Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Last week, I preached about the common mistake people make of thinking of virtue as being some kind of quality that people just "have". Someone might think that their friend Maria is a generous person, and wish they were more like her. However, if we mistakenly think that virtue is more or less a fixed attribute (like our adult height, for example), then we would be less likely to think that following Maria's example would be helpful in being more generous like her. This



is a dangerous mistake, for we are called by Jesus the Good Shepherd to be guided on the path of virtue, a path we walk, a path we can make progress in holiness and virtue, as His pilgrim people.

So, with the practice of the moral, rational virtues, we grow in those virtues to become a virtuous person. You become what you do. (Sometimes we say, "you are what you eat!") If you want to be a more generous person (like Maria), then practice generosity until it becomes "second nature". So, we have an obvious goal to work with these natural virtues and an understanding of how to get there, for all Christians are called to be virtuous.

Consider which ones you may struggle with and be intentional about their practice. Consider what kind of person you are called to be and practice it: Honest? Fair? Trustworthy? Patient? Dedicated? Chaste? Generous? Selfless? Quick to forgive? (Just to name a few!) Take to prayer, asking the Lord to direct you to a couple of virtues that you lack, but also ask the Lord to point out a couple of virtues that feel natural to you. Then, put them into practice.

Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (March 5th), maybe consider a way to fast/abstain from something specific to the virtues you seek or seek to strengthen. As there are natural virtues, there are also supernatural virtues called the theological virtues: faith, hope, and charity (love-in-action). These are infused in us by God!

Through the practice of natural virtues, we may become more receptive to the theological virtues, but ultimately, they come from our Heavenly Father. We don't develop faith, hope, and charity on our own, so we must turn to the sacraments (especially the Eucharist and Reconciliation) and to personal prayer. God pours them upon us in abundance.

I'm thinking about this as we had interviews for our Confirmation candidates. Celebrating the sacrament of confirmation says "yes" to the relationship the Lord entered into with us at our baptism, to be open to His grace. Pray for our Confirmation candidates, that they grow in holiness and express it outwardly through natural and supernatural virtues.
