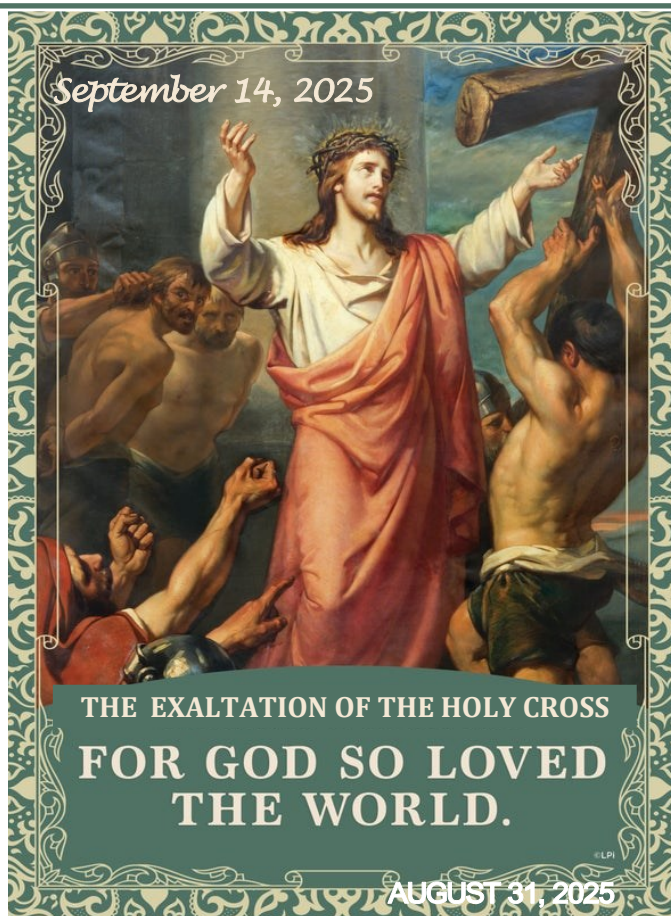

The Annual Parish Picnic is a come-together event for the whole Parish community: a kind of ‘homecoming’, family reunion, and kids’ party all rolled into one!

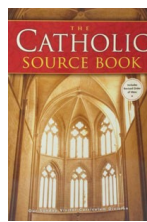
THANK YOU to all of you who make the Annual Ministry Fair and Parish Picnic such a joyful event every year!

CATHOLIC QUIZ:



This week’s Question: “What are the ‘Fifteen Marks of the True Church’?”

The answer to last week’s Question:

“What is the ‘Nave’ of a church?” It is a church’s central and primary architectural feature, the ‘body of the church’ extending from the entrance

*to the sanctuary. The word *nave* comes from the Latin: *navis*: meaning ‘ship’, so called because of its resemblance to ships of the era. Because we are called by the Lord to be “fishers of men [and women]”, the symbolism of the church building as a fishing boat is important. Some of the early Church Fathers also likened the church building to Noah’s Ark, floating above the corruption and darkness of this world!*

Some would see the rows of pews as “rowers’ benches” – all pulling together in the service of the Lord!

SOUL FOOD:

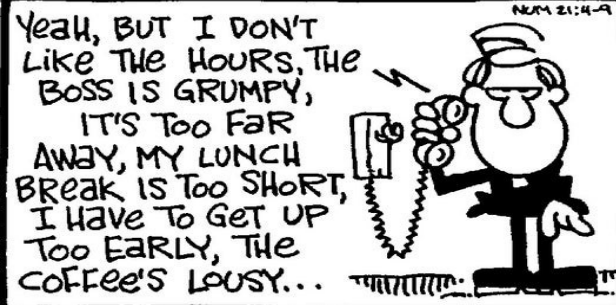

September Parish Nurse Health Information

Recommended preventive screenings for adults

- Mammograms every 1-2 years starting at age 40-45 until age 75 (or later depending on your health).
- Colon cancer screening starting at age 45 until age 75 (or later) with a Cologuard, FIT, or colonoscopy (duration between tests varies depending on test used).
- Pap smears starting at age 21 until age 65 (every 3-5 years depending on age and type of test used).
- If you are a smoker or have a history of heavy smoking in the past, it may be recommended to get screened for lung cancer with a CT scan yearly between ages 50 and 80.
- In women, it is recommended to get a bone density scan done (DEXA) if you are over age 65, or younger if risk factors for osteoporosis are present.
- And...remember to get your annual checkup, as well as lab work, weight and blood pressure checked regularly.

Vaccines:

- Flu shots are recommended for all those over 6 months and particularly those who are at high risk for disease.
- The COVID shot is recommended yearly particularly for those over 65 and those at high risk of disease.
- RSV shot for those over 60 primarily.
- Shingles shot for those over 50.
- Pneumonia shots for those over 65, and under 65 with chronic health conditions.

For our young ones:

- ⇒ Assuming the baby shots have been given, at age 4-5, your child receives the chickenpox shot as well as diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis, polio, and measles-mumps-rubella.
- ⇒ At age 11-12, your child receives the HPV (human papillomavirus) shots as well as meningitis, and TDAP (tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis).

Talk to your health care provider as these are general recommendations that may vary depending on health conditions and family history.
