


that our new carillon (bell) system has been installed and our church has been given back its 'voice'? Following the failure of the almost 20-year-old electronic control of our carillon system, a very generous (anonymous) donor paid for the replacement system to be constructed by the Verdin Bell Company of Cincinnati! Our own Dan Pierce then spent many, many hours programming the new computer system with the daily schedule of the Angelus, the "Great Mercy" bell at 3:00PM, and the "Five-Minute bell" before each Mass! Dan also programmed the hymns to be played for the various seasons of the Church Year, and other hymns for special occasions! It was a great deal of work and because of Dan and his skills, we were spared the additional expense for a technician to come from Cincinnati!

The bells of St. Andrew's have become a very important part of the 'soundscape' of our community, and some relators have shared that they have had inquiries about homes within the 'sound of the bells' from St. Andrew's! Many of our parishioners have remarked on how much they missed the sound of the bells, especially the Angelus at Noon and 6:00 PM each day!

Bells perform multiple spiritual functions: arousing devotion in private and public worship; tolling for the souls of the Faithful departed; communicating joy or sorrow; ringing out Eucharistic hymns during Processions of the Blessed Sacrament; even, it was believed, driving away evil spirits – which was why bells were rung during severe storms! Responding to the bells' call is part of the ongoing process of conversion and renewal – learning how to respond to 'holy time and holy space' centered in the parish church, allowing the bells to call us to prayer in our daily lives, and connecting our outward devotion with interior spirituality! The bells are fundamental in defining, constructing, and governing the meanings of time and space and tying individuals and communities to places made sacred to Christians!

Thank you, again, to our wonderful donor and to Dan Pierce for giving our church back its voice!

Fr. Greg will be on Retreat this coming week and Fr. Rob the following week – please pray for our Priests during their time of retreat and spiritual renewal!

CATHOLIC QUIZ:

This week's Question: "What is 'Apostolic Succession'?"

The answer to last week's Question: **"Why do Popes change their names when elected as Pope?"**

The tradition of popes changing names upon election traditionally dates from Sergius IV (1009-1012). His given name was Peter di Porca, and when elected as Pope, he changed it in deference to St. Peter, considering that it was unseemly to call himself, "Peter II". Actually prior to this, some popes had changed their names to drop a name of pagan origin. This tradition allows popes to show esteem for a predecessor, signal a goal or style they want to have, and demonstrate a total commitment to the Office.

In the past the taking of a 'religious' name was seen as a break from one's former life and an entry into a new way of life.

SOUL FOOD:

An older priest was asked by the Bishop of Eichstaett, Cardinal Josef Schroeffer, "I have heard that every day you pray 15 decades of the Rosary, is that so?" The old man smiled and said, "My health still permits me to do so, yes. In the quiet passage of the day of a retired person it is very good and very profitable to frequently include a decade of the Rosary."

The ordinary day of this old man could hardly be called 'quiet.' He used to say that in his old age, he was given a 'job' but he, nevertheless, continued to pray 15 decades of the Rosary each day. The old man was Saint Pope John XXIII.





Dementia: NOT a normal part of aging

What is dementia?



*A group of conditions that cause changes in memory, language, and problem solving.

*Dementia kills more people than breast and prostate cancer combined and is progressive.

*Alzheimer's is one type of dementia, accounting for 60-80% of all cases—other types include vascular dementia and Lewy body dementia, among others.

*You may notice changes in short-term memory, keeping track of bills, ability to prepare meals, keeping track of appointments, or traveling out of the neighborhood.

*Risk factors like age and genetics cannot be changed but some risk factors can—

- Eating a poor diet
- Not getting enough regular exercise
- Smoking and having excessive alcohol intake
- Being socially isolated
- Having chronically poor sleep
- Not treating hearing loss

*If you suspect you or someone you love has signs of dementia, it is best to get checked out.

Evaluation includes taking a history, doing a physical, and possibly lab tests or imaging

*There is no cure for dementia but there are several medications that may slow the progression of the disease.






