

Greetings in the name of the Lord:





BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor
Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Sirach 27:4-7: The book of Sirach is a collection of counsels in the form of proverbs, maxims etc. which are really teachings and practical applications as to how someone should live if her/she wants to be in line with the divine wisdom that the Lord gives man. The passage for Mass this weekend focuses on the idea that the reader should understand that behavior flows from the way one thinks. Thoughts and actions have consequences that may come back to haunt us. Sirach tells us the test of a man is in his reasoning. Thus, one's thoughts should reflect the wisdom of the Lord.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 92:2-3, 13-14, 15-16 (see 2a): Psalm 92 tells us that a just man gives thanks to God in whom he trusts. The psalm begins by the psalmist declaring to God how happy it makes him to give God thanks and praise. It is an offering of praise made in a liturgical setting morning and evening. The house of the Lord in verse 13 signifies staying close to the Lord; the environment where the believer lives and continues to yield fruit to the end of his days, just as healthy trees do. This is possible because God never fails the psalmist.

Reading II: 1 Corinthians 15:54-58: This passage comes from the end of Chapter 15. The chapter ends with words of joy and thanksgiving to God for the tremendous benefits bought by the death and resurrection of our Lord: benefits which result from His victory over those enemies which had man their slave – sin, death, and Satan. Jesus, by dying on the cross, has conquered sin and Satan, who attained power through sin. Jesus' victory was completed by His resurrection, which defeated death. The passage becomes a bit confusing in verse 56 in which Paul states the power of sin is the law. He is summarizing his teaching on the connections between sin, death, and the Mosaic Law. Sin is the sting of death in the sense that death entered the world through sin to do harm to men. Sin, says St. Paul, grew as a result of, and was reinforced, by the Mosaic Law: the Law did not induce people to sin but, while it made clear what was to be avoided, it did not provide the *grace* to enable man to *avoid* sin. However, our victory over sin was won in the victory of Jesus over sin and death. The passage closes with St. Paul exhorting us to fight on, full of hope, convinced that work in the ordinary activities of one's day is an offering pleasing to God: a means to holiness and a way to attain final victory with Jesus.

Gospel: Luke 6:39-45: In this passage, Jesus continues the teaching begun in the Gospel passage from last week. Jesus does not immediately explain the parable which opens the passage, but He does note that no disciple is superior to the teacher. This is true because of the nature of their relationship. A disciple studies under a teacher to learn from him or her. If anyone is superior to a teacher, then there is no reason to become a disciple of the teacher. Jesus adds, but when fully trained, every disciple will be like his teacher. After a disciple has been fully trained by a teacher and absorbed all that the teacher has to offer, then the disciple will be on equal footing with the teacher. The disciple will even be like the teacher: disciples were to imitate their teacher's lifestyle as well as learn from them. Next, Jesus uses a rather outrageous comparison to characterize the behavior of *His* disciples. It is as if a disciple has a wooden beam (a felled log) in his or her eye. Although the disciple has a sizable beam in one eye, the disciple does not perceive it. Yet, this disciple is able, or thinks he or she is able, to notice a splinter of wood in the eye of another disciple. Jesus' imagery suggests that His disciples should adopt the perspective, "*My faults are big logs; the faults of others are splinters in comparison*". Not only does the disciple notice the splinter in the eye of another disciple but wants to do something about it!

Those who want to remove a splinter from the eye of another should first make sure that their own vision is up to it. Jesus tells His disciples to remove the wooden beam from their eyes first then they will see clearly to remove the splinter from another person's eye. Removing the beam requires awareness of it: a disciples first task is self- examination. How do we rid ourselves of impairments? Jesus uses the parables of good trees bearing good fruit and a rotten tree bearing rotten fruit. A good tree does not bear rotten fruit. In addition, He teaches that every tree is known by its own fruit. A fig does not come from a thorn bush. Jesus makes it clear that the parables refer to humans and human conduct. His parable about fruit trees and the application He makes of it call for His disciples to examine their interior condition and to judge it based on how they conduct themselves. The wooden beam in their eyes represented whatever impaired their ability to help others. The message of His fruit tree parable is that the root of their impairments lies within them, in what is in their hearts. They can evaluate their hearts (their spiritual condition) by examining their conduct, their words, and their deeds. We can relate Jesus' teaching here back to the passage from Sirach who tells us the test of a person is in his/her reasoning. The just person's reasoning reflects the wisdom of the Lord.

Reflection: St. Luke links three different lessons together in this passage. First, Jesus points out that disciples become like their teachers. Consequently, we should choose our teachers well. The obvious conclusion is to become a disciple of Jesus, the greatest teacher of all. Second, He warns us about the foolishness of useless criticism of others. We are all flawed, so we have no entitlement to pass judgment on others for their flaws. To do so sets us up to look foolish (picture in your mind how foolish a person with a plank in her/her eye would look trying to remove a splinter from the eye of another person). That is what we are like when we adopt a "holier-than-thou" type of attitude which is all so easy to do. Third, ***we must be careful to be Christians who not only talk the talk but also walk the walk.*** The world has plenty of preachers but precious few saints. If we really want to bring others into the kingdom of God, to lead others to Jesus, words will not be enough. Our lives need to bear the irresistible fruit of real virtue. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) Over the course of the last year, have I become more like Jesus? What might I do better to imitate Him? 2) What impairs my ability to help others? What am I doing to remove my impairments? 3) What do my words and actions reveal to me about my inner condition? What changes do I need to make? *Lord, I need you so much. When I am honest with myself, I see that in my heart and in my words, I am still very far from following your teaching. I criticize, I judge, I am closed to other's points of view. You know this. You can change me. You already have. Stay with me Jesus. Keep teaching me to do your will.*

HOLY SPIRIT PRAYER GROUP

To prepare for the Lenten season of prayer and fasting, we will spend the evening in prayer asking God in His Mercy to help us to repent and grow closer to Him this Lent. 
