DID YOU KNOW....

that next week our own Father Anthony Corcoran, SJ, will be visiting us from Kyrgyzstan?

Father Anthony was baptized at St. Andrew's in 1963. His parents, *Bob* and *Elaine*, now deceased, were active and beloved parishioners.

Father Anthony serves as Apostolic Administrator for Kyrgyzstan, a position much like that of bishop. Since his priestly ordination in 1996, he has been assigned almost exclusively to the countries of Russia and Kyrgyzstan. *Father Anthony* entered the Society of Jesus in 1985. Following the usual path of Jesuit formation, he completed the novitiate and First Studies (earning a master's degree in international political economic development from Fordham). He taught social studies at Jesuit High School in New Orleans before completing both a licentiate and doctorate in sacred theology from the Weston School of Theology.

From 1997 to 2000, *Father Anthony* served in the Diocese of Novosibirsk, Russia, as a pastoral minister, spiritual director of Seminary and Vicar General of the Diocese.

After a short break for his tertianship, the final step in Jesuit formation, he returned to the Diocese of Novosibirsk, this time as Vicar General of the Diocese while also doing work in the local minor Seminary.

Following a two-year return to the United States to complete his doctorate, he returned to Novosibirsk for another decade, during which time he served primarily as canonical Superior of the Russia region of Jesuits and Rector of the pro-seminary.

Pope Francis appointed him Apostolic Administrator for Kyrgyzstan in 2017.

Kyrgyzstan is a mountainous Central Asian country of 6 million people landlocked between China to the south and east and the republics of Tajikistan, Uzbekistan and Kazakhstan, all formerly part of the Soviet Union.

In 1991, after the fall of the Soviet Union, Kyrgyzstan gained its independence. Its population is largely Muslim. Catholics are few and far between, and are mainly of Polish, German or Korean origin. The jurisdiction was entrusted to the Jesuits by the Vatican.

We 'welcome home' *Father Anthony* and look forward to hearing him next weekend!

A special Second Collection will be taken at all Masses next weekend for his Mission!

AND Pope Leo will canonize *Blessed Carlo Acutis* – the first 'millennial saint' – and *Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati* this Sunday, 7 September. The canonizations have been greatly anticipated since they were first announced by Pope Francis last November, reflecting the widespread devotion to these two young Blessed, particularly among young people seeking modern role models in the Faith. Our Youth Pilgrims visited the tomb of *Blessed Carlo Acutis* on their Pilgrimage to Rome in April – and our newly refurbished Youth Wing will be dedicated to now *Saint Carlo Acutis* following the 5:00 PM Life Teen Mass this Sunday!

CATHOLIC QUIZ:

This week's Question: "What is the 'Nave' of a church?"

The answer to last week's Question: "What is a 'Chancel'?" The Chancel is the area around the altar reserved for the clergy and those assisting them at Mass. It comes from the Roman custom of separating lawyers from the public in court by a lattice screen (Latin: *cancellus*, screen). The word "Chancery" is also derived from this legal term. Before the liturgical reforms of 1963, the Chancel (also called 'the Sanctuary') was divided from the nave of the church by an 'altar rail' – strictly setting the limits to which laypersons could approach the altar. This 'screening' of the altar was an 'Imperial innovation' following the legalization of Christianity in 325 AD, it was unknown in the early Church! Like the *iconostases* (the wall which 'shields' the altar from the nave) in Eastern Rite and Eastern Orthodox Churches), the altar screen evolved into major architectural and decorative element – but limited the participation of the Faithful to 'viewing' the Mass.

REFLECT

The Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary celebrates the Blessed Mother's entrance into heavenly glory. Mary's Assumption into heaven reminds us that life on earth is a pilgrimage to our ultimate destination. We prepare in hope for our own passage into eternal life by the choices we make today. When we choose to love and follow God in our daily lives, we strengthen our relationship with Him, and this relationship is the true meaning of heaven: "To live in heaven is 'to be with Christ'" (CCC, 1025).

We can see how, throughout her life, the Blessed Mother continually chose to go deeper into her relationship with God. She modeled how to value and respect His precious gift of human life, from the moment of conception to its natural end. In the Annunciation, through her "yes," Mary witnessed to the undeniable humanity of pre-born children as she conceived and carried the Christ child in her womb. After the Annunciation, having learned that her cousin Elizabeth was with child, she went in haste to her aid.

Our Blessed Mother shows us how the way we live *today* can prepare us, in hope, to also enter into heavenly glory at the end of our lives. Are we open to God's precious gift of new life? How do we support pregnant mothers and parents? Do we prioritize showing our love to those who are ill or aging? Do we care for them in a way that respects God's gift of life?

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.

ACT (choose one)

- Read and meditate on the Mass readings for the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary (bit.ly/assumption-2025). Reflect on how the Blessed Mother consistently exemplified how to welcome and cherish God's gift of human life.
- Choose one night to sleep without your pillow or on the floor. Consider how Mary welcomed the Christ-child in humble surroundings and pray for mothers who welcome their children amidst poverty and difficult circumstances today.
- Offer some other sacrifice or prayer that you feel called to do for this month's intention.



PADRE KINO RELIC/PRAYER CARDS



With the designation of *Padre Kino, the “Padre on Horseback”* “*The Apostle of the Pimeria Alta*”- as “Venerable” by Pope Francis in 2020, the Kino Heritage Society has been looking for more ways to make better known *Padre Kino*’s name and ‘career’ as a “Bridge-builder” between peoples and cultures!

In order to further the Cause of *Padre Kino*’s beatification, the Kino Heritage Society sought to obtain 3rd Class relics, to be shared through holy cards, inviting his intercession.

After a number of delays and postponements, permission was finally secured, for a very rare opening of the crypt in Magdalena, SON, to allow the placement of several rolls of black ribbon in near proximity to *Padre Kino*’s remains – the ribbon then becoming 3rd Class relics.

This happened on 30 March 2022!

The mausoleum and *Padre Kino*’s remains have been the centerpiece of a very popular pilgrimage every October, drawing crowds from all over southern Arizona, northern Sonora, and the Native American tribal lands – the scene of *Padre Kino*’s apostolic labors for twenty-four years.

The ribbon is cut into small pieces and affixed to holy cards, with the prayer for *Padre Kino*’s beatification. Under Sister Doris Jurgenson, a wonderful ‘team’ assembled these holy cards for distribution in 2022.

We are now in need of VOLUNTEERS to help assemble a new supply of the Relic/Prayer Cards!


