

Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Well, Lent has begun! The general theme of which is, a desert time of preparation for the Paschal Mystery. A marked time of extra prayer, fasting and almsgiving. I say, "marked time" as Lent should be a noticeable time in you day-to-day life, noticeable to you and perhaps even to others.



However, if what we offer as extra practices are not noticeable, especially to ourselves in the dayto-day, then perhaps we're not doing enough! Now, Jesus is very

clear about the sin of doing things just to be recognized for them, especially if it is about self-promotion rather than giving glory and honor to God. However, that can't be an excuse to make such minimal effort that it isn't even recognizable! I'm thinking about this as Jesus concludes his Sermon on the Plain in last week's Gospel with the theme of hypocrisy. It is not necessarily hypocrisy to strive for conversion and an invitation to holiness simply because it takes *public* shape. I will offer two examples from the parish:

First, parish leadership has wants to make a public statement about how selfless this parish community can be. Only being a part of this parish for two months, I have witnessed for myself the vibrancy and faith of so many here! Prior to my arrival (alas, I cannot take any credit for this), an idea to share it with the greater community at large. So, in honor of our 25th Anniversary, much of the effort is *other*-centered. We offered a quite successful "provide 25 goods" to Metro Catholic Outreach. Also, look for the announcement (in this bulletin) for our 2500+ hours initiative that we're introducing!

The second example is subtle, but significant. We have adopted a branding style, new logo, and style that is just now being implemented. This is very common among churches as an expression of communal identity. This is extra helpful among different "St. Mary" churches close to each other for example, as the logo, text and colors become a symbol of our parish family. It will serve to invite others to our parish as it becomes more recognizable. The colors and the shape are adaptations from the crest of St. John XXIII, and incorporate our own local themes.

May your personal Lenten practices bear fruit for you personally, but also serve to build up the Kingdom of God!
