Theme: For Faithful People Life is Changed, Not Ended

Nothing is more sure than that all of us are born to die. We have to face death first quite often, when it strikes our beloved ones, and finally when we ourselves are involved. We have to leave everything behind us. We may try not to think of it. Some consider death as an absurdity. Others learn to handle this reality as an integral part of our condition.

Am I, who came into being and grew into a person through my relationship with other human beings, doomed to break for always the very ties that made me the person I am? Am I, who believe that God called me to live with him in a sacred partnership (covenant), rewarded with mere nothingness the moment I breathe my last? We Christians are aware in faith that beyond death we will be with God. We are also aware that at the moment of death, we are not always the kind of persons we should be for all eternity; hence a





RECLAIMING Sundays Beauty and Prayer

NOVEMBER



"God looked at everything he had made and found it very good." "" Genesis 1:31

On Sunday we are called to participate in appreciating the beauty that is all around us and participate in Beauty can evoke in us an appreciation for what God has created in our life and lead us to participate in that creation through the materials around us. We are called to find and assist in creating beauty through the ordinariness of family life.

SAMPLE ACTIVITIES FOR NOVEMBER:

- . Explore the beauty of our cathedral, basilica, or your parish by taking time to explore the art. Learn about the saints you see. If you have time, draw pictures of your favorite image or take a family photo with a beautiful sacred image in the background. Turn this into a small moment of evangelization by making it your Christmas card photo,
- Create a small sacred space (prayer table/family altar) in your home Enlist contributions from everyone in your family to make it beautiful (flowers in a small vase, draw pictures for lesus, etc.).
- · Color with your children.
- · Share passionate projects in which you create (the woodshop, knitting, etc.).
- · Liturgical Living Near the beginning of the month, visit a family member's gravesite. Make it neat and bring flowers (if permitted by the cemetery). Pass on family stories about this person to your children. Learn the Eternal Rest prayer and pray it daily for those you know who have died. Pray for the souls in purgatory this month.
- Recommended resource to assist in building habits of prayer is the Hallow App.



Did you know that **donating appreciated stock** can be one of the most tax-efficient ways to support St. Boniface? We now have a brokerage account and can receive stock donations!

When you give stock directly to the parish, you avoid paying capital gains tax on the appreciation and may deduct the full fair market value of the stock if you've held it for more than one year.

Other advantages include:

- Preserves cash liquidity: You can make a generous gift without affecting your cash flow.
- Avoids brokerage commissions: Direct transfers of stock typically don't incur transaction fees.
- May increase your deductions: If you itemize your deductions, this can be particularly helpful.
- Carryover option: For substantial gifts, deductions are generally limited to 30% of your Adjusted Gross Income, with the remainder available for 5 future years. It's truly a win-win—you pay less in taxes, and St. Boniface receives more to continue its mission.
