


DID YOU KNOW....

that the word “liturgy” is derived from a Greek word, meaning ‘public service’ or ‘shared service benefiting a specific community’s needs?’ According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* (#1070) there are three aspects to Christian liturgy: 1) the celebration of divine worship, 2) the proclamation of the Gospel, and 3) active charity. Full, active participation at the Eucharistic liturgy involves conscious presence, praying, singing, and acting in *union* with the whole assembly. (“Privatizing” one’s participation – not sharing with others – ‘doing one’s own thing’ – is really contrary to the spirit of the Liturgy and not in accord with Catholic teaching.) Catholic Liturgy is *public* (community) worship which honors God, teaches His people, and leads them to deeper faith and greater holiness, as a whole Community. Our Catholic understanding of Liturgy is Trinitarian (the Perfect Community/Unity of the Godhead): it is offered by the whole Christ, Head and members, by JESUS our High Priest and his brothers and sisters. It is offered to the Father through the Son in the power of the Holy Spirit!

That is really the foundational base of Catholic Liturgy. There will be local variations in the forms, as directed by the Diocesan Bishop – the “Chief Liturgical Officer” – and as shaped by the culture of the Parish Community. These variations in ‘form’ – e.g. standing at certain points, (in some Parishes the whole assembly remains standing throughout the distribution of Holy Communion); holding hands at the ‘Our Father’; in our Parish a slight bowing of the head at the Holy Name of JESUS, etc. are local ‘customs’ and not part of the Sacred Tradition of the Church. Here the ancient rule applies: “In essentials there must be UNITY; in non-essentials (customs) there must be LIBERTY; and in all things there must be CHARITY.”

When visiting other Parishes, be a good guest in CHARITY, honoring that Community’s ‘customs’ and do not impose your ‘customary’ way of worship. Again, remember the ancient wisdom – offered by St. Ambrose: “*When in Rome, do as the Romans.*” which the Saint advised specifically in reference to local “customs”. Be sensitive and charitably accepting of the “customs” of the Parish Community you are visiting and do not “privatize” the Liturgy, by doing your “customary” thing, if it draws attention to yourself, or otherwise violates the spirit of UNITY which should always characterize Catholic Liturgy.

Routines in any part of life *can* occasion carelessness – and we can never be ‘casual’ or careless about the Sacred Liturgy and the unique encounter with the Living God which it provides!

**CATHOLIC QUIZ:**

This week’s Question: “What are the ‘Steps’ to the altar?”

The answer to last week’s Question: “What is an altar stone?”

This stone is embedded in the surface of the altar and is technically identified as the altar itself. This stone, usually being only large enough to hold the chalice and the paten, its surface is flush with the altar. Its upper surface bears five crosses, signifying the great wounds visible in the Body of the Risen Christ’s, where a Bishop anoints it with Holy Oil when it is consecrated in a special Rite. The altar stone contains sealed relics of martyred saints, hence every Mass is celebrated ‘with the martyrs’. The relics recall Masses offered in the catacombs. For this reason, the celebrant kisses the altar stone – through the layers of altar clothes – upon entering and leaving the sanctuary for Mass. (If you would like to be as smart as the “Quiz Master” – pick up a copy of the *Catholic Source Book*, available in the Parish Office, for only \$15!)





Fall Risk Prevention

*Every second of every day, an older adult falls
*41,000 older adults die as a result of falls yearly
*Most falls are preventable

What can I do to prevent falling?

- ◆ Get your eyes checked
- ◆ Make sure you are wearing proper footwear
- ◆ Have a discussion with your primary care provider
 - Go over any medications/supplements you take that may cause dizziness
 - Discuss your health conditions that may predispose you to falling
 - If appropriate, ask about therapy to help with balance
- ◆ Exercise! Keep moving – do activities to improve balance and strengthen your legs
- ◆ Avoid/limit alcohol
- ◆ When rising from a seated (or supine) position, get up slowly

In your home:

- ◆ Keep your floors clutter-free
- ◆ Remove rugs
- ◆ Consider installing grab bars in your tub/shower and next to your toilet
- ◆ Use non-slip mats in your tubs/showers
- ◆ Use enough lights in your home, including putting nightlights in bedrooms and bathrooms
- ◆ Do not use chairs as step stools
- ◆ Keep cords and wires out of walkways
