At the realization of his healing, the man in today's gospel turned around, perhaps not only physically but interiorly as well. When he lets gratitude for all God has given him consume him, he turns around from any other cancers that eat at his spirit. Jesus affirms that this kind of faith, rooted in thankfulness, is the healing, saving power (the Greek verb *sozein* connotes both "heal" and "save) that enables him to go forward as a changed person, both in body and spirit.

Dear Brothers and Sisters.

On Thursday, October 16th we will have an Anointing Mass at 10:30am at St. Boniface. Confessions for those being anointed will begin at 10:30am. This provides us another opportunity to understand more about this wonderful Sacrament. For many years, the prevailing title of this Sacrament has been called the "Last Rites", and while this Sacrament is often administered when a person is close to death, it can also be given to those who are experiencing serious illness, are elderly, or are about to go under general anesthesia before surgery.

Receiving the sacrament will give them spiritual healing, increased faith, peace, and the strength needed to endure suffering. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that: "By the grace of the sacrament the sick person receives the strength and the gift of uniting himself more closely to Christ's Passion: in a certain way he is *consecrated* to bear fruit by configuration to the Savior's redemptive Passion" (CCC 1521). Just as the members of the Church are praying for the sick person, they are helping others through their suffering. "By celebrating the sacrament the Church, in the communion of saints, intercedes for the benefit of the sick person, and he, for his part, through the grace of this Sacrament, contributes to the sanctification of the Church and to the good of all men for whom the Church suffers and offers herself, through Christ to God the Father" (CCC 1522).

So one of the fruits of the anointing, in addition to praying for healing, is to consecrate our sufferings and illnesses to God, offering them up as a prayer to God on our own behalf, on behalf of our family and friends, and for the entire Church and world.

Because of the close connection to forgiveness of sins, those who are seeking the Anointing of

the Sick are also strongly encouraged to go to Confession to continue to prepare their souls for whatever may come. Often, in individual anointings, the priest encourages use of the beautiful Sacrament of Confession. Because of this, we will offer Confession both 30 minutes before and after the Anointing Mass that is coming this week. I hope those coming for Anointing will be able to take advantage of this opportunity to also receive the healing mercy of God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Please continue to keep our sick and elderly in our prayers!

Please signup for the Anointing Mass by Mon, Oct 13 so organizers can plan enough food for the luncheon following Mass.

# OCTOBER Rest, Recreation and Prayer

"On the seventh day God completed the work he had been doing; he rested on the seventh day from all the work he had undertaken." Genesis 2:2

We are called to rest on Sunday as the Lord rested It isn't an ideness or simply a time for entertainment but rather a restorative experience of reveling in the fullness of what has been and gratitude for God's providence — a time to take delight in the gift of life.

### SAMPLE ACTIVITIES FOR OCTOBER:

- · Refrain from house projects and tasks centered around productivity.
- Choose activities focused on recreation, leisure, and rest (such as reading a book, listening to music, doing a crossword puzzle, going for a long walk, playing a game, or playing outdoors together).
- · Build community by inviting another family over or by visiting a friend or relative.
- Kids love traditions and they are great for building family identity. Create a Sunday
  tradition such as brunch after Mass or flowers and candles with dinner. Or, on the
  flip side, adopt a quiet, simple dinner. In the month dedicated to the Holy Rosary,
  a Sunday family rosary could be in your living room, but also could be prayed on a
  walk, around a campfire, or in the car on the way back from visiting that relative.
- · Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App.


