

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD WITH DR. KATHY O'CONNOR, PH.D. March 21, 2021 Fifth Sunday of Lent

Reading I: Jeremiah 31:31-34: This passage from Jeremiah contains the oracle on the new Covenant. The oracle consists of two parts: 1) verses 31-32 describe the old Covenant which was broken by the people's sins and 2) verses 33-35 speaks powerfully of the new Covenant that will last forever. The old Covenant is described in terms of three characteristic features: it carried the force of tradition because it was a pact made with "the fathers"; it was a sign of divine election; and it showed the Lord's authority over His people. The new Covenant also has three key features: it is new; it is interior; and it is heartfelt (written upon the peoples' hearts). It is new in the sense that it is definitive and will not be superseded. At the Last Supper Jesus says these words over the chalice "This is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant...". With these words Jesus brings to fulfillment the words of Jeremiah. It is interior because it is etched in the heart of the people collectively and in each person. The content of the covenant did not change (it is the law of God) but people will know it in a different way: the previous covenant was written on tablets of stone but this one will be written on the heart and soul of man. Therefore, it is part of a person's very being it is not just an external obligation. And it is heartfelt because it is based on a loving relationship between God and His people. Jeremiah's words "I will be their God and they shall be my people" speaks to bonds of fidelity and love between God and His people. Therefore, moral imperatives should not come via legal imposition from outside; they should arise from a person's heart, the goal of which is living in union with God.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 51:3-4, 12-13, 14-15 (12a): Psalm 51 is a Psalm of David and is a plea for purification from sin and for a heart made clean. It is a penitential psalm that David prayed after he admitted his sin of adultery with Bathsheba and for having arranged for the death of her husband Uriah. The psalmist begins the prayer by asking God to take away his sin; he then acknowledges he is a sinner. There is no escaping the fact that it is an offence against God and the psalmist deeply regrets offending God. He begs God to renew his inner being which will allow him to dwell in the presence of God. He promises God he will tell others of God's benevolence toward him. He promises to offer an acceptable sacrifice; a sacrifice that comes from his heart.

Reading II: Hebrews 5:7-9: This passage from Hebrews is a brief summary of Christ's life and stresses His perfect obedience to the Father's will. The point is made that Jesus set His power aside and despite His being the only begotten Son of God, out of obedience chose to die on the cross. The passage also points to Jesus' prayer the summit of which occurred in the agony in the garden the night before His passion. Jesus' suffering was connected with His generosity in obedience. He freely chose to obey even unto death consciously atoning for the first sin which was a sin of disobedience. How was He made perfect? Obviously, Jesus as God could not increase in perfection but remember He took on our humanity. So, in what sense could He be "made perfect"? St. Thomas Aquinas provides the answer: "Christ through His passion, achieved a special glory: the impassibility and glorification of His body. Moreover, He attained the same perfections as we shall participate in when we are raised from the dead in glory, those of us who believe in Him".

Gospel: John 12:20-33: Several times in Scripture Jesus says "my hour has not yet come". In this passage from John's Gospel, His hour arrives. Some Gentiles approach Philip requesting to meet Jesus. In the verse immediately preceding our passage, the Pharisees were upset with Jesus' popularity and had just lamented that "the whole world has gone after him". So, with this request from the Gentiles their words are being proven true: Gentiles as well as Jews are now coming to Jesus. The author never tells us whether the Gentiles actually got to see Jesus. What is important to the author is Jesus' reaction when He learns that some Gentiles want to see Him. He tells them that His hour has come. How did the Gentiles' wanting to see Jesus indicate to Him that His hour had come? Jesus has said that no one can come to Him unless drawn by the Father (Jn 6:44), and now Gentiles have come to Him. That the Father is drawing Gentiles to Him seems to be the signal that His hour has arrived: the hour for Him to be lifted up, drawing everyone to Himself and into eternal life. Jesus tells a parable to convey a message about Himself. His dying will be like a grain of wheat dying to bring forth new life; He will lay down His life in order to produce an abundance of life. Jesus understands His coming death as His dying to this life so that others may live eternally. Hating one's life in this world means to put Jesus before one's self. To follow Jesus is to be His disciple, imitating His example and shaping one's life according to His teaching. In following Jesus, we die to ourselves (our worldliness and selfishness) in imitation of His example of laying down His life for others.

Reflection: "And when I am lifted up from the earth I will draw everyone to myself". By His crucifixion, He reveals Himself to everyone. Jesus wants everyone to find Him, to see Him, to learn to know and love Him; and so, He allows Himself to be crucified. He exposes His heart for all to see: a heart blazing with so much love that it is willing to die for our sake, to suffer unspeakable pain to reopen for us the gates of heaven. The crucifix is the great revelation of the heart of God. If we want to "see Christ" to see and know God, we have only to raise our eyes to behold Him dying on the cross to give us true life. Perhaps this week we might reflect on the following: 1) when I turn my attention to Jesus whom do I see; 2) what does Jesus' parable tell me about Him; about His dying to that I may live; 3) what do Jesus' words about hating one's life in this world ask of me specifically; 4) what does it mean for me to follow Jesus: Lord, Christianity seems so strange. You saved us from sin by taking sin upon yourself. You conquered evil by absorbing in yourself all the venom that evil could spit out. You ended the tragic meaninglessness of human suffering but turning it into a way to exercise the virtues that reunite our souls to God. Help me understand this mystery Lord....

LENTEN REMINDERS -FAST AND ABSTINENCE

Good Friday, April 2, is a day of abstinence from meat and also a day of fast, that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence from meat. The law of abstinence binds all Catholics 14 years and older. The law of fasting binds all Catholics from their 18th birthday until their 59th birthday (canons 97, 1252). "Let the paschal fast be kept sacred. Let it be celebrated everywhere on Good Friday and, where possible, prolonged throughout Holy Saturday, so that the joys of the Sunday of the Resurrection may be attained with uplifted and clear mind." (Constitution on the Liturgy, No. 110) With regard to the obligatory days listed above, however, there are frequent questions about the degree of seriousness of the matter. To paraphrase Pope John Paul II: the obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the penitential days specified by the Church is also serious. No one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe an individual day of penance is not considered serious. People should seek to do more rather than less. Fast and abstinence on the days prescribed should be considered a minimum response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion.
