

Brothers and Sisters in Christ!

Continued blessings on your Lenten experience. I pray that this is a time set apart to enter into a spiritual desert, one of extra (noticeably so!) silence, solitude, and conversion. The Gospel this weekend is Saint Luke's account of the Transfiguration (Lk 9:28-36). Jesus brings Peter, James, and John up the mountain and they experience a powerful expression of His divinity, including a change of appearance as dazzling light, engagement with the great prophets, culminating in the voice of God, "This is my chosen Son, listen to him." The three disciples, although they were of the closest, inner circle to the Lord and have often experienced the miraculous firsthand, are still stunned into silence and told no one of their experience at the time.

In recent homilies, I've been beating the drum for the need for silence in our lives, if you'll pardon the irony. How are we to listen to the chosen Son of God, if we are distracted by the too-manythings of the world? The too-many-things isn't necessarily the imprudent, frazzled pace that we stupidly demand of ourselves. It can be good or even the best of holy things.



Consider Peter's exuberance at the experience of the Transfiguration. As the Lord is demonstrating his pure holiness, Peter understandably wishes to, what, help? To cling to the experience?

To have some influence on the event? He offers his idea of building three tents, but does not even know what he is saying!

Listen to Jesus, we are told. If you take seriously the invitation of the Lenten season to experience extra silence, solitude, and



conversion, it is quite possible (probable?!) that you have a direct, incomprehensible experience of God and His love for you. It may come as a call to conversion from a particular sin. It may come as a great consolation of his peace. You may recognize that the experience of prayer produces in you fruits of the Holy Spirit: charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control or chastity.

As wonderful as this might seem, it might be unsettling! Even Jesus' closest disciples were frightened. In the last few weeks, I've encountered several people who have had a powerful, prayerful experience, and then second-guess it. You can trust the Holy Spirit directed such an experience when it produces fruit of the Spirit. You might not even know what to do with such an experience - well, neither did the disciples. It may take time before you do, so don't rush to build tents.

Make time for the Lord this Lent, and when He speaks to you, listen.


mation or to purchase tickets, scan the QR code. Concessions and *meal* tickets must be made by March 26th.
