RELIGION

LEVEL 1

STANDARD 1: CREED - Students will demonstrate understanding of core Catholic beliefs.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Identify the Trinity by name.
- 2. Explain that God is our Father and Creator.
- 3. Be able to tell how God shows love for us.
- 4. Explain that Jesus is the Son of God and identify ways that He shows us how to live.
- 5. Explain that the Holy Spirit is our Helper and identify ways that the Spirit guides our lives.
- 6. Understand that Jesus gave us the Church

STANDARD 2: WORSHIP AND SACRAMENTS - Students will demonstrate understanding and practice of Catholic worship and sacraments with an emphasis on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of Catholics.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that the Church celebrates all year.
- 2. Understand that the Church celebrates sacraments.
- 3. Understand the Mass as Word and sacrament.
- 4. Celebrate Mass at least once a month.

STANDARD 3: MORALITY - Students will understand right from wrong and be able to make good moral choices in life decisions that are consistent with Church teachings and a Christian life style.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Explain the difference between right and wrong.
- 2. Explain why they made a particular choice and the consequences of that choice..
- 3. Explain the difference between a sin, an accident, and a mistake.
- 4. Demonstrate how to express sorrow and acceptance of responsibility.
- 5. Understand that God will forgive them.
- 6. Understand how to forgive one another.
- 7. Understand the two great commandments: Love God and love others as yourself.
- 8. Participate in character education program in the school.

STANDARD 4: SOCIAL JUSTICE - Students will demonstrate understanding of Catholic social teaching and apply these principles to social and personal situations.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Demonstrate respect for all creation.
- 2. Demonstrate the dignity of the human person in work and play.
- 3. Explain how families are a sign of God's love.
- 4. Explain how families teach us about Jesus.
- 5. Appreciate the diverse roles of members in a community.
- 6. Actively participate as members of a community.
- 7. Understand the relationship between actions and consequences.

STANDARD 5: CORE SCRIPTURE - Students will read, interpret and apply Scripture to their own daily life situation.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand the call to follow Jesus.
- 2. Retell stories from the Christian Scriptures (New Testament): Jesus' birth, Jesus' miracles, Jesus' death and resurrection.
- 3. Become familiar with some stories from Hebrew Scripture (Old Testament): Creation, Noah, David, Moses, Abraham, etc.
- 4. Reverence of the Bible as a special holy book, the Word of God.
- 5. Continue to introduce and be familiar with Scripture verses appropriate to the curriculum.

STANDARD 6: FAMILY LIFE - Students will demonstrate their understanding of Christian family life and how it is nourished and passed on.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Explain how families work, love, care, share and have fun together.
- 2. Understand that God makes and loves all people as they are.
- 3. Understand that God gave everyone life and a loving heart.
- 4. Understand that the body is a gift from God and should be kept healthy and safe.
- 5. Understand that Love grows when it is shared.
- 6. Understand that boys' and girls' bodies are different.
- 7. Understand that people learn to show love and to forgive when things go wrong.
- 8. Understand that people belong to many groups that are like families.
- 9. Understand that God wants people to care for one another.
- 10. Understand the needs and wants of being a family.

STANDARD 7: LITURGICAL YEAR - Students will demonstrate their understanding of the Liturgical year and how it is celebrated.

OBJECTIVES:

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1. Understand seasons of Advent and Christmas and how they are celebrated.

- 2. Understand seasons of Lent, Holy Week and Easter and how they are celebrated.
- 3. Understand ordinary time and the liturgical colors.
- 4. Introduce parts of the church and liturgical vessels.

STANDARD 8: CHRISTIAN PRAYER AND PRACTICE - Students will be able to demonstrate, understand, use and identify traditional prayer forms in the Catholic tradition.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Refer to "Continuum of Prayers Taught" especially emphasizing the rosary and the stations of the cross as prayers.
- 2. Experience a variety of prayer forms including: silence, listening, song, gesture, spontaneous petitions and prayers of thanksgiving.

STANDARD 9: VOCABULARY - Students will be able to demonstrate understanding and use of religious vocabulary.

Refer to "Vocabulary to be Taught" and the Glossary at this level.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that God made each of us special.
- 2. Understand that each one is gifted with many talents.
- 3. Know and understand that there are people who reach out to help others. (mothers and fathers, priests, sisters, brothers, deacons, single adults)
- 4. Understand that God calls each of us to love one another and care for those who need help.

STANDARD 11: SERVICE - Students will engage in service to the community (family, parish, local, national, and global) by action and reflection on our response to the Gospel call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand their responsibility to help the members of their family.
- 2. Understand the importance of helping other students.
- 3. Understand that Jesus asks them to help others.

STANDARD 12: SAINTS – Students will explore the lives of the saints in order to expand their role models for Christian living.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Celebrate and understand feasts of Mary, especially Mary, our mother.
- 2. Celebrate and understand the feasts of Our Lord especially Christmas and Easter

- Celebrate and understand the life and feast of canonized saints: Joseph (3/19, 5/1) Joachim and Anne (7/26) Patrick (3/17)
 Celebrate and understand the life and feast of canonized saints: Gabriel (10/29) Francis of Assisi (10/4)
- 4. Celebrate and understand the life of modern day saints: Our parents and grandparents

STANDARD 13: CHURCH HISTORY - Students will explore the development and history of the Roman Catholic Church.

- 1. Introduce church leaders and structure of the Church from Jesus, Pope, Bishops, and priests/pastors.
- 2. Understand what the Church is and who founded it.
- 3. Know that Peter is the first pope.

STANDARD 14: STEWARDSHIP – Students will demonstrate an understanding of Catholic stewardship and apply the knowledge by sharing their time, talent and treasure.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Introduce the concept of the parable
- 2. Reiterate the three legs of stewardship: sharing time, talent and treasure
- 3. Demonstrate an understanding of the great commandment in relation to stewardship
- 4. Show an understanding of the responsibility to develop their gifts
- 5. Demonstrate an understanding of service.
