECT

At the end of this month, the Church will celebrate the Jubilee of Young People as part of the Holy Year reflecting on the virtue of hope. Young adults are invited to make a pilgrimage to Rome or observe the Jubilee celebration in their local diocese. Our recent Holy Fathers have emphasized the special role that young people have in the Church, with Pope St. John Paul II establishing World Youth Day as an international gathering of the young Church to inspire and encourage them in their faith. The papal bull for the Holy Year encourages us, “With renewed passion, let us demonstrate care and concern for adolescents, students and young couples, the rising generation. Let us draw close to the young, for they are the joy and hope of the Church and of the world!”

Despite the increasing challenges that young people face in our world today, Pope Francis has called young adults to be *pilgrims of hope*. For “Christian hope does not deceive or disappoint because it is grounded in the certainty that nothing and no one may ever separate us from God’s love.” When we consider the battle for life, hope is essential in all our efforts to build a culture that welcomes, protects, and

celebrates the gift of human life. Amidst increasing threats to human life, the young must carry forth the truth that every human life made in the image and likeness of God has innate value and infinite dignity. We pray that the Church, through the witness of the young, may “always be prepared to defend the rights of those who are most vulnerable.”

Summer safety... avoiding heat sickness

It all starts with **heat cramps**...typically in the abdomen or the legs and increased sweating. Drink plenty of water and if after an hour, symptoms are not better, seek medical attention.

Heat exhaustion can occur next and present with increased sweating, weakness, and feeling cool/clammy with an increased heart rate, nausea, and dizziness. Move to a cooler environment, take sips of water and if symptoms do not get better after an hour, seek medical attention.

Heat exhaustion when left untreated can lead to **heat stroke**. Heat stroke occurs when the body overheats and cannot cool down.

It can happen when there is increased physical activity (such as people who work outside) or when you spend too long in a warm space without air conditioning.

Those over 65, children, and pregnant women are at highest risk of dehydration and heat sickness.

Body temperature typically reaches 103-104 degrees (or more).

Heat stroke can cause brain dysfunction—including signs of confusion and agitation.

If you suspect someone has heat stroke, seek immediate attention (call 911)
Best to cool person down within 30 minutes of symptoms onset

Move out of the sun

Pour water on person/apply ice packs

DO NOT give fever reducing medications (this is different than having a traditional fever) OR fluids (as this can cause aspiration).

Complications from heat stroke can last weeks or months so it's best to practice prevention:

Keep the house cool

Identify places you can go to cool down if your home does not have AC (like a library or store)

Stay hydrated

Avoid being outside if at all possible during the hottest times of the day


