DID YOU KNOW....

that Lent begins this coming Wednesday? (See the bulletin for Mass times!)

With Lent comes a number of opportunities to strengthen ourselves spiritually and to deepen our relationship with the Lord. It was St. Francis de Sales (1567-1622) who wrote: "Lent is the Autumn of the spiritual life, during which we gather the fruit to keep us fed for the rest of the year!" In fact, time set apart for spiritual reading is one of the best ways to strengthen our Faith walk. Visiting our Parish Library and choosing some Lenten reading will reward your efforts many times over! Making certain that you carve out a few minutes from your very busy day to simply sit quietly in a prayerful attitude of awareness, will, in fact, make your day much more manageable and focused! Less television and internet – more prayer!

Following our Lord on the "Way of the Cross", either as a personal act of devotion, or with the community on Friday afternoons (5:30 – English, 6:00 – Spanish) is, in Pope Benedict's words, a 'school for spiritual life' - in itself!

Preparing for a good Sacramental Confession, is very important at any time, but especially in Lent. A 'Celebration of Reconciliation' is being planned for Monday, 23 March, and Communal Penance Services are being scheduled for our neighboring Parishes, and will be announced, in plenty of time for prayerful preparation for your personal Encounter with Divine Mercy!

One of the greatest resources for personal spiritual growth, apart from the Mass itself, is time spent in *Adoration* – simply 'being present to the Presence'. Our *Divine Mercy Chapel* is open 24/7 and time spent in the Eucharistic Presence 'radiates' the soul in ways beyond description. The *Divine Mercy Chaplet* is a powerful prayer at all times, but perhaps especially in Lent: "For the sake of His sorrowful Passion. . ."

The Lenten Fast can become a graced opportunity to simplify our lives from much of the 'clutter' that accumulates from our seemingly insatiable 'wants' and from the inertia that often keeps us from growing and maturing. More than just "fish on Fridays" or 'giving up candy', the Lenten Fast invites us to find better, more simplified, healthier, patterns for daily living.

The Lenten emphasis on Almsgiving invites us to live with greater generosity, in every area of our lives. "The opposite of abundance is not scarcity, it is anxiety." Leaning to live out of the abundance of God's goodness to us, in so many ways, 'spills over' in generosity – itself an imitation of God!

Responding to our *Annual Catholic Appeal* is, in fact, a wonderful way to "give alms"!

Please consider Lent as the "Autumn of the spiritual life". It is a graced opportunity to begin living your Faith walk with greater awareness, greater joy, greater gratitude, and greater generosity – the "essence" of true discipleship!

NOTE that the ASH WEDNESDAY Evening Mass at St. Andrew's will be 6:00 PM this year!

CATHOLIC QUIZ: This week's Question: "What is meant by 'Tu Es Petrus'?"

The answer to last week's Question: "What is the Equestrian Order of the Most Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem?" Founded in 1099, soon after the fall of Jerusalem to the Crusader armies, the Order was intended to protect the Holy City. From this beginning, the Knights came to defend the Holy Land, to care for pilgrims traveling to the Holy Land, and to give assistance to the sick. The Knights were forced to leave Jerusalem after its capture by the Muslims in 1187, but the Order survived and was twice re-organized as a Papal Order, first by Pope Pius IX (1846-1878), and again by Pope Leo XIII (1878-1903). It was Pope Leo who opened its membership to women, and today all five grades of knighthood are granted to the Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre. In the modern Church, the Order is one of the most prestigious of all organizations in the Universal Church, under the protection of the Holy See, with its official headquarters in the Vatican.

The chief "work" of the Order today is the support of the Latin Patriarchate (the Roman Catholic Church in the Holy Lands) and many institutions of learning and charity throughout the Near East – including the University of Bethlehem – the only Catholic University in the Near East!

The Order (abbreviated as "EOHSJ") is the mainstay of Catholic Christians in the Holy Lands and supports schools, seminaries, clinics and institutions of charity in this very troubled area.

The distinctive ceremonial garb is the white cape and hat (for men) and the black cape and mantilla (for women), decorated on the left breast with "Jerusalem Cross".

Membership is bestowed through the recommendation of the Diocesan Bishop upon lay people and priests in recognition of significant or devoted service to the Church.

The Knights and Ladies of the Holy Sepulchre of Jerusalem participate in Diocesan ceremonies, and, here at St. Andrew's, assist with the Stations of the Cross on Fridays in Lent and the Annual Collection for the Holy Land on Good Friday.

LENTEN DISCIPLINES OF FASTING & ABSTINENCE

Catholics in good health ages 18 to 59 are required to fast and to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Fasting consists of eating only one meal, with the possibility of two smaller snacks that do not add up to a single full meal.

Catholics age 14 and older are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent.

February is Health Month



***Heart Disease is the leading cause of death in the United States**

***How can we lower our risk of heart disease?**

Eat healthy

- aim for a rainbow plate with different colored fruits and veggies, whole grains, and lean proteins
- Limit salty foods and processed foods
- Drink plenty of water, especially in our dry air

Maintain a healthy blood pressure

- Manage your stress
- Try activities like deep breathing, meditation, and other activities you find relaxing

Stay active

- Aim for 150 minutes of physical activity in a week. This can be done in chunks and does not have to be done all at once (for example, you can do 3-10 minute walks a day instead of a 30 minute walk)
- Find an activity you enjoy—be it walking, biking, swimming or something else (you are more likely to stick with exercising if you find something you enjoy doing)
- Sit less, take stairs when given the option and park farther away from the store to get more steps in

Sleep

- aim for 7-9 hours a night
- Go to bed the same time, and wake up the same time each morning
- Try to avoid exercising within 2 hours of bedtime
- Avoid caffeine and alcohol before bedtime

Our volunteer members – known as Vincentians – are women and men who are compelled by our Catholic Christian faith to serve those who are needy and suffering.



- 4) **Get involved** – Attend a Lenten lecture or spiritual program.
- 5) **Volunteer at your parish** – Whether it's the parish fish fry, cleaning the church or helping with the food drive, it will give you a chance to help others.
- 6) **Reach out** – Invite an inactive Catholic to come with you to receive ashes on Ash Wednesday, or come to Stations of the Cross, Confession or Mass with you anytime during Lent.
- 7) **Pray** – Especially for people you don't like and for people who don't like you.
- 8) **Tune out** – Turn off the television and spend quality time talking with family members or friends.
- 9) **Clean out closets** – Donate gently used items to the St. Vincent de Paul Society.
- 10) **Donate** – Pick a Catholic mission and decide how you can help by sending money, clothing or supplies.

Please know my deepest gratitude and that of Elizabeth Bollinger, CEO of the Catholic Foundation and her staff for your generosity, spreading love throughout the community.




