Reflection from the Theology Club

This week focuses on the aftermath of the crucifixion. Two of Jesus's disciples were walking down a road to Emmaus which was 7 miles from Jerusalem. Jesus approached them on the walk but their eyes were kept from recognizing him. He asked the two what they were talking about. With sad expressions, the disciple, whose name was Cleopas said, "Are you the only one visiting Jerusalem that does not know what has happened there these days?" They explained to Jesus the story of his crucifixion. They told Jesus he was a mighty prophet, before God and that their own leaders condemned him to death. Earlier, a few women of their group had visited the stone tomb, found it empty, and saw visions of angels. As the three came near to Emmaus, the disciples urged Jesus to stay with them as the day was soon to be over. When he was at the table with them, he took bread and blessed, broke it, and gave it to them. Then their eyes were open, and they recognized him, and he vanished from their sight. With this Easter season over, Christ has risen. This passage urges us to come to reality. With the busy chaotic nature of our everyday lives, we forget the presence of Christ. We are so swallowed by our own surface problems and emotions we cannot see the answer that's right in front of our face; Christ. Like the disciples, we ask "where is our Messiah who was supposed to save Israel?" To the problems of today, war, abuses, and struggles. But we should take a second to stand still and realize Christ is here. This is the presence that gives us courage in our life to face our own evil and to say yes to life.
