

The Church as Missionary

Every year, the month of October is dedicated to the missionary activities of the Church. We remind ourselves that the Church is sent forth to proclaim the Good News because essentially it is her nature. The Second Vatican Council notes this in the Decree "Ad Gentes," that "The pilgrim Church is missionary by her very nature, since it is from the mission of the Son and the mission of the Holy Spirit that she draws her origin, in accordance with the decree of God the Father" (AG 2). Thus, the Church is tasked to spread the Good News by proclaiming it, calling us to conversion. The Church is driven by the Holy Spirit to spread the Word. Christ Himself said: "the Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He anointed me; to bring good news to the poor, He sent me to heal the broken-hearted, to proclaim to the captives release, and give sight to the blind." (Luke 4:18). And again: "The Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." (Luke 19:10). Christ therefore fulfilled His mission by ministering to His people in word and in deed.

We are the Church through our baptism and we are filled with the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Good News through the faith we have received. We as a community of believers are therefore, sent forth with a message of Christ. We go to the world. We do not expect the world to come to us. Jesus first sent the twelve and later sent out in pairs the seventy-two. We also have to re-evangelize ourselves because some of us need to be awakened from our slumber. (To be continued next week).



BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Exodus 17: 8-13: The book of Exodus is the second book of the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Bible), and it records most of the history of the children of Israel. The accounts in Exodus cover the most important events in the history of Israel. Our reading for this weekend is from the part of Exodus which details the departure of God's people from Egypt. The passage for Mass this weekend finds God's people struggling mightily in the desert. In addition to shortages of food and water, the Israelites also had to cope with attacks from other groups in the desert, over rights to wells and pastures. The Israelites are under attack from the Amalekites, an ancient people who were spread all over the north of the Sinai Peninsula, the Negeb, Seir, and the South of Canaan. In the Bible they were a perennial enemy of Israel for generations. Joshua leads the Israelites in battle against the Amalekites while Moses directs the battel from a distance with the rod of God in his hands. Moses' hands are elevated in prayer to God. He is interceding for his people asking God to give them victory. As long as Moses had his hands up, Israel prevailed but when his hands were lowered the Amalekites prevailed. Moses' hands grew weary so Aaron and Hur hold his hands up so that Israel might have victory. The early Church Fathers, especially Tertullian and St. Cyprian, interpret this episode as a figure of the action of Christ who, on the Cross (symbolized here by the rod) won victory over the devil and death.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 121: 1-2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8: This psalm belongs to a group of psalms known collectively as Psalms of Ascent and includes Psalms 120-134. The word ascent indicates a step or an upward climb. According to most interpreters including the ancient rabbis, these psalms were sung as the pilgrims ascended the steps leading into the temple. These psalms are certainly related to the annual "going up" to Jerusalem and may have been grouped together to be used in the liturgy of some feast. This particular psalm records the faith and trust a pilgrim feels as he sets out on his journey and focuses on the Lord's protection; the same protection for which Moses prayed in the first reading. Everything man does falls under that divine protection. Even when life may not be particularly going well and God may seem distant, He is there.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2: The passage for Mass this weekend is about staying true to Scripture. St. Paul tells Timothy that all books of the Bible are inspired by God and therefore are a great help to the Church in its mission. The books of Holy Scripture enjoy special authority because the divinely revealed realities which are contained in Sacred Scripture, have been written down under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit they have God as their author and have been handed on as such to the Church herself. The last part of this passage is what Biblical scholars consider to be part of St. Paul's last will and testament. He appears to be "bequeathing" his faith to Timothy. He gives Timothy an obligation to carry on St. Paul's ministry; to preach the message of the Gospel even in adverse circumstances especially when people are disinclined to accept the Christian message ("in season and out of season").

Gospel: Luke: 18: 1-8: The Gospel passage for this weekend finds Jesus speaking to His disciples about His coming in the future to establish God's reign in its fullness. He is teaching by means of the parable of the unjust judge. This parable is a very powerful, well expressed lesson, about the effectiveness of persevering, confident prayer. Jesus compares God with the unjust judge. If even an unjust judge ends up giving justice to the widow who kept pleading her case, how much more will God, who is infinitely just and who is our Father, listen to the persevering prayer of His children. God, in other words, gives justice to His elect if they persist in seeking His help. When Jesus asks will He find faith on earth when He returns, He is not seeking a yes or no answer. He is exhorting His followers to persevere to the end despite any delay; remaining faithful to prayer, filled with hope and expectation. Continued on the next page...

Reflection: Our readings for this weekend are all about prayer and keeping the faith. Jesus combines His teaching about perseverance in prayer with a serious warning about the need to remain firm in the faith: faith and prayer go hand in hand. St. Augustine wrote that faith causes prayer to grow and when prayer grows our faith is strengthened. Prayer is necessary because through it we recognize our human limitations and our dependence: we came from God, we belong to God, and we return to God! Prayer is a mysterious but real dialogue with God, a dialogue of confidence and love. Prayer gives inner strength and consolation; it gives the strength for great ideas, love, and generosity. Prayer gives light by which to see and consider the events of one's own life and of history in the salvific perspective of God and eternity. Jesus calls us to pray tirelessly and unceasingly. When Moses grew weary, Aaron and Hur helped him sustain his prayer. Aaron, Hur, and Moses provided us with an image of group prayer. St. Antoninus parish has several prayer groups which offer excellent opportunities to pray as community. Jesus was teaching about standing firm in the faith also. St. Paul exhorted Timothy to keep the faith, to pass it on even in adverse circumstances. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) Are we passing on our faith as parents, grandparents, and Godparents? 2) Are we passing on our faith as friends? In our society today, the Christian message is not well received. Jesus warns us to stay watchful and to persevere in the faith and in prayer even though people around us fall away. 3) If we don't pass on the faith and pray, who will? Lord, I believe in you and have put my hopes in you. I love you though my love is weak and thin at times. If thousands ignore you, I at least want to stay close to you. Guide me, lead me along the path of your wisdom and your peace. Make me a channel of your peace and grace......

DAILY GOSPEL REFLECTIONS ON ST. A WEBSITE:

There will be a very short reflection on the Gospel passage for daily Mass, Monday through Saturday written by Kathy O'Connor. The Gospel passage will be identified (for example Luke 10:25-37) and be followed by the reflection which will be just one or two lines in the form of a question for us to ponder. This might allow you to refer back to the passage at your leisure if you are not able to attend weekday Masses. If you do attend daily Mass or if you read the weekday Mass readings, or read the passages on your own, the reflections may help us be guided by Jesus in the course of our days.
