BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading 1: Isaiah 62:1-5: This passage is from the third part of Isaiah and was written in the context of the problems that arose in Judah, particularly Jerusalem, on the return from exile. The initial enthusiasm of the returned exiles was quickly dampened by harsh realities: the land of Judah was in utter destruction and the Israelites did not think they could rebuild it. But rebuild it they did, and the restored Jerusalem is radiant. Isaiah announces the salvation that God will soon fulfill among His people, and it is this salvation which makes Jerusalem radiant. The city has been specifically named Zion and is depicted as the spouse of the Lord. No one will no longer will feel alone or unprotected, for God has shown Jerusalem the tenderness of a young husband. Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 96:1-2, 2-3, 7-8, 9-10 (3): Psalm 96 begins by calling the whole world to praise the Lord because He alone is the true God. Psalm 96 sees salvation as applying to the entire world, which is an announcement of the redemptive work of Christ. This psalm is also a call to all the nations to sing a new song unto the Lord. A "new song" may refer to the fact that this was a newly composed psalm, or to the new situation implied by the belief that the nations will worship the God of Israel (verses 3,7,10). All the people are invited to worship Him in the temple of Jerusalem and to bring offerings for the liturgy. The people are also invited to acknowledge to each other that the God who controls the universe is also He who dispenses justice (verse 10).

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 12:4-11: In our second reading St. Paul takes up the theme of the gifts of the Holy Spirit. God is the origin of spiritual gifts. Probably when St. Paul speaks of gifts, service (ministries), "different workings" he is not referring to graces which are essentially distinct from one another, but to different perspectives from which these gifts can be viewed. The list of special gifts which St. Paul gives here is not meant to be exhaustive. It is quite difficult to identify exactly what each gift involves. What is clear is that the action of the Holy Spirit is enormously fruitful. It is important for us to remember that the Holy Spirit continues to act in the Church. St. Josemaria Escriva reminds us: "Faith reminds us that God is always acting. He has created us and maintains us in existence, and He leads all creation by His grace toward the glorious freedom of the children of God".

Gospel: John 2:1-11: Last week we celebrated the feast of the baptism of the Lord. This week we contemplate the wedding feast at Cana. We have read and heard this passage many times before and we meditate on it as the second luminous mystery of the Rosary. What are we meditating? This passage in John's Gospel presents the "signs" or miracles of Jesus. The wedding feast at Cana invites us to understand the events of Cana as one of the signs that revealed Jesus' identity. In Jesus' time running out of wine at a wedding feast would have been a social disaster for the groom, bride, and their families. Seeing that the wine has run short, Mary turns to Jesus and says "They have no wine". This is not merely an observation; it is also an implicit request for Jesus to do something about it. Mary is not sure what Jesus will do, but she is confident He will do something. She tells the servers "Do whatever He tells you". In the context of the Christian life, Marys' words invite trusting submission to the will of Jesus, a trusting submission she herself demonstrates. Those following Jesus must do whatever He tells them. Jesus turns the water into wine. We aren't told how He did this. It is a sign and signs mean something. The signs Jesus works point to His identity and invite men and women to believe in Him. Their significance must be perceived through the eyes of faith even as they are invitations to greater faith. Not only did Jesus transform the water into wine but excellent wine at that and a lot of it! Continued on the next page...



Perhaps Jesus' producing an abundance of choice wine was possibly a sign that He was transforming practices under the law of Moses into something newer and greater: He was bringing God's means of salvation to fulfillment. What Jesus did in Cana revealed His glory and consequently His disciples began to believe in Him.

Reflection: Mary saw a crisis about to happen and she knew just what to do. She went to Jesus. No one knows Jesus better than His mother. She bore Him in her womb and raised Him from childhood to manhood. Thirty of His thirty-three years on earth were spent in almost constant contact with her. When He begins His public ministry, she fades into the background but remains faithful: when He was in agony on the cross, she was there beside Him. When she says something about Him, therefore, we should take it to heart (just as Jesus took to heart her hint that He should do something about the wine crisis), and in this passage Mary gives us an unambiguous lesson about how to relate to Jesus. It is no coincidence that Mary's last biblical words say everything that needs to be said: "Do whatever He tells you". Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) If I did not already know what Jesus will do, what do I imagine Him doing? 2) Mary says "Do whatever He tells you"; what does this mean to me? 3) What do I believe about Jesus; How can I grow in faith and perception? Lord, I want to know your will, your teaching, and your requirements. I want to learn to hear your voice. I want to live out all the normal responsibilities of my life as you would have me live them out, because I know that if I do, you will make my life bear abundant fruit.


