



that next Saturday morning, we will share in the Nation-wide "Walk for the Poor" sponsored by the St. Vincent de Paul Society?

Our Vincentians – all Volunteers – will be handing out grocery bags this weekend - to be filled and brought to the church for the "Walk" next Saturday, following the 9:00 AM Mass!

In September 1974, a group of men received a charter from the National Headquarters of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul, establishing our Parish Conference. They used a large closet in Madonna Hall, to collect food and clothing for distribution to the needy in our Community. In 1980 the St. Vincent de Paul Thrift Store was opened at 220 East Meyer Drive. In 1993, the City of Sierra Vista asked our St. VdeP Conference to take over the management of the *Community Food Bank*. The Food Bank and Offices were then moved from the Thrift Store in 1995 to the present location at 616 Bartow Avenue.

The Parish-based Conference continues to grow and provided the 'safety net' for the neediest people in our Community – providing food, rental and utilities assistance, clothing and furniture items through our Thrift Store. Last year, the St. Vincent de Paul *Community Food Bank* distributed over 1,000,000 pounds of food!

All of this wonderful work of charity is made possible because of the generosity of our Parishioners – through the First Sunday Collection for St. VdeP, your donations to the Community Food Bank, and the Thrift Store – as well as many supporters through the wider Community, who recognize the vital role that St. Vincent de Paul Society plays in caring for the needy. Collaborating with the St. VdeP Conference at Our Lady of the Mountains (each Conference is 'parish-based' and supported by their own parish), together we have been blessed to make an enormous difference in the lives of many, many of our fellow citizens!

Please know how grateful we are to ALL of our Parishioners who have so generously supported our Conference for 51 years!

CATHOLIC QUIZ:

This week's Question: "What is an 'Archbishop'?"

The answer to last week's Question: "What are the 'Fifteen Marks of the True Church'?"

An expansion of the Four Marks of the Church – (One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic) by St. Robert Bellarmine (1542-1621), one of the leaders of the Counter-Reformation and a Doctor of the Church, the Fifteen Marks are: 1) NAME: Catholic, world-wide and not confined to a particular nation; 2) ANTIQUITY, in tracing ancestry directly to Christ; 3) DURATION, lasting substantially the same for millennia; 4) EXTENSIVENESS, in numbers of members; 5) EPISCOPAL SUCCESSION, from the Twelve Apostles to the current bishops; 6) DOCTRINAL AGREEMENT between present teaching and apostolic Church; 7) UNITY among members, and between members and visible head (the pope); 8) HOLINESS OF DOCTRINE, reflecting the holiness of God and truth of the Sacred Scripture; 9) EFFICACY OF DOCTRINE, reflecting the guidance of the Holy Spirit; 10) HOLINESS OF LIFE of representative writers and defenders; 11) MIRACLES worked in the Church, as in Apostolic times; 12) PROPHECY given through its saints and spokespersons; 13) OPPOSITION against the Church in the same way and for the same reasons that Christ was opposed; 14) UNHAPPY END of her enemies, that the 'gates of hell' do not prevail against the Church; 15) TEMPORAL PEACE AND EARTHLY HAPPINESS of those who are faithful to her teaching.



September Parish Nurse Health Information

Recommended preventive screenings for adults

- Mammograms every 1-2 years starting at age 40-45 until age 75 (or later depending on your health).
- Colon cancer screening starting at age 45 until age 75 (or later) with a Cologuard, FIT, or colonoscopy (duration between tests varies depending on test used).
- Pap smears starting at age 21 until age 65 (every 3-5 years depending on age and type of test used).
- If you are a smoker or have a history of heavy smoking in the past, it may be recommended to get screened for lung cancer with a CT scan yearly between ages 50 and 80.
- In women, it is recommended to get a bone density scan done (DEXA) if you are over age 65, or younger if risk factors for osteoporosis are present.
- And...remember to get your annual checkup, as well as lab work, weight and blood pressure checked regularly.

Vaccines:

- Flu shots are recommended for all those over 6 months and particularly those who are at high risk for disease.
- The COVID shot is recommended yearly particularly for those over 65 and those at high risk of disease.
- RSV shot for those over 60 primarily.
- Shingles shot for those over 50.
- Pneumonia shots for those over 65, and under 65 with chronic health conditions.

For our young ones:

- ⇒ Assuming the baby shots have been given, at age 4-5, your child receives the chickenpox shot as well as diphtheria/tetanus/pertussis, polio, and measles-mumps-rubella.
- ⇒ At age 11-12, your child receives the HPV (human papillomavirus) shots as well as meningitis, and TDAP (tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis).

Talk to your health care provider as these are general recommendations that may vary depending on health conditions and family history.
