PADRES CORNER

Greetings,

At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus lays out some of his principal teachings. Today, he gives us the Beatitudes. And as usual, Jesus turns things upside down and says some very unexpected things!

Jesus went up a mountain to teach his followers. He seemed to love mountains. For example, his very hometown, Nazareth, sits perched high up on the limestone hills of Lower Galilee, affording wonderful views of the Jezreel Valley. We can notice in the Gospels that certain places in the Holy Land seemed to attract Jesus more than others. One place that clearly pulled on his heart is the Sea of Galilee. The beautiful blue water presents a clean and refreshing backdrop to the Gospels. In the Holy Land, the Sea of Galilee is practically untouched by modern-day growth. It appears today very much as it did in the time of Jesus. One of the first things you notice while standing on the shore is that the sea is, for the most part, surrounded by hills. These rolling hills that wrap around the lake provide a unique characteristic. (In fact, the body of water reminds me of Lake Ashtabula, the water is surrounded by hills on the sides.) No matter where you are on the lakeshore, if you turn away from the lake, you can find a hill to walk up. After a short journey, you reach the top of that hill and see a very beautiful panoramic view of the lake.

This is very often reflected in the Gospels as one scene flows into the next. In a habitual pattern, Jesus spends a day near the lake, and then in the evening, he turns away from the sea and goes up to the top of a nearby hill to pray or to teach. What this "going up" symbolically represents is always approaching closer to the heavens and hence closer to God. Jesus leads us up these mountains to teach us. His greatest teaching is the Sermon on the Mount.

In the sermon, Jesus talks about those who are "blessed". To our ears today, this sounds poetic and consoling. But when Jesus mentions the "blessed ones" of the Beatitudes, he really would have caught the attention of his audience. These people thought they knew exactly who the "Blessed Ones" were. Now they are tossed into a flurry since they were mistaken.

In the time of Jesus, "the Blessed Ones" were, for the Greeks and Romans, the gods on Mt Olympus. They called the gods "blessed" or "happy," which in Greek would be the same root word for the blessings of the beatitudes (Makarios). Because of this, we know that Jesus was really mixing things up! The gods on Mt Olympus were powerful, happy, and well-fed. They resided in splendid palaces and feasted on ambrosia and nectar, which granted them immortality. Their divine lives were a soap opera of drama, someone else's idea, not mine. Despite their divine status, the gods exhibited very human traits, such as jealousy, pride, and love. They would often engage in petty quarrels and love affairs, just like the immortals, called humans. Zeus, the king of the Greek gods, is a complex figure with several notable character flaws. He was unfaithful, had anger issues, and was very proud and impulsive.

When Jesus claims that those who are poor, hungry, and weeping are the truly blessed ones, he is turning on its head the silly theology of the Greeks and Romans regarding the imaginary gods on Mt. Olympus. Ugh!!

Now, because of Jesus, divinity on earth was to be found in the poor, humble, and outcast. For example, the Christ child lying in a poor manger or the crucified Christ on a cross. To be godlike, for a Christian, does not mean to have Zeus-like powers. It means something else entirely, and this is not an easy concept for us to accept. Our minds grapple with making sense of this. How can a person who is crying and hurting be blessed? How can those experiencing persecution be blessed? Considering heaven, it all makes sense; we must accept in faith that what Jesus says is true.

When Jesus gave this sermon, he was standing on a site in

the Holy Land that looks out over the Sea of Galilee. He had a multitude of people around him; in the crowd were men and women who were mourning, hungering for righteousness, meek, and persecuted. Jesus spoke to their suffering hearts; these were the real godlike.

The Beatitudes are a Christ-like, and therefore God-like, way of living. Being faithful to God is not easy. Being a disciple of Jesus is not easy. Our Lord never promised to make things in our lives on earth easy. He never promised us that we would have "happy little lives on earth." Rather, Jesus opened up the gates of heaven for us. He promised that if we carry our cross, we will arrive in paradise, where every tear will be wiped away! Let us live with the humility of Christ in our hearts to give us encouragement.

MELISSA'S SOCIAL JUSTICE CORNER

This past week, tens of thousands of pilgrims gathered in Washington D.C. for the March for Life. Archbishop Shelton J. Fabre, who is the Bishop-Chairman of three committees of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, stated that they were grateful to see the US House of Representatives pass the Pregnant Students' Rights Act and the Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act. "Building a culture of life requires helping mothers to be able to welcome their new children. Too often, however, expectant and vulnerable women are essentially told that they have to choose either their child or their future. No one should have to make this ultimately false choice." The Supporting Pregnant and Parenting Women and Families Act will help ensure that key public resources are available to pregnancy help centers, which accompany women in need with compassion by helping them with baby supplies, childcare assistance, health and parenting information, career services, and more. In a time of great difficulty and often lack of support, these resources can make a huge difference.

At the same time, as Catholics, we believe that life is sacred from conception to natural death and everything in between. Once again we mourn with Minneapolis on the loss of another life. Pope Leo stated at his Sunday Angelus this past weekend that "peace is built on respect for people." Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, expanded on this message by saying, Pope Leo XIV reminds us that "the Gospel must be proclaimed and lived in every setting, serving as a leaven of fraternity and peace among all individuals, cultures, religions, and peoples. It is with this in mind that I prayerfully urge calm, restraint, and respect for human life in Minneapolis and all those places where peace is threatened. Public authorities especially have a responsibility to safeguard the well-being of people in service to the common good." He said.

STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS

The phrase "poor in spirit" can be confusing. Think of it in this sense – poor in spirit means depending on God's providence and not depending on our own self-reliance. Being detached from earthly things (power, money, and comfort) and being attached to heavenly things (charity, sacrifice, and mercy). Denying ourselves from satisfying our desires and helping others obtain their basic needs.
