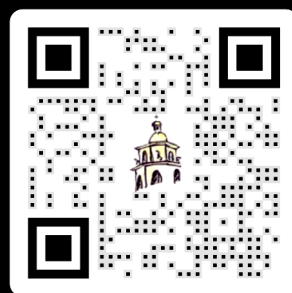

DID YOU KNOW....

that it was on the 23rd of August 1617 – four hundred and eight years ago this week! – that St. Vincent de Paul established the first “Confraternity of Charity” in the Parish of Chatillon-les-Dombes?

This is how St. Vincent described the event: “One Sunday, as I was vesting for Mass, a parishioner came to tell me that in an isolated house about a kilometer from there, everyone was sick, leaving no one strong enough to care for the others, and that all of them were in indescribable need. This touched me deeply.”

At the announcements after the sermon, St. Vincent put out an appeal for help for this family in such vivid terms that the parishioners were also greatly moved. When he went out that afternoon to visit the family, he met many people who were also on their way to that family or who were coming back from there! “. . .there were so many that it looked like a procession.” After he had comforted the family and brought them Communion, he gathered a few people to explore ways to continue offering this kind of help. “I suggested to all these good people whom charity had inspired to visit the sick family that could set themselves one day each, to put something into the stew pot, not only for that family but for those who would follow!”

And so, a few days later, from this seemingly chance event, was organized the first parish “confraternity of charity” which became the pattern for a world-wide Lay Apostolate of the Church, numbering some 800,000 members in 140 countries.

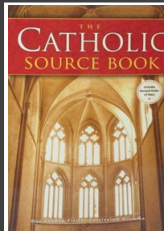
The Society of St. Vincent de Paul was founded 192 years ago to help impoverished people living in the slums of Paris, France. The primary figure behind the society's founding was Blessed Frederic Ozanam, a French lawyer, author, and professor in the Sorbonne, and *Sister Rosalie Rendu*, a Vincentian Sister.

Membership in the United States totals more than 172,000 in 4,600 communities. The *Society of St. Vincent de Paul* in the United States provides more than \$675 million in tangible and in-kind services, serves more than 14 million people each year, and delivers more than 7 million service hours to those in need.

Our own *St. Andrew's Conference* of the *Society of St. Vincent de Paul* numbers 37 members (called “Vincentians”) and provides a wide variety of services for our neighbors in need, as well as operating the *Community Food Bank* and the *St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store*!

CATHOLIC QUIZ:

This week's Question: “What is an altar stone?”

The answer to last week's Question: “What is the ‘Falling Asleep of the Mother of God’?”

The Dormition (‘Falling Asleep’) and the Assumption are describing the same event. Since the Church understands death to be a consequence of the first sin and believes that Mary was conceived without Original Sin, some theologians wondered if Mary died or was simply assumed into heaven without dying.

The Eastern Orthodox Churches believe the latter. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* doesn't answer the question, but says: “The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven. . .” (CCC, 974) What IS known is that no “relics” of Mary have ever been proposed for veneration – (apart from her veil and her sash, venerated in the Cathedral of Chartres in France) – and since the time of the Apostles it was known that Mary's tomb was empty and her body assumed into heaven.

The Benedictine Basilica of the Dormition (‘falling asleep’) on Mount Zion and the Church of Mary's Tomb, near Gethsemane, are two beloved Marian shrines in the Holy Land. At the foot of the Mount of Olives, the Church of Mary's Tomb is shared by Greek Orthodox, Armenians, Syrians, Copts, and Abyssinians. It is also venerated as a holy place by Muslims, who have long honored Mary. The dogma of the Assumption was formally defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950.



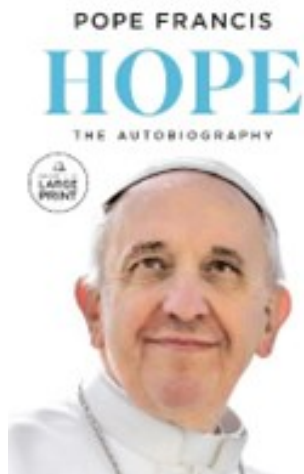

Hope is the first autobiography in history ever to be published by a pope. Written over six years, this complete autobiography starts in the early years of the twentieth century, with Pope Francis's Italian roots and his ancestors' courageous migration to Latin America, continuing through his childhood, the enthusiasms and preoccupations of his youth, his vocation, adult life, and the whole of his papacy up to the present day.

Hope includes a wealth of revelations, anecdotes, and illuminating thoughts. It is a thrilling and very human memoir, moving and sometimes funny, which represents the "story of a life" and, at the same time, a touching moral and spiritual testament that will fascinate readers throughout the world and will be Pope Francis's legacy of hope for future generations.

Lately the stream has experienced interruptions for a variety of reasons. Our technology folks work long and hard behind the scenes to resolve these issues.

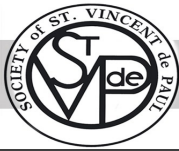

Fall Risk Prevention

*Every second of every day, an older adult falls

*41,000 older adults die as a result of falls yearly

*Most falls are preventable

What can I do to prevent falling?

- ♦ Get your eyes checked
- ♦ Make sure you are wearing proper footwear
- ♦ Have a discussion with your primary care provider
 - ♦ Go over any medications/supplements you take that may cause dizziness
 - ♦ Discuss your health conditions that may predispose you to falling
 - ♦ If appropriate, ask about therapy to help with balance
- ♦ Exercise! Keep moving – do activities to improve balance and strengthen your legs
- ♦ Avoid/limit alcohol
- ♦ When rising from a seated (or supine) position, get up slowly

In your home

- ♦ Keep your floors clutter-free
- ♦ Remove rugs
- ♦ Consider installing grab bars in your tub/shower and next to your toilet
- ♦ Use non-slip mats in your tubs/showers
- ♦ Use enough lights in your home, including putting nightlights in bedrooms and bathrooms
- ♦ Do not use chairs as step stools
- ♦ Keep cords and wires out of walkways
