Greetings in the name of the Lord:

As we look out over the world there is no doubt that we are experiencing dark forces that are challenging to all of us. At every turn we are experiencing the reality of evil. If we do not believe that evil exists; we are deceiving ourselves.

On October 1st, 1884 Pope Leo XIII had a most troubling vision immediately after celebrating Mass, in which satan is speaking to Our Lord Jesus Christ saying that he could destroy the Church in 75 to 100 years if given the opportunity. According to the vision Our Lord responded with permission to try. This is very similar to how the Book of Job begins. Pope Leo responded to the vision by composing a lengthy prayer to St. Michael the Archangel and instructed the Church around the world to pray the prayer at the conclusion of Holy Mass. For Leo, this prayer reminds us of the help we need in the battle against the forces of darkness and against the spirit of the world.

The regular praying of this prayer at Mass ceased in 1964. However, evil and darkness have not ceased. Pope St. John Paul II encouraged the praying of the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel, and so has Pope Francis. To that end we are going to begin praying the prayer to St. Michael the Archangel at the conclusion of Holy Mass. The prayer will be prayed as a parish immediately following the dismissal, but before the concluding hymn. The lengthy prayer of Pope Leo III was shortened into the prayer that we are familiar with today.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle.

Be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil.

May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou,

O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God,

cast into hell satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

This prayer will be included in the bulletin each week immediately before the closing hymn.

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor 16TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Wisdom 12:13; 16-19: In the tradition of the Latin Church this book is usually titled "Book of Wisdom". In the Greek Churches, it has been called "The Wisdom of Solomon". This book does not at any time mention King Solomon but it has been attributed to him on account of his reputation for wisdom and because it is deduced that the author, for purpose of writing, adopts the persona of Solomon. While it is an anonymous work, Biblical scholars believe that the book was written in Greek by an Alexandrian Jew. The passage for Mass this weekend is taken from a section of the book that speaks to God's sovereignty. This passage follows a passage in which the author discusses God's mercy toward the Canaanites, whose sinfulness was legendary in the Old Testament times. The author's point is that in view of the mercy God showed even to the Canaanites, no one can accuse God of injustice in judgments. God is both righteous and sovereign in punishing the nations, so that no earthly king can lodge a complaint. Still, God judges with mildness and governs the world with great forbearance (verse 18).

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 86:5-6, 9-10, 15-16 (5a): Psalm 86 is a prayer of David for help in staying true to the Lord, the God of the Covenant. There are frequent references to God's steadfast love and mercy (verses 5 and 15). Thus it continues the theme from the first reading. The psalmist knows that God, being who He is, listens to him when he pleads for help, and this conviction, in turn, gives strength to his prayer. Because the psalmist knows that God listens to him he gives God praise, acknowledging Him to be the only God there is. In verses 15 & 16 the psalmist acknowledges God's graciousness then asks for God's help in learning to walk in God's truth.

Reading II: Romans 8: 26-27: The first reading described God's righteousness, sovereignty, and forbearance. In the responsorial psalm the psalmist, ever mindful of God's graciousness, is praying that he might be steadfast in his walk with God because it is not always easy to avoid straying from the path. Human weakness because of our fallen nature limits us. It is this weakness that St. Paul addresses in the second reading for Mass this weekend. The Holy Spirit helps us in our weakness by interceding for us with the Father. God is very active in our lives through the action of the Holy Spirit. St. Josemaria Escriva addressed this saying "The action of the Holy Spirit may pass unnoticed because God does not reveal to us His plans, and because man's sin obscures the divine gifts. But faith tells us that God is always acting. He has created us and maintains us in existence, and He is leading all creation by His grace towards the glorious freedom of the children of God."

Gospel: Matthew 13: 24-43: The Gospel passage for Mass this weekend is a continuation of the passage for last weekend. Jesus again is teaching in parables about the kingdom of heaven. The parable in this reading is referred to the parables of the weeds, so we are again learning about seeds (wheat) and weeds to help us understand about the kingdom of heaven. Jesus tells us that the seeds have been planted in a good fertile field. The owner of the field has sown the seeds at just the right time with great skill. He even has watchmen to make sure the field is protected, but even so, an enemy comes by night and sowed weeds among the wheat. Thus, the wheat and the weeds grow side by side. Biblical scholars identify the weeds in this passage as cockle

which looks very much like wheat. If the cockle mistakenly gets ground with the wheat, the resulting flour is contaminated. Bread made from this flour causes severe nausea when eaten. Yet, the owner of the field wants the weeds left in place until the harvest at which time the weeds and wheat will be separated. Jesus then tells the parable of the mustard seed which is the smallest of all seeds, yet when it is mature it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree capable of sustaining nesting birds. The final parable

compares the kingdom of heaven to leaven that ferments dough. Mustard seeds, wheat, weeds, slow growing crops, and leaven? What are we to learn from this? Continued on the next page...

Reflection: Jesus knows why He has come: to establish a kingdom. His confidence in this kingdom is absolute: it will endure and grow to fruition. Enemies will act against it but they cannot stop it. His kingdom, in the seminal form of the Church, has already outlasted empires, wars, invasions, heresies, disasters, and every imaginable happenstance and glitch in history for 20 centuries: still intact and recognizable. This kingdom has certain characteristics that Jesus wants us to recognize. First, the kingdom is always growing. It started small when Christ established it and it starts small whenever it takes root anew, but it is always growing. This growth takes place on all levels: individual souls, a parish community, and the Church as a whole. Christ's kingdom is alive and always growing. Second, opposition and contradiction will always beset it. Weeds and wheat grow together side by side. Even as our faith deepens, we still have a tendency to sin. The Catholic Church itself never lacks for scandals within and assaults from without. Critics often point out sins committed by Catholics as a sign that it is not Christ's true Church. But did Judas' betrayal undo Peter's perseverance? Third, the kingdom's impact will always be out of proportion to its dimensions. Just as a little leaven makes the whole loaf rise, a little holiness sends ripples throughout the world. For example, St. Teresa of Calcutta was as famous as the world's great kings, queens, business tycoons, and celebrities. Similarly, all the faithful ordinary people who fill their souls with Christ's love are spreading the grace of God far and wide, but their impact will only truly be known at the end of the age. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) what is the message of the parable of the mustard seed for me; 2) how am I to be leaven in my own personal circumstances; 3) what is my reaction to the picture Jesus paints of evil continuing in the world despite His mission; 4) what have I heard in Jesus' interpretation of the parable of the weeds? Lord, you have taught me to expect weeds among the wheat. Why am I surprised and scandalized at evil? In your wisdom, you permit the wheat and weeds to grow up together. Help me to accept your will, to seek and promote the good, and to never be discouraged, surprised, or thrown off track by the evil I encounter, wherever it may be. Jesus, I trust in you.....
