



Gospel Reflection
 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time
 September 3-4, 2016
 Luke 14:25-33

You may have read about the massive protests spreading across India these past few months. The “Dalits”, once known as the “untouchables”, are rising up and demanding justice and equality.

In our own country these past couple of years, we have been reminded how real racial inequality and exclusion still runs very deep. In Biblical times, class segregation and slavery were accepted and ingrained practices. While we can never support or applaud the marginalization and separation of people and races, it may be that such tendencies are part of human nature, dehumanizing as they are.

In today’s second reading, however, St. Paul overcomes and supersedes these tendencies. He calls Onesimus, who was a slave, his child and beloved brother. It is Christ-built love which binds their hearts and minds together and makes them equal, not separate.

Mother Teresa of Calcutta allowed the power and truth of love to bridge all gaps between her and the poorest of the poor, Dalits included. Doing so took courage, if not a radical conversion of her heart.

She and Paul remind us all that love alone conquers all hatred, exclusion, and injustice. These two saints, each giants in the Faith, serve as stellar models of a love that can and does change the world, no matter how torn, separate, and unjust things may, in fact, be.

NEW CATHOLIC MEN’S STUDY GROUP



MOTHER TERESA OF CALCUTTA – SEPTEMBER 4TH

On Sunday, September 4, 2016, Mother Teresa of Calcutta will be canonized by Pope Francis at St. Peter's Basilica at the Vatican.

Mother Teresa has Baltimore connections: She visited the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Baltimore in 1996. A bust of her likeness is on permanent display inside the Basilica. The pew, on which she sat and prayed during her visit 20 years earlier, is on display in the undercroft.

St. Wenceslaus Parish will hold a special Mass on Saturday, Sept. 10th at 11:00am! On that day the Missionaries of Charity will host the Mass to be celebrated by Archbishop William Lori. After the Mass, the celebration will continue with a luncheon in the Lyceum during which a short film presentation on the life of Mother Teresa will be presented. FATHER CAPODANNO MEMORIAL MASS

The Memorial Mass for Father Vincent R. Capodanno, MM, will take place at 6:30pm on Tuesday, September 6th, in the Crypt Church of the Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 400 Michigan Avenue, Northeast, Washington, D.C.

This annual Mass is celebrated in memory of Fr. Capodanno, killed in Vietnam on Sept. 4, 1967, as he aided embattled Marines. Fr. Capodanno posthumously received the Medal of Honor, and in May 2006 the Catholic Church officially proclaimed him a Servant of God, formally initiating his cause for beatification.
