Everyone working with children and vulnerable adults must participate Archdiocesan VIRTUS training and a background check prior to beginning ministry. VIRTUS is provided at a variety of times and locations throughout the year, in English and Spanish.



LITURGICAL MINISTRY

Training and/or orientation is needed for each liturgical ministry and is scheduled by appointment with the Director of Liturgy or volunteer ministry coordinator. Scheduling for each ministry is coordinated according to the individual minister's scheduling needs.

Mass Coordinator

This ministry coordinates the set-up for Mass on Saturday/ Sunday, Holy Days and other special services. Serves per schedule

Sacristans

This ministry coordinates the set-up for Mass on weekdays, funerals and other special services. *Serves as needed*

Prayer Leaders

Assist in leading prayer for weekday morning/evening prayer, monthly Taizé, and Liturgy of the Word with Holy Communion. *Scheduled at a preferred liturgy 1-2 times per month*

Lectors

Proclaim the Scripture at Mass and worship services Scheduled at preferred liturgy

Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC)

EMHC distribute the Eucharist at weekday, Sunday and Holy Day liturgies. EMHC are also encouraged to participate in ministry to the homebound (see Pastoral Care). *Scheduled as teams on rotating basis.*

Altar Servers (Acolytes)

Young people (grades 3 and higher) and adults serve the altar at Sunday, Holy Day and other special liturgies. *Scheduled at preferred liturgy on a rotating basis*

Ministers of Hospitality (Ushers/Greeters)

Greeters welcome parishioners and guests before the Sunday and holy day Masses, and other celebrations.

Scheduled at preferred liturgies on a rotating basis

Ushers greet, assist with seating, take up the collection, distribute weekly bulletins, and pick up the church after liturgy. *Scheduled on a weekly basis, as available*

Gift Bearers

Gift bearers process the bread and wine at the Sunday liturgy.

Cross Bearers

Lead the Mass procession carrying the cross in and out of church.

Eucharistic Adorer

Pray before the Blessed Sacrament on First Fridays (daytime). *At least 1 hour commitment per month, as scheduled*

Liturgical Environment

Prepare the worship space and adjacent areas for the many liturgical seasons of the church year.

Seasonal commitment; watch for bulletin announcements

Altar Guild

Care for the vestments, vessels, and worship spaces; the gifts of sewing, ordering, decorating, woodworking, and ironing welcome. *Scheduled depending upon the task*

MUSIC MINISTRY

Please contact the Music Director about membership in these groups. Ensemble

Members of this group serve as music ministers for either the 5:00pm or the 11:00am Masses. Singers and instrumentalists grade 9 through adult are invited to join.

Rehearsals held Tuesday evenings, Sept-May & 30 minutes prior to Mass

Choir

Members of this group serve as music ministers for the 9:00am Mass. Singers and instrumentalists grade 9 through adult are invited to join.

Rehearsals held Tuesday evenings, Sept-May & 30 minutes prior to Mass

<u>Cantors</u>

These are members of the Ensemble or Choir who are invited by the director to proclaim the sung psalm (and other solo parts of the Mass) and to lead the congregational song when necessary.

Hand Bell Choir

Ringers are invited to lead and accompany the assembly's singing at monthly liturgies and on major feast days.

Rehearsals times vary weekdays and evenings, Sept-May

Instrumentalists

Brass, wind and string players with at least one year experience on their instrument may play for weekly or special liturgies, including monthly Taizé prayer. Auditions may be necessary. *Rehearsals as needed*

FAITH FORMATION MINISTRY

Orientation is provided by the Director Faith Formation at the start of the school year. Periodic re-training may be required for some ministries. All volunteers working with children must undergo an Archdiocesan certification process which includes a background check, VIRTUS, Code of Conduct, and Mandatory Reporter trainings, and signing a Code of Conduct prior to beginning a volunteer ministry. There are no exceptions.

Sunday Preschool

Catechists to work under the guidance of the Director of Faith Formation weekly in the preschool classroom, October through April during 11:00am Sunday Mass. Substitutes are also needed. 2-4 hours preparation, 1 ½ hours on-site, for 9 months per year

Children's Liturgy of the Word (CLW)

Adults as prayer leaders. High School students to act as assistants. 1 rotation every 4—6 weeks during 11:00am Mass, with 1-2 hours preparation time each month

Elementary (Grades K—5)

- 4-6 Catechists to work under the guidance of the Director of Faith Formation on Sunday mornings.
- 2-4 hours preparation, 2 hours on-site weekly, for 9 months per year

Middle School (Grades 6—8)

3-6 Catechists to work under the guidance of the Director of Faith Formation in each of 6th, 7th, and 8th grades on Sunday mornings. 2-4 hours preparation, 2 hours on-site weekly, for 9 months per year

Confirmation I & II (Grades 9—10)

- 1-2 Catechists to work under the guidance of the Director of Faith Formation in the two year Confirmation preparation program for Sunday afternoon classes.
- 2-4 hours preparation, 2 hours on-site weekly, for 9 months per year

<u>Classroom Aids</u>

Adult or teen to be present in each classroom to assist children and catechists, as well as help with snacks

1 hour per week

#MercyWorks

Plan opportunities to live out our Christian faith through spiritual, social and service programs and activities. All parishioners are invited to participate in short, no-commitment service projects here at the church.

Aprox 4 times per year following 11am Mass, see bulletin

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION MINISTRY

RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Hospitality Ministers: welcome participants, set up treats, assist with Easter Vigil reception.

1 ½ hours each gathering, 1 hour after Vigil

Faith Sharers: lead conversation about scripture readings. 1 hour every Sunday after 11:00 Mass intercessions, Advent through Easter, plus preparation time—can be shared among several people, and divided up seasonally (Advent, Christmas, Ordinary Time, Lent)

First Eucharist Catechist

Catechist lead eight evening sessions annually 1 hour plus preparation per week, early/mid-January—March

First Reconciliation Catechist

Catechist lead eight evening sessions annually 1 hour plus preparation per week, mid-October—early December

Sacramental Learning Centers

Assist the Director of Faith Formation with set-up and clean-up, and help answer questions at First Reconciliation, First Eucharist and/or Confirmation afternoon learning centers.

6 hours on a Saturday in mid-December (Reconciliation)

6 hours on a Sunday in February or March (Confirmation)

6 hours on a Saturday in spring (First Eucharist)

YOUTH MINISTRY

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL (SUMMER)

Small Group Leader

6-8 Adults or high schoolers to prepare and lead various age levels. Middle-school assistant leaders also needed (no daily prep).

 $1\ training\ session,\ 2\ hours\ prep\ daily,\ 31/2\ hours\ daily\ on\ -site\ teaching$

Child Care Providers

1-2 Adults/supervised teens for daily childcare.

Noon—5: 30pm any or all days

Kitchen Crew

3-5 Adults daily to make and serve snacks and clean the kitchen.

Also to organize and clean-up after Friday family potluck.

3 hour commitment daily

Set-Up & Clean-Up Crews

Adults/older teens to set-up, decorate and organize VBS space the week before and to take-down and return to storage after. Thursdays Fridays and/or Saturdays before and after VBS

Arts & Crafts and Games Coordinators (2 Roles)

Adult /older teens to lead small groups in daily craft activities or to plan games/outdoor recreation .

3 hours daily

Music Coordinator

Adult to help children to learn songs/activities.

8 hours preparation, 3 hours daily

Skit Coordinator & Skit Team

5-8 Adults/teens to act as a skit team under the direction of the skit coordinator to learn and do skits each day.

3 hours daily, plus additional rehearsal

VBS Assistants

3-4 Adults & 1-2 older teens flexible to work wherever needed as assistants to the Director of Faith Formation during VBS

Registration Crew

2 Adults to manage registration/check-in on the first day of VBS. *Monday only, 2 hours*

Celebration Leader

 $1\ \mbox{Very}$ enthusiastic adult to lead group songs and rally groups.

1 hour training, 4 hours daily (including prep)

Publicity/Photography Coordinator

1 Adult/older teen to assist the Director of Faith Formation with marketing, as well as taking photographs throughout VBS. *Prior to the end of preceding school year and early summer*

PASTORAL CARE MINISTRY

Training is arranged by the Director of Pastoral Care for new volunteers. Ongoing guidance and re-training may be periodically required.

Prayer Network

Join others in praying for parishioners and their needs. The prayer list is available at the parish office or may be picked up in a special location during the weekend Masses.

Anointing Service (Quarterly)

Greeters and ushers are needed to welcome people, help with nametags, assist them into church.

1-2 hours, 4 times per year during a regular weekend Mass

Prayer Service Ministers

Lead a prayer service (with communion) at an area senior residence or nursing home.

1 hour/month to 1 hour/week, depending on the place

Ministers to the homebound and/or hospitalized

Visit with and take communion to a homebound person. *Set up individually, but usually 1 hour every week, every 2 weeks, or*

every month.

Visit with and take communion to the hospitalized as needed. *approx. 1 hour/month*

Funeral Ministry: Prayerful Presence

Provide supportive presence to the grieving family, pray during visitation, assist with set-up the, or even serve as lector and/or extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion. Patricipation varies according to you own interest and comfort level.

1 ½-3 hours for each funeral

Funeral Reception

Be a part of a team that prepares and serves the refreshments.

2-5 hours for each luncheon/reception

Call for volunteers for luncheon (cooking, etc.)

1 hour for each luncheon/reception

Prepare shopping list and purchase groceries for lunch/reception *2 hours for each lunch/reception*

Grief Support Coalition

Be a trained support group facilitator.

1 ½ hours every week for 2 months/each session, as available

Prayer Shawl Ministry

Knit/crochet prayer shawls to be blessed and given to parishioners in need of extra comfort and care.

Make fleece tie blankets or stuffed animals for children and teens. *according to your own schedule*

#MercyWorks

Team members plan opportunities to live out our Christian faith through spiritual, social and service programs and activities. All parishioners are invited to participate in short, no-commitment service projects here at the church. Contact Susie Osacho. *Aprox 1 hour, 4 times per year following 11am Mass, see bulletin*

Coffee Shop

Serve donuts, juice, coffee, hospitality to parishioners/visitors; clean-up. *4 hours on Sunday, every 4-6 weeks on rotating basis*

Money Counters

Be part of a volunteer team of unrelated member scheduled on a rotating basis to open and count the Sunday and special collections. Must pass a background check.

Sundays from aprox 10:00am-12:30pm, approximately once monthly

Bank Driver

Teams of unrelated drivers transport sealed contributions for deposit out our bank. Must pass a background check. 1 hour, aprox monthly

Parish Registration Volunteer

Welcome and distribute information to people interested in joining the parish.

after Masses on Saturday & Sunday on rotating basis

Faith Formation Office Volunteers

Assist with projects such as photocopying, cutting paper shapes and other prep work for weekly faith formation classes and liturgical season projects.

2 hours shifts as your schedule allows.

Parish Office Front Desk Hospitality Ministers

Assist in the parish office answering phones and performing other tasks as needed.

2 hour shifts as your schedule allows

Garden Club

Work with a team to maintain the parish gardens. *anytime, varies as scheduled/available*

Fall Festival Committee Member


Plan, carry out, and evaluate the Fall Festival. *meetings as scheduled*
