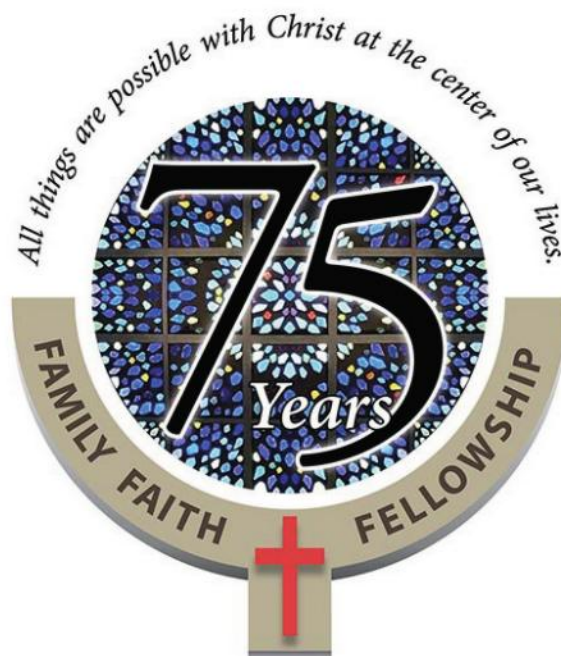

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor
Third Sunday of Easter

Reading I: Acts: 5:27-32, 40b-41: What an amazing segment of Scripture this passage is! Recall after Jesus was arrested, His disciples literally ran for their lives and remained hidden for fear of the Jews. Yet, after the Resurrection, they went about teaching others about the Lord despite the Sanhedrin having warned the apostles to stop teaching in the name of Jesus. So here the disciples are, in front of the Sanhedrin and are once again ordered to stop teaching in the name of Jesus. Peter tells them that they must obey God rather than men which further infuriates the Sanhedrin. At this point, the Sanhedrin is ready to have the disciples executed. Our passage for Mass this weekend does not include verses 33-40, but I am sharing these verses with you, because they tell us why the disciples rejoiced at having been found worthy to be dishonored for Jesus' name. After the Sanhedrin are infuriated by the response of the disciples, a man named Gamaliel, a well respected teacher of the law, stood up and ordered that the disciples be removed from the room. He told the people gathered to be careful in what they were about to do to the disciples. He further explained that other men in the history of Israel had claimed to be important and had large groups of followers. These men were executed, and their followers soon disbanded; their messages faded away. Gamaliel told the people to have nothing further to do with the disciples; if their teaching or "movement" is of human origin, it will destroy itself. *If however, it comes from God, the people will not be able to destroy them and they may even find themselves fighting against God.* Isn't that exactly what happened with the crucifixion? The people were fighting against God and did not know it. So, Gamaliel persuaded the Sanhedrin to simply flog the disciples and let them go. Think about Gamaliel's words. Two thousand years later, we are still teaching in Jesus' name and many still seek to silence us.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 30:2,4, 5-6, 11-12, 13 (2a): Psalm 30 is a psalm of David, and is a psalm of praise to the Lord who saved the psalmist from death. The psalmist promises to praise the Lord for curing him and he invites the faithful to do so also. Divine anger really consists of God "hiding His face" leaving man on his own when he thinks he can fend for himself. The psalmist experienced this but reacted in time and had recourse to God. He told God that his death would have no purpose because if he were to die, he could not praise Him. Life only makes sense for the psalmist because he can praise God.

Reading II: Revelation 5:11-14: The host of angels around the throne act as a kind of honor guard proclaiming the sublime perfection of Christ the Lamb. This hymn is addressed to Him who sits on the throne and thereby puts on the same level God and the Lamb whose Godhead is being proclaimed. The emphatic amen of the four living creatures (representing the manifold actions of God extending to the north, south, east, west) and the worship offered by the elders (comprising the ideal Church including the Old and New Covenant) marks the apex of the universal, cosmic praise that is rendered to the Lamb.

Gospel: John 21:1-19: The risen Lord is again revealing Himself to His disciples, this time seven of them, at the Sea of Tiberias. Peter and the six disciples are fishing (they still needed to earn a living even though Jesus has sent them out with the power of the Holy Spirit). Jesus (on the shore and not recognized by the disciples in the boat) asks them if they have caught any fish. They tell Him they haven't, and He tells them to cast the net over the right side of the boat. They did and could not haul the nets in because of the number of fish. At this Peter recognizes "it is the Lord". Peter then jumped into the water and swam ashore while the other six disciples arrived by boat. *Continued on the next page...*

Jesus is waiting for them on the shore and is cooking breakfast for them! What follows is one of the most touching encounters between Jesus and Peter. Remember, during the passion, Peter denied Jesus three times and was devastated by his denial of the Lord. Now, on the shore Jesus asks Peter three times if he loves Him. Peter responds each time *"Lord, you know I love you"*. Jesus has given Peter the opportunity to undo the denials. Peter's denials were a failure of love as well as of nerve: Peter chose his own well-being over his allegiance to Jesus. Yet a failure of love does not mean that there was no love at all but only that the love was not up to what was required of it. Jesus is now telling Peter to feed and tend His sheep. Peter is to shepherd Jesus' flock and to nourish them. The risen Lord sends His disciples to carry on His work, entrusting the role of shepherding to Peter (an in our own time Pope Francis) even while Jesus remains the chief shepherd. Jesus the good shepherd laid down His life for His sheep. Peter's response to the call to shepherd Jesus' sheep will lead to his own death. But we already saw Peter's willingness (as well as the other disciples) to suffer to teach in Jesus' name in the first reading from Acts.

Reflection: Until the scene from John 21, Peter may have been doubting whether after his failure (denial of Jesus), he was still worthy of the mission Jesus had entrusted to him. He was called to be the visible head of the Church, the instrument of Church unity – a mission that Peter's successors, the popes, will continue until Christ's return in glory. In the conversation in John 21, Jesus reinstates Peter in his critical role. He commands him three times. The context of this renewed commission, however, reinforces the lesson Peter had learned on Good Friday. The key to Peter's ability to resume his role and fulfill his mission will not be his natural capacities, however notable and apt they may be. Rather, what will enable him to stay faithful and succeed in his God-given task is his personal union with Jesus; his love for and dependence on Christ. We all fall as Peter did when he denied the Lord. We, like Peter, are subsequently approached by the Lord who wishes to reinstate us in our place in the Church, to recommission us in our vocation. Jesus' grace and our response of love, feeble and inconstant though it may be, are more than enough for such a reinstatement and recommission and they are more than enough for everlasting success. We simply need to renew that response of love in prayer and then live it out by obeying His will. Perhaps in the coming week we might reflect on the following: **1)** What is the lesson for me in Peter's eagerness to be with Jesus? **2)** What do I learn from Jesus' cooking breakfast for His disciples? **3)** How much do I love Jesus? **4)** When has my love for Jesus not been up to what was required of it? *Lord, you know everything so you know that I love you even though I have failed you so many times. I get so wrapped up in secondary things. I go through my day and compromise my commitments, letting myself get swept into the self-seeking ways of the world. But you never fail to seek me out, to feed me with your Word and your Eucharist. You are always faithful. Your grace is always there. Renew me again now, Lord and accept my renewed profession of love....*
