RELIGION

LEVEL 5

STANDARD 1: CREED - Students will demonstrate understanding of core Catholic beliefs.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Continue to develop reflection on the mystery of God's revelation and the Trinity as revealed through the life of Jesus, Scripture and the creed.
- 2. Continue to explore the experience of Jesus as both human and divine.
- 3. Continue to reflect on the passion and death, resurrection and ascension of Jesus.
- 4. Continue to reflect on the Holy Spirit works, charisms and gifts.
- 5. Continue to explore the Church Body of Christ, the Communion of Saints, Marks of the Church.
- 6. Identify beliefs about death and judgment, heaven, hell and purgatory.

STANDARD 2: WORSHIP AND SACRAMENTS - Students will demonstrate understanding and practice of Catholic worship and sacraments with an emphasis on the centrality of the Eucharist in the life of Catholics.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand and celebrate the liturgical year in meaningful ways.
- 2. Understand and celebrate the "Sabbath."
- 3. Understand and explain the sacraments of initiation: Baptism, Eucharist, Confirmation.
- 4. Understand and explain the sacraments of healing: Reconciliation and Anointing of the Sick
- 5. Understand and explain the sacraments of service: Matrimony and Holy Orders.
- 6. Identify and understand parts of the Mass and all prayers and responses.

STANDARD 3: MORALITY - Students will understand right from wrong and be able to make good moral choices in life decisions that are consistent with Church teachings and a Christian life style.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Identify moral virtues.
- 2. Understand both the privilege and the duty of attending Mass.
- 3. Explain free will.
- 4. Define sin.
- 5. Understand the relationship between action and consequence.
- 6. Explain how the Ten Commandments can be a moral guide.

7. Understand how to live a Christian life in our secular world; discriminate the use of media in our lives and seek guidance from the gifts/fruits of the Holy Spirit.

STANDARD 4: SOCIAL JUSTICE - Students will demonstrate understanding of Catholic social teaching and apply these principles to social and personal situations.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Demonstrate respect for all creation.
- 2. Understand that everything is created in the image of God.
- 3. Appreciate the diverse roles of members in a community.
- 4. Actively participate as members of a community.
- 5. Understand the relationship between actions and consequences.
- 6. Demonstrate the Corporal Works and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

STANDARD 5: CORE SCRIPTURE -: Students will read, interpret and apply Scripture to their own daily life situation.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Retell and understand the major events in the Life of Jesus Christ.
- 2. Retell and understand the healing miracles.
- 3. Reverence the Bible as the Word of God, a special holy book.
- 4. Know sections of the Bible and begin to know which books are in each section.
- 5. Memorize short Scripture passages that relate to what is being learned.
- 6. Continue to learn how to find Scripture passages.

STANDARD 6: FAMILY LIFE - Students will demonstrate their understanding of Christian family life and how it is nourished and passed on.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand that healthy, happy families share positive attitudes and values.
- 2. Demonstrate honest, respectful communication with all people.
- 3. Understand that during puberty, physical, emotional, and spiritual health are very important. During puberty, girls' and boys' reproductive systems mature.
- 4. Understand that friendships help people grow in love. Sexuality is a gift from God.
- 5. Understand that sexual intercourse is the way married people show love and welcome new life.
- 6. Understand that the sacrament of Marriage involves lifelong commitment, God's love and procreation.

STANDARD 7: LITURGICAL YEAR - Students will demonstrate their understanding of the Liturgical year and how it is celebrated.

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OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand seasons of Advent and Christmas and how they are celebrated.
- 2. Understand seasons of Lent, Holy Week and Easter and how they are celebrated.
- 3 Understand Pentecost and season of ordinary time
- 4. Plan and participate in simple prayer services for the liturgical seasons.

STANDARD 8: CHRISTIAN PRAYER AND PRACTICE - Students will be able to demonstrate, understand, use and identify traditional prayer forms in the Catholic tradition.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Experience and identify prayer forms of thanksgiving, praise, forgiveness and petition.
- 2. Experience and understand individual and communal prayer.
- 3. Know Jesus as our model of prayer.
- 4. Understand the meaning of the command to "Pray always."
- 5. Understands and uses prayers taught on list in "Continuum of Prayers Taught."

STANDARD 9: VOCABULARY - Students will be able to demonstrate understanding and use of religious vocabulary.

OBJECTIVES:

Refer to "Vocabulary to be Taught" and the Glossary.

STANDARD 10: VOCATION - LIFE STYLES - Students will demonstrate their understanding of different vocations and life styles to prepare them to respond to their own call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Understand our individual gifts and share them with others.
- 2. Identify the needs of the community and reach out to others.
- 3. Identify the needs of the world and ways we can help.
- 4. Understand that people may serve God by using their gifts properly and acting according to their life's calling.
- 5. Identify and describe those who have service jobs in our community: health care providers, police, fire department, teachers, priests and ministers, etc.
- 6. Understand the special ministry of clergy and religious and the different ways to serve the Church.

- 7. Understand that each of us is called by God to a special vocation in life.
- 8. Know and understand the parish ministries available in their parish.

STANDARD 11: SERVICE - Students will engage in service to the community (family, parish, local, national, and global) by action and reflection on our response to the Gospel call.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Students understand that we are all united in Christ and the need to care for all God's people.
- 2. Students can explain the Corporal Works of Mercy.
- 3. Students explain how the Corporal Works of Mercy can be put into action.
- 4. Students actively participate in service projects.

STANDARD 12: SAINTS - Students will explore the lives of the saints in order to expand their role models for Christian living.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Celebrate and understands feasts of Mary especially, Immaculate Conception (12/8).
- 2. Celebrate and understands the feasts of Our Lord especially the Baptism of Jesus and Presentation of the Lord.
- 3. Celebrate and understand the life and feast of canonized saints:
 - Matthew (9/21)
 Mark (4/25)

 Luke (10/18)

4. Celebrate and understand the life of modern day saints: Mother Teresa Jean Donavan and the El Savador martyrs

STANDARD 13: CHURCH HISTORY – Students will understand and explore the development and history of the Church.

OBJECTIVES:

- 1. Learn the history of the persecuted Church throughout history.
- 2. Learn the structure of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops.
- 3. Study some of the recent writings from the Pope and U.S. Bishops.

STANDARD 14: STEWARDSHIP – Students will demonstrate an understanding of Catholic stewardship and apply the knowledge by sharing their time, talent and treasure.

OBJECTIVES

- 1. We worship God by praying and through service
- 2. As members of the Church, God calls us to be a disciple, follow Jesus no matter what the cost

- 3. Stewardship shapes the way we live our lives
- 4. We must protect and preserve the environment
- 5. Work is a fulfilling human vocation
- 6. We work together in our own redemption and the redemption of others
- 7. Those who follow Christ must base their decision on standards given to us by God: the commandments, beatitudes and all Jesus teaches through the Church.
- 8. The Spirit show us the way to be good stewards of the gifts we possess.
