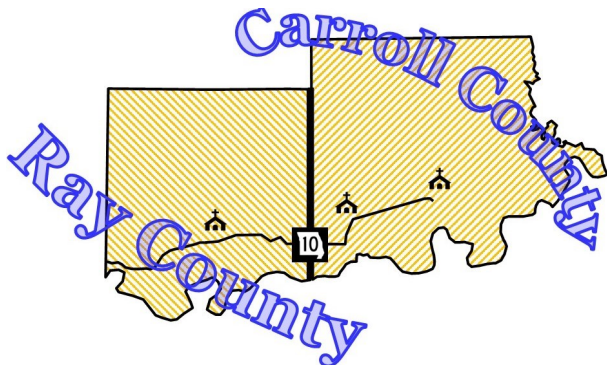

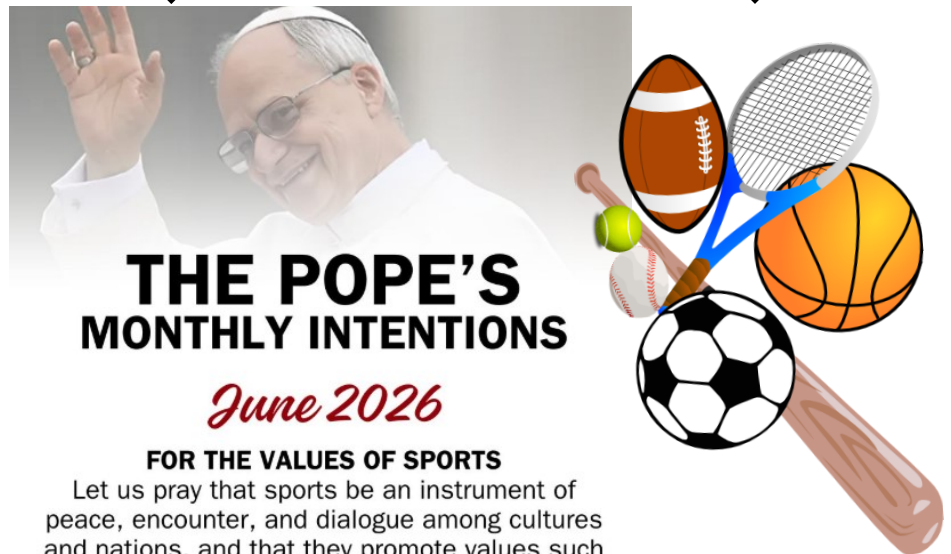

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, also known as the Feast of *Corpus Christi*, is our celebration of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist—and thus a sacred reminder that, in *every* Mass, Jesus' *one* sacrifice on Calvary is sacramentally made present and offered anew for

“the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit” (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, ¶ 1366). Jesus is truly present body, blood, soul, and divinity in the Eucharist. Read more online:

Join Us in Prayer-Novena to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

The United States celebrates the 250th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th. In preparation, the Bishops of the United States (the USCCB) are consecrating the United States to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. The USCCB invites all of us to pray a Novena to the Sacred Heart starting on Wednesday, June 3rd and completing on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart, June 12th. We will include special prayers for the Consecration at the special Sacred Heart Mass at Sacred Heart, Norborne on Friday, June 12th. We are continuing the celebration we started last year of gathering for the Patronal Feast of Sacred Heart Mission with a Mass at 5:00 *pm* followed by a pot-luck dinner. The Altar Society will be furnishing meat and drinks.

Let us celebrate the “Sacred Heart” of our Lord which the parish in Norborne has been named after.

Please note that we will be praying the Votive prayer each day there is Mass after the dismissal and, on Sundays, before the Recessional Hymn.

Immaculate Heart of Mary

The Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is celebrated on the “Friday after the Second Sunday after Pentecost” (cf. *The Roman Missal*). The Memorial of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary is celebrated the following day. This celebration recognizes that God “prepared a fit dwelling place for the Holy Spirit in the Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary,” and so this Memorial gives as an opportunity to ask Our Lady that through “her intercession we may be a worthy temple of” God's glory (cf. Collect of the Mass).



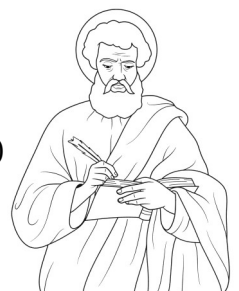
Images of the Immaculate Heart usually include a sword through the heart. This recalls the prophesy of the holy man Simeon at the Temple to the Blessed Mother that “you yourself a sword will pierce so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed” (Luke 2:34). This prophesy came to pass at Calvary (John 19:25 *ff*).

Even though we are not celebrating this Memorial liturgically in our churches, we should recognize in our individual prayers this coming Saturday, June 13th, the importance of Our Lady's Immaculate Heart.

Saint Barnabas the Apostle

June 11th is the Memorial of Saint Barnabas the Apostle. St. Barnabas, a cousin of Saint Mark, introduced Saint Paul to Saint Peter and the other Apostles. St. Barnabas was a traveling and preaching partner of Saint Paul. Scripture (especially in the Acts

of the Apostles) describes Saints Barnabas and Paul, being sent to preach the Good News to the gentiles.
