Things I've Seen and Heard

My dear friends and parishioners of St. Antoninus,

It is with great sorrow that I am writing to you today to inform you of the passing of Fr. Lawrence J. Mick, our beloved resident, retired Associate who was here with us at St. Antoninus since his retirement. I received a phone call early on Monday, January 9th, that Fr. Mick was drawing close to death, and I was able, along with the office staff, to go to the nursing home to be at his bedside during his final hours, where we were able to pray the Rosary and to give him the Final Sacraments of the Church. He died peacefully in his sleep at approximately 4:15 that afternoon of Monday January 9, 2017. His funeral Mass was celebrated by Archbishop Dennis M. Schnurr last Friday.

I wanted to share with you my own feelings about Fr. Mick this weekend. One of the reasons that I was so excited about coming here to St. Antoninus as Temporary Administrator in 2014, and then as Pastor in 2015, was because of Fr. Mick. Fr. Mick was one of the kindest, gentlest souls, and holiest priests that I have ever been given the privilege and honor to know in my life. He was an absolute joy to live with, and I always enjoyed his witty sense of humor. I count myself as very blessed and fortunate to have had the opportunity to spend the last two years with him, to live and share meals with him, and to pray with him nearly every day. I will dearly miss him, as I believe all of us will.

I ask that you continue to pray for the repose of his immortal soul, and continue to pray for his surviving relatives and friends, as well as pray for the parish community of St. Antoninus who are deeply saddened and grieving at this time.

Fr. Lawrence J. Mick, 1923-2017, may the Angels lead you into Paradise, may the Martyrs welcome you and take you to the Holy City, the New and Eternal Jerusalem.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor

2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6: The passage for Mass this weekend is the second of four poems in Isaiah that describe the mission of an unnamed Servant of the Lord. These poems are referred to as the “Servant Songs”. Most likely dating from a time near the end of the Babylonian captivity, the figure of the Servant appears as God’s obedient instrument in the people’s restoration. In verses 5-6, the Lord spells out the servant’s mission: it is to renew the people in such a way that even non-Israelites can see the light and attain salvation. The expression, “light to the nations”, in verse 6 has a clear religious meaning: salvation will spread to all the nations.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 40: 2,4,7-8, 8-9, 10 (8a, 9a): The psalm passage for Mass this weekend is a psalm of David. It is a song of praise and prayer for help. God’s actions, in favor of his people, are so numerous, that it is impossible to list them. In return for these actions, God expects His people to obey Him and His laws.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3: St. Paul attaches his name to three features which identify him – his divine calling, his office as Apostle of Jesus Christ, and the will of God, the source of his apostolic vocation. By defining himself as “called”, St. Paul is probably referring to the episode on the road to Damascus when Christ changed his life, as he had earlier changed the life of the Twelve. The addressee of the letter is the church of God at Corinth and the very grammar of the phrase emphasizes the fact that the Church is not the totality of the local communities: rather, each local community, here, the Christians of Corinth, represents the whole Church which is one and indivisible. The people who make up the Church are those sanctified in Jesus Christ, those called to be saint, and those who invoke the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. The peace Paul speaks of in the third verse is the serenity of mind, tranquility of heart, and the bond of love that originates in the friendship with God, which is brought by grace, and is one of the fruits of the Holy Spirit.

Gospel: John 1: 29-34: The Gospel passage for this week’s Mass is the first time in the Gospel Christ is called the Lamb of God. John the Baptist here asserts Jesus’ superiority by saying that He (Jesus) existed before him, even though Jesus was born after John the Baptist. In this way, he is showing the divinity of Jesus Christ who was generated by the Father from all eternity and born of the Virgin Mary in time. John the Baptist is saying that although he was born before Jesus, Jesus is not limited by the ties of his birth. For although Jesus was born of his mother in time, he was generated by his Father outside of time. Here, John the Baptist is telling us that he understood that his own mission was solely to bear witness to Jesus Christ. In verses 32-34, the evangelist includes John the Baptist’s testimony regarding the baptism of Jesus in which a dove (the Holy Spirit) descended upon Jesus, and God spoke from heaven saying, “This is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased.” This is one of the key points in our Lord’s life in which the mystery of the Blessed Trinity is revealed.

Reflection: In the first reading, to reveal God’s love for all people, the Servant’s principal functions are to serve and glorify God. Similarly, in the Gospel passage, John the Baptist, like all Christians, points to Jesus. Do we recognize Jesus as John the Baptist did? Perhaps this week, we can pray to the Lord, asking Him to give us a deeper consciousness of His love for all people. May we, through our actions, strive to make real God’s love, not only for us, but for everyone. Point out Jesus to someone close to you. Talk about your faith in Jesus.
