

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Sirach 35:12-14; 16-18: The Book of Sirach is one of the Old Testament books known as the wisdom books. According to Pope St. John Paul II it is one of the books in which "Holy Scripture indicates with remarkably clear cues how deeply related are the knowledge conferred by faith and the knowledge conferred by reason". While never quoted formally, this book seems to be echoed in many New Testament passages in words of our Lord reported in the Gospels and in the exhortations in the Letter of St. Paul and St. James. The passage for Mass this weekend is part of the book that tells us just who God is and the person to whom God listens. God listens to the one who is wronged, the orphan, and the widow. God also listens to those who serve Him and those who are humble. As the author of Sirach says, God does not play favorites, but His attention is fixed in a special way both on those who suffer injustice and those who do justice. Many of the qualities (those of God and those who have recourse to Him) can be found all together in Jesus' attitude toward the sick, the sinners, and the poor.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 34:2-3, 17-18, 19, 23 (7a): Our responsorial psalm for this weekend is a psalm of David in which we are invited to praise the Lord for He is good and brings deliverance. Those who are wise, seek refuge in Him. The psalm was written when David faked madness before Abimelech. Abimelech was frightened by what he saw and fled. To reinforce his invitation, the psalmist projects himself as a teacher of wisdom who instructs people on how to be good. This passage tells us to always speak well of others because this is how those who seek peace conduct themselves. Those who speak well of others are called "blessed" by the Lord. However, righteousness does not depend completely on upright conduct or perfection. What really identifies the just person is his or her repentance and humble recourse to the Lord.

Reading II: 2 Timothy 4:6-8; 16-18: Paul is in prison awaiting martyrdom and preparing Timothy to take his place preaching the Gospel after he dies. In this passage, St. Paul presents death as the beginning of a journey saying "the point of my departure has come". He is describing the Christian life as a type of spiritual sport: races indicates the continuous effort to achieve perfection and fighting represents the effort required to resist sin even if that means death, as can happen in the event of persecution (just as it has with St. Paul). In earthly competitions a man fights and strives for days or months and the only reward that is given is a temporary medal and recognition. However, in the "spiritual sport" the crown the victor (all who remain faithful) is, according to St. John Chrysostom, a glory and honor whose brilliance lasts forever. The reward is, of course, eternal life. Paul points out to Timothy the difference between the way men treat him and how God treats him. It seems that Timothy's friends have deserted him because of the hazards involved in remaining close to Paul. God, however, desert neither Timothy nor Paul. Paul tells Timothy that God will rescue him (Paul) from every evil. This does not mean that Paul will not be martyred. It does mean that God will give him the grace to endure what he is facing.

Gospel: Luke 18: 9-14: Today's passage is a continuation of Luke's presentation of Jesus' teaching on prayer. Jesus uses the parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector to teach the importance of prayer coming from a humble heart. The Pharisee and the tax collector are a study in contrasts. The Pharisee is steadfast in externally complying with the law while the tax collector is viewed as a sinner. In his prayer the Pharisee is telling God how wonderful he (the Pharisee) is! Not once does he mention any of his wrong doings and the only gratitude he offers to God is that he (the Pharisee) is not like other people. Thus, he is full of self – importance considering himself to be so much better than other people. He is not repentant and remains in his sinful state. On the other hand, the tax collector is humble. He will not even lift his eyes up to heaven as he prays! *Continued on the next page...*

He recognizes his wrong doings and asks God to be merciful to him, a sinner. He is sincerely sorry for his sins and his seeking God's forgiveness. His prayer is pleasing to God and he will receive forgiveness.

Reflection: Humility is a theme in all of the readings and the psalm for this weekend. St. Paul appears to be bragging to Timothy that he has finished the race, fought the good fight, and kept the faith. How is this different from the prayer of the Pharisee in the Gospel? The Pharisee is commenting on his strengths while condemning and despising everyone else. St. Paul on the other hand, is grateful for all God has given him, including his impending martyrdom, while the Pharisee is grateful for what he perceives as his superiority to others. Humility involves being nonjudgmental. The Pharisee talks the talk but he doesn't walk the walk of faith. Part of walking the faith is putting one's faith into action. There is a definite pecking order in human societies. Everyone looks for a way to be superior to other people. The Christian is called to do the exact opposite: we are called to serve others and love others, especially those we deem to be undeserving. This is walking the walk. Christians are called to walk the walk just as Jesus did. It is easy to love and do things for people we consider to be "worthy" but the real measure of our love and service is to care for those for whom it is difficult to care for and to do so with a nonjudgmental attitude. We must strive to resist the temptation to judge others, even those who are scornful of our faith. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) How well do I think I measure up to what God expects of me; who do I look upon, who do not appear to measure up as well as I think I do; 2) What do I see of myself in the Pharisee; what do I see of myself in the tax collector; 3) What is the chief lesson of Jesus' parable for me? Lord, I ask you to have mercy on me for all the selfishness I know about and all the selfishness I'm unaware of. And I ask you to have mercy on all sinners. It is your mercy that makes your glory shine! Teach me to confide in your mercy no matter what and to be merciful, forgiving, gentile, and humble especially with those who don't deserve it....
