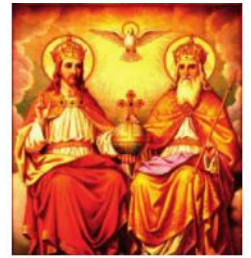

BREAKING OPEN THE WORD WITH DR. KATHY O'CONNOR, PH.D.
THE MOST HOLY TRINITY



Reading I: Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40: Deuteronomy is the fifth book of the Pentateuch and it recounts the main events at the end of the forty years the Israelites spent wandering in the desert under the leadership of Moses. Many Scripture scholars like to see this book as consisting of basically three great discourses attributed to Moses. Our reading comes at the end of the first discourse and it contains an important theological message: the profound notion of one God, the election of Israel as God's specific people; His special and kindly providence towards His people, the might of God as manifested in the works He does in favor of the chosen people, and Israel's duty to be faithful to the one and only God.

Responsorial Psalm: Psalm 33:4-5, 6,9,18-19,20,22 (12b): Psalm 33 is a psalm of praise for God, man's creator and provider, thus, it reflects the theme of the first reading. Attention first is focused on God Himself: He has revealed Himself always to be faithful. The *word* and *breath* in verse 6 echoes the creation narrative in the first chapter of Genesis and have been understood by some of the Church Fathers as being references to the persons of the Son and the Holy Spirit. There is a strong Trinitarian meaning to this psalm. The psalmist tells us that no one can be saved by their own strength: all people owe their lives to God's providence. The creative action of the Son and the Spirit are inseparably one with that of the Father. For this reason, the Church uses this psalm on the solemnity of the Holy Trinity.

Reading II: Romans 8:14-17: In this passage, St. Paul teaches the early Church that Christians are children of God. The life of a Christian is sharing in the life of Christ, God's only Son. By becoming, through adoption, true children of God we have, so to speak, a right to also share in Christ's inheritance: eternal life in heaven. This divine life, begun in baptism through rebirth in the Holy Spirit will grow under the guidance of the Spirit who makes us ever more Christlike. Our lives will not be free from suffering but then neither was the Lords'. Thus, St. Paul says, provided we suffer with Him, we will be glorified with Him at the end of time.

Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20: This passage brings the Gospel of Matthew to a close. Seeing the risen Lord, the disciples adore Him, worshipping Him as God. This shows that at last they are fully conscious of what, earlier on in their time with Jesus, they felt in their hearts and confessed by their words that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God. In this passage, He is handing on His mission to the disciples. Thus, we should bear in mind that the authority of the Church, given for our salvation, comes directly from Jesus. Jesus also gives the apostles the Spirit to fulfill their mission. In this passage, we read about the mission of the Church: continuing the work of Christ. This mission will endure until the end of time. To make this possible, Jesus promises to stay with the Church and never leave it.

Reflection: The Incarnation was God's saving invasion into this fallen world and the Church is the extension of that throughout all time and space. Christ came to reunite God and men: to lead us back into communion with the inexpressible joys of the Trinitarian life. Thus, Jesus tells the disciples to baptize in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. He tells them to make disciples just as He has. Baptism inaugurates the soul's life of grace and its life of intimate friendship with God. When we are baptized we inherit individually Christ's promise to be with us "until the end of the age." He is with us through the other sacraments which strengthen and sustain us throughout our difficult yet wonderful earthly pilgrimage. He is with us through His scriptural Word as well as through the living word of His Church's teaching. And He is with us by being always within us. Through the blessed waters of baptism, the Triune God has taken up His dwelling in the very core of our being. To be baptized in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit means to be immersed in the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit making one *a son or daughter* of the Father, *a sister or brother* of the Son, and *the bearer* of the Holy Spirit. *Continued on next page...*

Perhaps on this solemnity of the Holy Trinity, we might reflect on the following points: **1)** if the central mission of disciples of Jesus is to make disciples, how well am I carrying out my mission, **2)** what difference does my having been baptized make in my life, **3)** Jesus is with us until the end of the age; how do I experience Jesus being present to me, and **4)** if I am a bearer of the Holy Spirit, how do I manifest the Holy Spirit in my life. *Lord, I believe in your presence and your power, and I want to walk in your light. And yet, I feel as if something is holding me back. Show me what it is Lord. I want to be the saint you made me to be. Show me the way I need to go and open my heart so that I may discern the way you are leading me. With the knowledge of **your** heart, make **my** heart wise Lord....*
