BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor
SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: 2 Kings 4:42-44: The first book of Kings begins with a lengthy account of the person and life of Solomon, David's successor. It then goes on to give the history of the two kingdoms that came into being after Solomon's death: Israel in the north and Judah in the south. In 2 Kings, the history of the kingdoms continues from the times of Elisha up to the disappearance of the Northern kingdom; and from then on, up to the time the king of Judah and the more prominent citizens of Jerusalem were deported to Babylon. However, in the history of the kingdom of Israel, the outstanding personalities were not the kings but the prophets Elijah and Elisha. Our passage for Mass this weekend gives us a glimpse into the prophet Elisha. A man comes bearing bread of the "first fruits" which, at that time, was always designated for God. The man offers it to Elisha, because Elisha is a prophet of the Lord. But, at that time, in that region, food was scarce, and Elisha wants to share it with others. Elisha orders the bread to be distributed in shares. At the same time, Elisha was uttering an oracle he received from the Lord (verses 43 & 44) and a miracle was performed: a meager amount of bread is multiplied into an amount sufficient to feed a large number of people. In the New Testament, Jesus will also work the miracle of the multiplication of loaves, after the apostles raise an objection similar to the one in verse 43.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 145:10-11, 15-16, 17-18 (16): Psalm 145 is a psalm of praise and a psalm of David. The psalmist praises the Lord for He is great and merciful, and His kingdom endures forever. The universal rule of God is extolled. This rule is characterized by its glory, power, and eternal duration. God has no rival; all creatures, generation after generation, are under this divine dominion. All creatures praise God for the glorious nature of this rule. God seems particularly attentive to the needs of the weak and afflicted, lifting them up when they fall. Such kindness is in keeping with a nature that is merciful and compassionate. In verse 17, covenant love is extolled as is another covenant characteristic, faithfulness. God will not disappoint, and this is reason for praising God.

Reading II: Ephesians 4:1-6: St Paul begins this letter by reminding the Church at Ephesus that their behavior should reflect that they are Christians. Our baptism is our call to holiness, so our lives must be lived by continually striving to that holiness. Paul lists virtues which are all different aspects of charity or love. Charity or love is **the** characteristic of a true follower of Christ. Pope St. Pius X wrote: *"Charity is a supernatural virtue infused by God into our soul, by which we love God above everything else for his own sake and our neighbor as ourselves for love of God"*. Charity or love is basic to the building up of a peaceful human society. The peace which unites Christians is the peace Christ brings. Actually, this peace is Christ Himself. Unions of hearts, affections, and intentions is the result of the action of the Holy Spirit in souls, and it leads to strength and effectiveness as disciples of Christ. Scriptural scholars think St. Paul quoted an acclamation from early Christian baptismal liturgy in verses 4-6 of this letter. It implies that the unity of the Church is derived from and reflects the three Persons of the Holy Trinity who are at work in the Church and who keep it together: one Spirit, one Lord, one God and Father.

Gospel: John 6:1-15: Our gospel passage for Mass this weekend is taken from John and finds Jesus crossing the Sea of Galilee. Three aspects of this passage set the scene for the feeding sign or miracle that is about to occur. First, a large crowd followed Jesus, because they had seen the signs He was performing on the sick. Second, Jesus went up on the mountain which echoes the action of Moses who went up on Mount Sinai to receive the Torah. *Continued on the next page...*

Third, the Jewish feast of Passover was near. Here John is illustrating the spiritual relationship between Jesus and the exodus: the origin of Passover, in God's plan, especially God's loving kindness for His people, is evident in His providing them with food in the wilderness. There were thousands of people gathered, and Jesus and the Twelve had no food. Philip thinks Jesus wants him to go to the grocery. Andrew spots a young boy who has five loaves and two fish. Hardly sufficient for so many people. But, these two disciples were thinking about the situation in everyday terms, not as Jesus was thinking. In this passage, Jesus is inviting, especially these two apostles, to expand their faith. We notice that the loaves were barley, because the gospel passage emphasizes this. Recall the first reading from Kings: Elisha fed 100 people with 20 barley loaves. That passage from Kings is an antecedent for what Jesus will do. In our passage from John, Jesus' gestures with the loaves closely resemble His actions at the Last Supper: He took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed the loaves. And, all of the people were fed with food left over; just as the 100 people in the passage from Kings were fed with food left over. The people were astounded to the extent that they recognized Jesus as the Prophet for whom they were waiting. In the Old Testament before his death, Moses promised that one day God would send another leader to the people of Israel. This figure was referred to as the prophet. Through the centuries, the Jewish people had come to identify this figure with the promised Messiah. And here is the promised Messiah feeding and healing the people.



Reflection: Five loaves and two fish cannot feed a crowd of thousands. It is impossible. Yet, when the Apostles hand over the meager resources to the Lord, they become more than enough to do the job. This applies not only to the loaves and fishes but to every Christian disciple. Whose natural talents and wisdom are sufficient to defeat the forces of evil that hold the world in tow? Whose innate strength is sufficient to put an end to the selfishness, lust, and greed that rage within the human heart because of original sin? We have only two fish and five loaves. Alone, we can do nothing. Only if we put all we have into Christ's hands, trusting in Him and not ourselves, can we hope to make a real difference. Perhaps this week, we might reflect on the following: **1)** How has my faith in Jesus been tested? How well have I done on the tests? **2)** What are the meager things and resources that I am able to give Jesus to use? Do I think I'm not good or holy enough to serve Jesus? We must always remember: *Jesus doesn't call those who are already equipped for the job; He equips those He calls for the job.* Do we trust enough to say "**Here I am Lord**"?

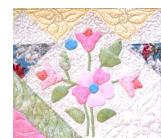

The Continuing Message of Fatima

Sister Lucia, the eldest of the 3 children of Fatima, received from the Blessed Mother the devotion of the First Saturday of the month. Extra ordinary promises are given to those persons, whom on Five Consecutive Saturdays do the following.

Go to Confession in a reasonable amount of time before the First Saturday. (Our Church will have our Holy Hour on the 1st Thursday before the First Friday each month.) Confession will be available on all these Thursdays.

Receive Holy Communion in the state of Grace, and offer that Communion in reparation for the sins against the Most Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Recite 5 Decades of the Rosary.

Keep the Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Her most Immaculate Heart. This can be done anywhere.

The Blessed Mother in exchange for your commitment to the 5 First Saturdays told Sister Lucia that:

" I will assist (be present) at the hour of your death (the person fulfilling the request) with all the graces necessary for salvation....)" A powerful promise from our Mother.

Why 5 first Saturdays? According to Sister Lucia, they were requested to atone for the five ways in which people offend the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

Attacks upon Mary's Immaculate Conception.

Attacks against her Perpetual Virginity.

Attacks upon her Divine Maternity and the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all mankind.

For those who try to publicly implant in children's hearts indifference, contempt and even hatred of this Immaculate Mother.

For those who insult her directly in her sacred images.
