# BREAKING OPEN THE WORD with Dr. Kathy O'Connor 18<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I: Isaiah 55:1-3: Our first reading for Mass this weekend is an invitation to partake of the banquet of the Lord's covenant. The oracles in this passage and in subsequent verses are a call to conversion; a call to take advantage of the salvific gifts to generously offered. Originally this call to conversion was a call to those exiled in Babylon to return to Jerusalem; but it is a call that is made at all times to everyone. In verse three the Lord says through Isaiah that He will renew the everlasting covenant keeping promises He made to David. This can be read by Christians as an invitation to share in the new and eternal covenant sealed with the blood of our Lord. It is a pledge of salvation for all mankind. In the Eucharist, the banquet of the New Testament, the words of Isaiah come true in the complete sense in the words spoken by Jesus when He instituted that sacrament: "Take and eat" (verse 1), the true bread of life, the very finest food, which money cannot buy (verses 1-3). Therefore, the invitation extended by the prophet is a call to Christians to partake of the Eucharist. Writing about the Eucharist, Pope Paul VI said: "It is the pinnacle, here on earth, of the covenant of love between God and His people: the sign and source of Christian joy, the preparation of the eternal banquet in heaven".

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 145:8-9, 15-16, 17-18 (16): The psalm for this weekend is a psalm of David. It is a psalm of praise to the Lord who is great and merciful; whose kingdom endures forever. The greatness of God is seen in the mighty deeds He performs through all generations, reflecting His goodness. Verses 8 and 9 reflect the first reading: God of the covenant which He extends to all. God provides food to all living beings. The Lord's kingdom is just: He responds with kindness and salvation to all who invoke Him and love Him.

Reading II: Romans 8:35, 37-39: St. Paul, in this passage from Romans, echoes the theme of Isaiah and the psalm of God providing for His people. Nothing can separate us from the Lord's love. St. Paul tells us that nothing, and no created thing, is stronger than God's love for us. In keeping with the theme of the banquet in the first reading, Paul tells us that God will not withhold all the graces we need; all we need to assure us of this is the desire to receive this divine help (the theme of conversion in Isaiah).

<u>Gospel: Matthew 14:13-21:</u> Our passage from Matthew focuses on Jesus' reaction to hearing the news of John the Baptist's death. On hearing of John's death at the hands of Herod Antipas, He withdrew to be alone. It is possible that Jesus perceived John's death as a foreshadowing of His own and wanted solitude to reflect and pray about what lay ahead. However, the people had heard that Jesus had set out in a boat and they


followed Him. Some even arrived by foot at His destination before He did! He might have been frustrated to see such a crowd waiting for Him when He wanted to be alone. Yet, when He saw the crowd waiting for Him, His heart was moved with pity. The Greek word translated by the phrase his heart was moved with pity means to have a deep reaction of compassion. Jesus is profoundly moved by their needs. They had tracked Him down so He could heal their sick in His compassion, He healed them for such a long time that the dinner hour had passed. Although they were in a deserted area, there was a town nearby in walking distance.

As evening approached, the disciples, concerned for the crowd's well-being suggested the people should walk to the town so they could buy food for themselves. A good common-sense suggestion! But Jesus tells them there is no need for the people to go away. Think about it. The crowd would only need to go away if Jesus could not meet their needs. By saying the crowd should not leave, Jesus was indicating that He could meet their needs and by extension, all human needs. Yet, Jesus tells the disciples "you give them something to eat".

True, there is no need for anyone to go away from Jesus to have their needs met, but Jesus meets needs through His followers. The message for Matthew's readers is that Jesus want to meet the needs of others through them. We know that the disciples had little food with them: five loaves and two fish. We are familiar with the multiplication of the fish and loves. We are so familiar with it that we might miss the point. Matthew's focus is on Jesus' taking the little the disciples could provide Him and it becomes enough to satisfy a massive crowd. It became more than enough: there were significant leftovers. It is the fact that there are leftovers that is significant: Jesus meets needs abundantly. Jesus can take the little we have and make it an abundance for others. In



Isaiah we were called to participate in the banquet of the Lord's covenant. Jesus' feeding of the crowd is an image for Jesus' nourishing His followers in the Eucharist.

Reflection: John the Baptist's death moves Jesus deeply. He wants some solitude to think and pray but it is not to be. Jesus puts aside His own sorrow and needs to minister to the crowd. St. Matthew emphasizes this perhaps to draw a parallel between Jesus' self-giving in His time of sorrow and the culmination of Jesus' selfgiving: the Eucharist. The four verbs that describe what Jesus does with the five loaves (take, bless, break, and give) are the same four verbs that describe what Jesus did with the bread that becomes His body during the last supper. It is a summary of Christian theology. Jesus does the same with each of His disciples: He calls them, pours out His grace on them, gives them a share of the cross, and sends them into the world to make more disciples. The Eucharist is Jesus' ongoing love affair with the souls for whom He died, and it makes what it teaches (self-forgetting love), actually happen in those who receive it with faith. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) what significance do I find in Jesus' feeding of the crowd, 2) how hungry am I for what Jesus offers me, 3) to what extent do I look upon myself as Jesus' instrument for meeting human needs, and 4) however little it may be, what am I able to put in the hands of Jesus for Him to use? Lord, I have benefited from your self-giving love, your compassion, your generosity. Even when I was too self-absorbed to look for help you have come to my aid. Thank you, Lord. Now teach me to do the same with those around me. Teach me to forget myself. I have a few loaves and a few fish. Help me put them into Your hands. Help me to put all my talents, treasure, and time at the service of your kingdom, out of love for You and for my neighbor. Nothing else will last....


