

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is the Equestrian Order of the Most Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem?"

The answer to last week's Question: "**What is a 'Papal Bull'?**" It is a type of papal letter, so named from the Latin term *bulla* (seal), of wax or lead that was added to documents to certify its formal nature, that it was coming from the pope himself. From the Middle Ages until early modern times 'papal bull' was the name given to all papal letters and pronouncements, regardless of their purpose or nature. The modern terminology for an official letter from the pope is: an 'apostolic letter' or an 'apostolic brief', if it is of a less important or limited nature.

Vice President – assists the President in formulating and carrying out all programs; performs the functions of the President when the President is absent.


Secretary – compiles and keeps a permanent record of minutes.

St. Andrew the Apostle Parish Monthly Council Meeting January 20th, 2026

In Attendance: Linda Klein, Fr. Greg, Maryann Hockstad, Ann Dickson, Charlie Irwin, Deacon Lauro and Lupita Teran, Michelle Mitchell, Lorna Cook, Yvonne Ramey, Damian Rueda, and Kate Callender (recording)

Excused: Fran Cassidy, Thad Larson, Chuck Muscato, Linda Denno Linda K. called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in an opening prayer. There were no changes or corrections to the November minutes.

Finance (Kate): Income for December was \$254,953. This amount includes a large bequest from a former parishioner as well as a number of parishioners who make annual gifts during December. Donations from Good Shepherd Mission totaled \$2,808. Expenses were \$117,675. The average weekly offering for December was \$29,529. The Parish general fund level is \$828,002 and the Building Our Church fund balance is \$32,887.

All Saints School (Damien): The School will have a table in the gathering space in the coming weeks to highlight Catholic Schools Week and encourage both enrollment and educate parishioners about tuition assistance programs. The School accreditation team will be on-site during February. Enrollment remains steady at 80 students. A virtual tour of the school is now available on the website. Principal Carmen will be retiring at the end of this school year.

Youth Ministry News (Yvonne): Deacon Carlos Nagore visited and made a presentation to the Youth last month. A number of Life Teen Students participated in the March for Life last weekend. 67 Confirmation students will participate in the Confirmation Retreat at La Purisima retreat center next month.

Faith-Based Nursing (Lorna): Over 100 people participated in the Walk to Bethlehem last month. The nurses also purchased kits for treatment of choking victims. Over 20 people have participated in the new exercise classes being offered.

St. Vincent de Paul Society (Pauline): Pauline recently attended a meeting with over 40 Presidents of other Conferences in the Tucson area. The Thrift Store is looking for furniture donations. There are three free tax preparation centers open in the Community. The Thrift Store sales were good in December.

Pipe Organ and Music News (Michelle): The first concert for the year is being planned for April. Mr. Honti's concert in January was a great success and extremely well-received.

Hispanic Ministries (Lupita): The Hispanic Epiphany celebration was well attended. Deacon Lauro continues to accompany Fr. Greg to celebrate Mass at the area prisons.

Nursing Scholarship (Ann): The Parish continues to support the Nursing Scholarship program in Bethlehem.

Community Events/Annual Catholic Appeal (Maryann): Kino Hall schedule continues to be packed with Community activities. Maryann reports that the new tiny house community has been dedicated. Catholic Community Services is seeking donations of furnishings for the units. The Annual Catholic Appeal annual lunch and dinner will take place on February 7th in the Columbian Hall. Parishioners are asked to RSVP for the event to assist the caterers in preparing the correct amount of food.

Building and Grounds (Maryann): Val Robles continues to volunteer many hours dedicated to keeping the grounds beautiful. He has now been invited to join the Committee for their regular meetings. Kino Hall is in need of new chairs so it was m/s/c to purchase 72 new folding chairs for an amount not to exceed \$3,500.

Pastor Report: The Parish will assist the Knights of Columbus in costs associated with the Catholic Appeal dinner. Fr. reiterated his deep gratitude to all Council members for their ministry: the Parish Nurses, the Fredericks family for their recent generosity in assisting a pair of homeless ladies, Maryann Hockstad who labors tirelessly to manage Kino Hall and the Community Events scheduled as well as agreeing to serve another 3-year term as Board Treasurer, Damian Rueda for his work at All Saints School, Michelle for her work with the organ committee and other ministries, Yvonne who is part of the team that keeps our Youth engaged, the Hispanic Ministries that conduct raffles and donate to so many in need throughout the area, Lupita for her service as his Secretary, the office staff and business manager for seamlessly taking care of the day-to-day operations of the Parish, the Council members that examine the Parish financial reports and ensure Parish fiscal responsibility, Ann for her liaison with the Catholic Foundation.

Linda K adjourned the meeting at 7:02 p.m. and Fr. Greg led the group in a closing prayer.

REFLECT

The month of February has traditionally been dedicated to the Holy Family who provide for us a model of marriage and family life. Mary and Joseph perfectly witness to the gift of new life, welcoming the infant Jesus amidst difficult and challenging circumstances. God designed the love of husband and wife to be so complete, so ordered to a lifetime of communion with Himself and each other, that it is open to creating a new human being whom they will love and care for together. Part of God's gift to husband and wife is cooperation with His creative power. In participating in this "great mystery" of love that is total, faithful, and fruitful, married couples become a sign of the love between Christ and his Church (Eph 5:32). Couples who cannot bear children still share in this cooperation. As St. John Paul II affirmed to such couples, "you are no less loved by God; your love for each other is complete and fruitful when it is open to others."

While a couple does not need to seek to have a child in every act of intercourse, they should never act to reject the life-giving power granted by God through the use of contraception. In deliberately acting to

suppress their fertility couples harm their unity. For serious reasons, couples may choose to avoid pregnancy for a time or indefinitely. Natural Family Planning (NFP) can help married couples identify and utilize the naturally infertile times in a woman's cycle, all while cooperating with God's design.

In today's culture, living out God's plan for married love and opening our hearts to the gift of children can be difficult. It can often require great generosity and trust in the Lord. But as Christ repeatedly exhorted, "Be not afraid!" The Church's teaching on married love is an invitation to let God transform our hearts, knowing God's plan is far richer than anything the world can offer us.


