BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor
OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST, KING OF THE UNIVERSE

Reading I: Daniel:7:13-14: This passage from Daniel is part of the book in which Daniel has visions of four beasts coming out of the sea and the son of man. The visions are in verses preceding our reading but they do set the stage for our reading. The sea in the vision represents the world of gloom and chaos. The beasts in Daniel's vision represent the powers of the world and are a winged lion (stands for Nebuchadnezzar), a bear ready to attack (the empire of the Medes), the leopard (the Persians), and the fourth beast resembles no animal but has iron teeth (symbolizing the Greek empire of Alexander the Great and his successors). The beasts all represent grave challenges to God's authority. The worst sin of the powers of the world is their opposition to God and His laws. In Daniel's vision, judgment is passed on the kingdoms. The one "like a son of man" who comes with the clouds of heaven and who, after the judgment, is given everlasting dominion over all the earth, is the very antithesis of the beast. He has not risen out of the chaos of the sea like the beasts. Rather, he has been raised up by God and he shares the human condition. The dignity of all mankind is restored through this son of man's triumph over the beasts. This figure (explained in a later part of Daniel) represents the faithful Israel. However, he is also an individual, and insofar as he is given a kingdom, he is a king. Thus, we have an individual who represents the people. In Jewish circles around the time of Christ, this "son of man" was interpreted as being the Messiah, a real person. This son of man has everlasting dominion.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 93:1, 1-2, 5 (1a): Psalm 93 is the first of a series of eight songs which in one way or another proclaim the kingship of God. Psalm 93 proclaims the Lord to be eternal and almighty. First the psalmist asserts that the Lord reigns over the whole world and His throne is fixed and eternal. He compares God's might with that of the waters and then he proclaims the permanence of His law and temple. The kingdom of God proclaimed in this and other psalms will be the core theme of Jesus' preaching. Although it begins to manifest itself in a new way with the coming of Christ, it is an eternal and universal kingdom.

Reading II: Revelation 1:5-8: The book of Revelation is the last book of Holy Scripture and is the only prophetic book in the New Testament. The Church makes frequent use of it, particularly in the Liturgy, to sing the praises of the risen Christ and the splendor of the heavenly Jerusalem, which symbolizes the Church in the glory of heaven. In our passage for Mass this weekend, three messianic titles taken from Psalm 89 are given a new meaning in the light of fulfillment of Christian faith and applied to Jesus. He is *the faithful witness* of the fulfillment of God's Old Testament promises of a Savior, a son of David. He is the *firstborn of the dead* in the sense that the Resurrection constituted a victory in which all who abide in Him share. Jesus is also the *ruler of kings on earth* because He is Lord of the world and this will be clearly seen when He comes again in glory. Christ's love for us knows no bounds: His generosity led Him to sacrifice His life by the shedding of His blood which redeemed us from our sins. There was nothing we could have done to redeem ourselves. Jesus' work is not finished. He has assembled His holy people on earth to bring them enduring salvation, and He will be revealed in all His glory to the whole world at the end of time. The coming of the Lord in glory is guaranteed by the power of God, the absolute master of the world and its destiny. Alpha and Omega are the first and last letters of the Greek alphabet; here they are used to proclaim that God is the beginning and ending of all things, of the world and of history; He is present at all times: times past, present, and future.

Gospel: John 18:33b-37: All of the readings for Mass this weekend focus on Jesus as King. In our passage from John, Jesus stands before Pilate who asks if He is the King of the Jews. This question seems to come out of nowhere but, indicates that behind the scenes someone has suggested to Pilate that Jesus might make that claim. Jesus had never said He was the King of the Jews. This is hugely important. Anyone claiming to be the King of the Jews would be setting himself up to be the ruler of the Jewish people and a replacement for rule by Rome. He would be a rebel leading an uprising against Rome. If Jesus claimed to be King of the Jews, Pilate could order his execution and close the case. *Continued on the next page...*

However, Jesus knows that Pilate didn't think of this on his own and Pilate verifies that in saying that the chief priests have handed Jesus over, and asking Jesus what he has done to be handed over. It is a confusing encounter. Jesus doesn't answer the question about what He has done. Rather, He states that His kingdom is not of this world. If it was, His attendants would fight to prevent what was happening. When Pilate seizes on this and asks "So you are a King", Jesus replies "You say I am a king". Then He tells the purpose for the Incarnation: to testify to the truth. And He further states that "everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice". The truth that Jesus brings to the world is His revelation of God. Pilate then asks Jesus "What is truth"? Pilate has no idea what Jesus is talking about, and he isn't very interested in finding out. He ends his interrogation of Jesus with the dismissive question about truth. Yet, the question is not dismissive at all. It is rather profound: what is the truth about Jesus? What is the truth about what He reveals and proclaims?

Reflection: Pilate stands face to face with the Lord of the universe. They are having a conversation. Talk about the potential for an "aha" moment! Keep in mind that Jesus loves Pilate just as He does us and He became man to save Pilate's soul just as He did ours. All the conditions are right for Pilate to detect in Jesus the God for whom his heart longs. Yet, he doesn't. He is in the same room with Jesus, speaking with Him, but he remains unmoved. Why? "Everyone who belongs to the truth listens to my voice". Here Jesus teaches us the secret to intimacy with God. Whoever lets himself be led by what is true will be drawn into communion with Christ and will hear and heed God's ceaseless invitations to follow Him more closely. But being led by truth requires humility and requires recognizing a higher authority than oneself. And that would have been difficult for Pilate. It's difficult for us! We like to think that we are the masters of our own universes and it is rather difficult when we discover we are not. Pilate came face to face with Truth itself, but his worldly ambitions blinded him to it. It might be easy to have a little empathy (not sympathy) with Pilate, because in some ways we might share his ambitions; or at least the tendency of letting our own goals, wants, and needs blind us to more important spiritual realities: blinding us to the truth Jesus brings to us. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) What has Jesus done and how is my life different because of Him? 2) What does it mean for me to be in the kingdom of Jesus? 3) What have I learned from listening to the voice of Jesus? and 4) How do I answer the question, What is truth? *Lord, I want to serve you because you truly are the King. But I still tend so much to serve myself. I want people to do things my way: I want to have what I want, when I want it. I want my plans to work out exactly as I plan them. I guess all of this is **natural** but you want to lead me to the **supernatural** realm. Renew my mind and heart Lord. Thy kingdom come, Thy will be done, not mine...*
