RITE OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION OF ADULTS CURRICULUM AND RESOURCES

Because the RCIA is not a nine-month academic program but a process "suited to a spiritual journey of adults that varies according to the many forms of God's grace, the free cooperation of the individuals, the action of the Church, and the circumstances of time and place" (RCIA no. 5), there is not a list of approved textbooks.

The Rite calls for the each individual to receive comprehensive catechesis on Catholic doctrine and moral life, as well as suitable pastoral formation. While providing guidance aimed at forming them in the Christian Life that should extend at least a full liturgical year.

Does the Office of Worship recommend a particular curriculum or textbook for use in the parish RCIA process? Because the emphasis should be on forming the individual and not the group, a variety of resources should be used.

From the National Directory on Catechesis, these areas can be explored in the course of ONE full year and can be discussed in context of the Sunday scriptures and the liturgical year.

- Mystery of the One God (The Trinity)
- The Mystery of Salvation
- Jesus the Christ
- The Kingdom of God
- Creation (Original Sin, Incarnation, and Grace)
- The Holy Spirit
- The Church (Sacrament of the Risen Christ)
- The Seven Sacraments (Graced Encounters with the risen Christ)
- Morality and Social Justice (Sin, Freedom, Vulnerability, Grace, Love, Forgiveness)
- Mary and the Saints
- Eschatology (death, judgment, and the final destiny of the soul and of humankind)
- The nature, rites, and symbols of the liturgy

The one required text for Parish Initiation Ministers is the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, Study Edition.
