

#### Celebrating the Saints

#### Who are the Saints?

They are those who have journeyed from this earth to the other side of life where they live in the presence of God. They awaken us to the presence of God! The Saints remind us that there is another place beyond this world. They journeyed through this world understanding that the challenges in this world are worth experiencing because they open us up to an all-important experience of God who is all compassionate, forgiving and merciful.

The Saints were all like us, weak and flawed but they saw God's strength in their weakness and gave their lives in complete surrender to God. Saint Pope John XXIII once said: "Saintliness results from learning the art of self-giving love. It flows from dying to self, from laughing at one's own foibles and humbly enduring the foibles of others. Saints aren't so much superstars of holiness as humble sinners, ready to allow God to love them just as they are." Yes, the Saints endured their own foibles and learned from them. They teach us about life and about the Kingdom of God. They also pray for us by interceding God on our behalf.

#### The Challenges They Endured in Their Apostolate

The saints also teach us a lot about our ministry. Some of them stood against injustice in their communities, countries and in the world. Others showed extraordinary courage in the face of adversity. Some demonstrated the spirit of simplicity and humility, others stood against injustice while others dedicated themselves to bring about equality and justice in their society. Their work of compassion, mercy, forgiveness, love and justice still continues to live on in our lives, our communities and the whole Earth.

#### What They Teach Us

Their lives teach us an uncompromising love of God and neighbor and point us to the direction of witnessing to their lives in our apostolate. They teach us about the beatitudes urging us to watch and see those who are constantly working under severe conditions to bring about peace, hear the cry of the poor and work to lift them up from their poverty. In other words, the Saints remind us that the Beatitudes are the things we Christians should be doing; that they are openings for us to see the face of God in those we serve.

We are all therefore saints in the making. We rely on their intercessions for Christian motivation and courage to bring about the Kingdom of God through the engagements of the Beatitudes. Let us march on with the Saints because we form a communion with them.

## BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Kathy O'Connor 31st Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading I: Wisdom 11:22-12:2: The first reading for Mass this weekend is a study in God's steadfast love and mercy towards all created things. While not a new message, this passage boldly states the universal range of God's mercy toward fallen man and the love that is at work in creation and its conservation. Writing on this passage, St. Thomas Aquinas said that God would never have created something which He would then not love. The love of God creates and fills all things with goodness. Therefore, when God punishes man as He sometimes does, His intention is always one of love and mercy. The Wisdom author is telling us in this passage that we, as God's creation, should be filled with joy and confidence knowing that God does not abandon His creatures to themselves. Rather, He upholds us and sustains us. In reading the final sentence of this passage, picture the ideal parent or teacher who, motivated by love, never ceases coaxing children to repentance by inviting them, little by little, to face the sins that dull their senses and prevent them from experiencing the fullness of God's love. We are invited to turn from sin in order to taste the sweetness of God's mercy.

<u>Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 145:1-2, 8-9, 10-11, 13, 14:</u> The psalm this weekend is a psalm of David, in which we are invited to praise God for His greatness and mercy which endures forever. It focuses on the goodness of the Lord and recalls His covenant with man. The universality of God is seen in the way He protects the weak and elevates those who are burdened.

Reading II: 2 Thessalonians 1:11-2:2: St. Paul helped to establish the Church in Thessalonica and in the beginning of the passage for this weekend, he is assuring the community that he seeks to sustain them through prayer. The community of Thessalonica has been disturbed by "teachings" or proclamations outside of the Church that the "end times" were upon them. This news had caused great emotional unrest amongst the Thessalonians. In the early Church, false teachings often were given by sources who tried to pass off their information as having come from Paul himself. St. Paul confronts the false teaching. Today in our own time, there are attempts to identify the date of the "end of the world" and to introduce other false teaching to the faithful. We are reminded by Vatican II of how to identify such subjective information: "The task of giving an authentic interpretation, whether in its written form or in the form of Tradition, has been entrusted to the living teaching office of the Church alone. Its authority is exercised in the name of Jesus Christ" (Dei Verbum, 10).

**Gospel: Luke 19:1-10:** We have, in this passage, a beautiful example of how Jesus touches the lives of sinners.

The Gospel passage for this weekend presents us with the conversion story of Zacchaeus, a wealthy tax collector. Tax collectors in the time of Jesus were hated by the citizenry because they were frequently collaborators of the Roman authorities and were often guilty of abuses. This passage from Luke implies that Zacchaeus had some things for which he was seeking forgiveness. He was highly motivated to see Jesus, no doubt moved by the Holy Spirit. There was a large



crowd of people who did not like Zacchaeus and who were not pleased to have him in their midst. But he swallowed his pride and persisted. In order to see Jesus, Zacchaeus climbs a tree! Jesus calls to him by name and tells him to come down from the tree. Jesus rewards Zacchaeus' efforts by staying at his house. Moved by the presence of Jesus, Zacchaeus begins to lead a new life. The crowd begins to grumble about Jesus showing kindness to a man they consider to be an evil doer. Jesus simply explains that this is exactly why He has come: to seek out sinners. He is putting into practice the parable of the lost sheep which had been prophesied in Ezekiel. *Continued on the next page...*

Reflection: The readings for Mass this weekend have the common themes of God's love for all of His creation and mercy. The author of Wisdom tells us that not only does God loves His creation but He remains actively involved with all of creation through divine providence. He seeks us out and is available to us. All we have to do is accept His invitation to let Him into our lives. And when we do, the psalmist tells us that God's mercy is always available to us. The Gospel for this weekend presented us with a scene in which Zacchaeus, a sinner accepts Jesus into his life and his life is forever changed! St. Paul, the author of the second reading is also an example of how Jesus transforms people's lives. St. Paul once persecuted members of the early Church but after his encounter with the risen Christ, became one of the strongest evangelists the Church has ever known. Zacchaeus and St. Paul are examples of how Jesus seeks out sinners. In a way, the Liturgy of the Word for this weekend is about conversion. When one believes in Jesus, one's life is forever changed just as Zacchaeus' life changed. The Gospel for this weekend is dear to my heart for, like Zacchaeus, I too am a convert to the Catholic faith. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) Do I have ambivalence about drawing too close to Jesus; what holds me back; 2) When have I done what I needed to do in order to become closer to Jesus; how has He responded to me; 3) How did Jesus seek me out and find me; what has He saved me from? Lord: I want to bring many souls into your friendship. I want to go out and find the Zacchaeuses, the ones everyone else has given up on. I want to speak to them about your goodness and your love, your forgiveness, and the meaning you give to life. But I am inconsistent and distracted. You knew that when you made me your disciple. You can be my strength Lord.....

#### The Continuing Message of Fatima



Sister Lucia, the eldest of the 3 children of Fatima, received from the Blessed Mother, the devotion of the First Saturday of the month. Extra ordinary promises are given to those persons, whom on Five Consecutive Saturdays do the following:

Go to Confession in a reasonable amount of time before the First Saturday. (Our Church will have our Holy Hour on the  $1^{st}$  Thursday before the First Friday each month.) Confession will be available on all these Thursdays.

Receive Holy Communion in the state of Grace, and offer that Communion in reparation for the sins against the Most Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Recite five Decades of the Rosary.

Keep the Blessed Mother company for 15 minutes, while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Her most Immaculate Heart. This can be done anywhere.

The Blessed Mother in exchange for your commitment to the five First Saturdays told Sister Lucia that:

"I will assist (be present) at the hour of your death (the person fulfilling the request) with all the graces necessary for salvation....)". A powerful promise from our Mother.

Why five first Saturdays? According to Sister Lucia, they were requested to atone for the five ways in which people offend the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

Attacks upon Mary's Immaculate Conception.

Attacks against her Perpetual Virginity.

Attacks upon her Divine Maternity and the refusal to accept her as the Mother of all mankind.

For those who try to publicly implant in children's hearts indifference, contempt and even hatred of this Immaculate Mother.

For those who insult her directly in her sacred images.

#### ST. ANTONINUS NETWORK OF CARE

Relating to the Gospel passage about p Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31), consider another area of poverty--loneliness. The St. Antoninus Network of Care would like to remind everyone to open our eyes and hearts to identify those in our midst who may be lonely. It could be someone of any age. It could be people who don't get out much or live alone or don't have close family. It could be someone undergoing cancer treatments or experiencing the loss of a loved one. 
