

Gospel Reflection 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time August 13-14, 2016 Luke 12:49-53

I am writing this reflection on August 9th, the feast day of St. Benedicta of the Cross, whose secular name was Edith Stein. She was a young convert from Judaism to Catholicism. She became not only a Catholic but

later decided to enter a Carmelite monastery embracing the call to be a contemplative nun.

Her mother was never reconciled to either of these choices. St. Benedicta of the Cross embodied in her life today's Gospel in which Jesus predicted that a "mother will stand against her daughter and daughter against mother" (*Luke 12:53*).

St. Benedicta wrote "the call for decision is often the call for division." In a world torn apart by the evils of Nazism, St. Benedicta would die like millions of other Jews in the gas chambers of Auschwitz.

As Pope Francis stood in silence during a papal visit to Auschwitz a couple of weeks ago, I am certain he must have been conscious of the sword of division which is rending our world today.

Our only choice can be a Gospel choice, in every decision big or small. The consequences, however, may well be division. Are we as ready as St. Benedicta was to live out the difficult or painful choice of discipleship no matter the cost? Again, we might ask ourselves, is there really any other option, if in fact we are His?


SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR CHILDREN IN NEED

FATHER CAPODANNO MEMORIAL MASS

The Memorial Mass for Father Vincent R. Capodanno, MM, will take place at 6:30pm on Tuesday, September 6th, in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 400 Michigan Avenue, Northeast, Washington, D.C. His Excellency, the Most Reverend Timothy P. Broglio, J.C.D., Archbishop for the United States Military Services, will be the main celebrant.

This annual Mass is celebrated in memory of Fr. Capodanno, killed in Vietnam on Sept. 4, 1967, as he aided embattled Marines. Fr. Capodanno posthumously received the Medal of Honor, and in May 2006 the Catholic Church officially proclaimed him a Servant of God, formally initiating his cause for beatification. The Fr. Vincent Capodanno Guild is the only official organization set up to promote the cause for canonization of Fr. Capodanno.
