DID YOU KNOW....

that next Sunday we will be welcoming the Relics of the Mexican Martyr/Priests honored by the Knights of Columbus as part of their Nation-wide tour?

99 years ago, just south of the US-Mexico border, thousands of our brothers and sisters in the Lord - including very young ones - witnessed to their faith Christ with their lives and livelihoods. Following terrible decades of revolution and violence, the Mexican government unleashed ferocious persecutions of Catholic clergy and laity.

For three years (1926-1929), Mexican Catholics lived through violent persecution, in which priests and laypeople were ordered to renounce Christ in public. To refuse to do so meant facing not only punishment, but even torture and death. Thousands of Mexican Catholics gave heroic witness to the Faith. In many cases, they paid for it with their lives. It was not until 1929 that Mexican President Calles, through the intervention of the U.S. Ambassador Dwight Morrow, accepted the so-called agreements with the Mexican Bishops. The churches were permitted to reopen for Mass, and those known as Cristeros, who had fought to defend their rights, surrendered their weapons. However, the Mexican government did not honor the agreements and continued to persecute the Church in various degrees in the decades that followed. Many Mexican Catholics fled to the United States to escape the persecution. This period is particularly important for us Catholics in Arizona, as many of our sisters and brothers are descendants or relatives of those Catholics who suffered persecution and martyrdom. It was not until 1992, that the Constitution of Mexico was 'reformed' giving legal recognition to religious associations in Mexico - including the Catholic Church. Of the 25 Mexican Martyrs whom Pope St. John Paul II canonized in 2000, six were members of the Knights of Columbus.

The first time that we welcomed the Reliquary with the first-class Relics of the Priest/Knights to St. Andrew's was in 2006, a few weeks after the then 'new' church was consecrated! At that time we were gifted with the large print which graces the Gathering Room!

The Relics will be here for the Masses at 8:00, 10:00, and Noon, with a special prayer service at 11:15! Following the Noon (Spanish) Mass on Sunday, the Relics will be taken to St. Luke's Parish in Douglas, where a special prayer service and Rosary are scheduled. The following day they will next be taken to California!

Martyrdom is a constant reality in the life of the Catholic Church, as we are seeing violence against Christians today in Nigeria, Sudan, North Korea, Minneapolis. . . .

While hatred of the Faith is not welcomed, it is not unexpected. "Remember the word that I said to you. . . If they persecuted Me, they will persecute you too." (John 15:20)

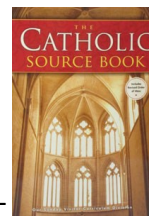
This week's Question: "How many of the 267 popes have been non-Italian?"

The answer to last week's Question:

"What is 'Apostolic Succession'?"

Apostolic Succession refers to the continuity of shepherding responsibility given by Christ to the Church leadership (John 20:23; Matthew 28:19); hence, the unbroken line of authority passing from the Apostle Peter to each of his legitimate successors. In the Catholic Church this empowers ("legitimizes") the sacramental ministry of a parish priest since he is ordained by a bishop who is consecrated by an unbroken line of bishops in communion with the successors of St. Peter. And so it is not simply a series of 'successors' in a certain office, it is also the succession (unbroken) of Apostolic Faith - hence the 'legitimacy' of Holy Orders in the Orthodox Churches.

REFLECT

There is perhaps no more beautiful celebration than when parents bring their newborn child to the waters of baptism. Parents, godparents, family, and friends share in this sacrament with incomparable joy. For in baptism, we share in Christ's death and resurrection, and through the outward signs of water and oil, are made *children of God* and given the hope of eternal life with Him.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, our sins are forgiven, death is overcome, and life is victorious. We are called to be signs of hope to all people, especially those whose goodness, value, and dignity are undermined. As members of the Body of Christ, we carry this hope with us as we continue Jesus' mission on earth.

Sadly, there is a devastating absence of hope today. We see this most profoundly in a sweeping disregard for human life in its most vulnerable forms and stages. Abortion and assisted suicide are products of hopelessness and despair. Yet even amid the increasing attacks on human life, we know that the "storms that buffet us will never prevail, for we are

firmly anchored in the hope born of grace, which enables us to live in Christ and to overcome sin, fear and death."¹

We have been entrusted with a message of hope for the woman who finds herself unexpectedly pregnant or for the man diagnosed with a terminal illness. At these challenging moments, we must bring God's presence, witnessing to His love, and inspiring a renewal of hope in those whose hearts are burdened. For "hope is born of love and based on the love springing from the pierced heart of Jesus upon the cross."² Confident of God's presence within us, may we share the Gospel of Life with those most in need of hope.

Dear Parishioners of Saint Andrew's Parish,

Warm greetings from the Church in Kyrgyzstan.

It has now been a month since I have returned from visiting your parish community. I returned filled with such strong impressions: Your vibrancy and prayerfulness are striking and I know that I am not the only one who experiences this in a powerful way when together with you. Thank you for this witness.

I am struck by what I experienced as, indeed, a true “missionary” spirit among many of you—perhaps not in the sense of a *foreign* mission but in a truly “catholic” mission—to each other, to people in the surrounding areas, and even to the “ends of the earth” as evidenced by your generosity to the local Church here in Kyrgyzstan during the visit. I came as a foreign mission to my home parish to meet and experience your missionary hearts and prayers.

With the first snow here having fallen last week, we recognize the inevitable change in seasons. We welcome autumn and those events in the life of the Church occurring these weeks: continued work with those who come to the Church; preparations to launch the new kindergarten and early childhood center—the first step in establishing Catholic education in this land; construction of the new church in the capital—the cathedral of the Good Shepherd; and, most essential, the ongoing life in Sacraments, prayer, community, and service to those in need. God is beyond good and it is privilege to live in this land in this time with these people. Thank you for sharing our faith on this journey.

I have continued to share with our tiny Catholic communities here in Central Asia about you. It is impossible to convey the hope our people experience as they learn about Catholic activity in other places such as St. Andrew's. These impressions will remain with me, along with profound gratitude. God bless you and your families abundantly. We count on your prayers—as we all meet in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, Who is Risen and Who is coming.

Dementia: NOT a normal part of aging

What is dementia?



*A group of conditions that cause changes in memory, language, and problem solving.

*Dementia kills more people than breast and prostate cancer combined and is progressive.

*Alzheimer's is one type of dementia, accounting for 60-80% of all cases—other types include vascular dementia and Lewy body dementia, among others.

*You may notice changes in short-term memory, keeping track of bills, ability to prepare meals, keeping track of appointments, or traveling out of the neighborhood.

*Risk factors like age and genetics cannot be changed but some risk factors can--

- Eating a poor diet
- Not getting enough regular exercise
- Smoking and having excessive alcohol intake
- Being socially isolated
- Having chronically poor sleep
- Not treating hearing loss

*If you suspect you or someone you love has signs of dementia, it is best to get checked out.
