BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

Reading 1: Sirach 3:2-6, 12-14: in the Greek Septuagint version of the Bible and in the Vulgate Latin, the last of the canonical wisdom writings is the book of Ecclesiasticus or, the Wisdom of Sirach. This book is one of those works in which Holy Scripture indicates, with remarkably clear cues, how deeply the knowledge conferred by faith and the knowledge conferred by reason are related. Ben Sirach is aware that the really important things have to be studied in the light of divine Wisdom given to men, that is, reason enlightened by Revelation—which is in fact what Christian theology does. Traditional wisdom encourages people to be observant and to reflect on life in order to discover the best route to happiness. Because wisdom involves obeying the divine law, Ben Sirach urges his students to obey the precepts to honor their mother and father. The commandment covers not only young children's obedience to their adult parents, but also the respectful care shown by adults toward their own aged parents. God fearing children will serve their parents with devotion. Honoring one's parents brings blessings.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 105: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 8-9 (7a, 8a): OR Psalm 128: 1-2, 3, 4-5 (1): At the time this column was being written it was unclear which of the psalms would be read in Mass.

<u>Psalm 105:</u> This psalm is a call to praise the Lord for His covenant with Abraham. It is a call to give thanks for God His faithful to His covenants with His people. The psalm is addressed to the people of Israel, the descendants of Abraham in which they are told to call to mind the wondrous deeds that God accomplished on their behalf.

<u>Psalm 128:</u> The theme of this psalm is that the man who fears the Lord will be a happy man. Fearing the Lord is keeping His commandments. In verses 2-4, the beatitude promised is a happy family life; peace between parents and children.

Reading II: Colossians 3:12-21: This letter by St. Paul mentions specific virtues such as patience, forgiveness, and love. Paul tells us that we are to be as patient and forgiving of one another as God is with us. Paul calls us to let the peace of Christ rule our hearts so that nothing we do in our relationships will be done from self-interest. The evangelist also gives advice about living together in a household. The normative standard in households is that the husband is the head. However, Paul calls husbands to put on the garment of love, not using excessive control but, rather, manifesting in their households the transformation expected of the baptized: compassion and kindness.

<u>Gospel: Luke 2:22-40:</u> Our Gospel passage for Mass this weekend shares with us the presentation of the infant Jesus in the temple. Mary and Joseph are obligated to follow the dictates of Jewish law in regards to their firstborn son. Because children are a gift from God, ultimately they belong to God. The Jewish law prescribed a ritual by which the parents could acknowledge this truth: they would offer God a gift in symbolic exchange for their child. This is what St. Luke refers to when he writes that Mary and Joseph consecrated Jesus to God. Mary offers two pigeons instead of the normal combination of a lamb and a pigeon. Under Jewish law, those families too poor to offer the lamb could substitute a pigeon for a lamb. Thus the Holy Family were of humble means. *Continued on the next page...*



During the presentation, Simeon, inspired by the Holy Spirit, joyfully explains who this newborn child really is. He announces that the Child is the salvation for which Israel had waited. Mary and Joseph were amazed at Simeon's words. Then Simeon offers a prophecy to Mary that her Son would also be a sign of contradiction—words which she would long ponder in her heart.

Reflection: Jesus Christ, King of the universe, not only became man, but He became a member of a normal, humble, working class family. Mary, Queen of heaven and earth, lived her incomparably holy life as

a wife and mother in a poor family. Joseph, patron of the universal Church and greatest of all Patriarchs, worked hard just to keep enough bread on the table. Such a normal family, such an ordinary life. Perhaps from the example of the Holy Family, God wants us to know that His Kingdom is within us; we can find Him in the midst of our normal occupations, where He wants to be with us as our friend. Though we may be ordinary people, by letting Christ into our lives we can end up doing extraordinary things. Mary and Joseph welcomed Jesus into their very humble ordinary lives and look what happened.

The Continuing Message of Fatima



It is extremely important that we hear and respond to the Blessed Mother's call. Sister Lucia, the eldest of the children of Fatima, received from the Blessed Mother the devotion of the Frist Saturday of the month. Extra ordinary promises are given to those persons whom, on the five consecutive Saturdays, do the following.

1. Go to Confession in a reasonable amount of time before the First Saturday. (St. Antoninus Church will have Holy Hours on the first Thursday before the First Friday each month.) Confession will be available on all these Thursdays.

- 2. Receive Holy Communion in the state of Grace, and offer that Communion in reparation for the sins against the Most Immaculate Heart of Mary.
- 3. Recite five decades of the Rosary.
- 4. Keep the Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes, while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Her most Immaculate Heart. The 15 minutes can be done anywhere.

The Blessed Mother, in exchange for your commitment to the five First Saturdays, told Sister Lucia that "I will assist (be present) at the hour of your death (the person fulfilling the request) with all the graces necessary for salvation...)". A powerful promise from our Mother.

Why five first Saturdays? According to Sister Lucia, they were requested to atone for the five ways in which people offend the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Attacks upon Mary's Immaculate Conception.
- 2. Attacks against her Perpetual Virginity.
- 3. Attacks upon her Divine Maternity and the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all mankind.
- 4. For those who try to publicly implant in children's' hearts indifference, contempt and even hatred of the Immaculate Mother.
- 5. For those who insult her directly in her sacred images.
